WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders in the County of Passaic hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the 2021 budget year, the final appropriations of the County of Passaic shall, in accordance with this resolution and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 2.0%, amounting to \$6,461,150 and that the 2021 county budget for the County of Passaic be approved and adopted in accordance with this resolution; and,

**WHEREAS**, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County") is a body politic and corporate pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:18-1 and vested with all rights contained therein; and

- **WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:20-1 the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Passaic (hereafter "Board") is vested with managing the property, finances, and affairs of the County; and
- **WHEREAS**, Coronavirus disease 2019 (hereinafter "COVID-19") is a contagious, and at times fatal respiratory disease caused by SARS-CoV-2 virus; and
- WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, New Jersey Governor Philip Murphy, in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the people of the State of New Jersey, signed Executive Order No. 103, declaring a Public Health Emergency and State of Emergency exists in the State of New Jersey; and

#### SCOPE OF WORK CLARIFICATION AND ALLOWANCES:

#### **Ground Survey of First Aid Squad**

1. (Clarification of Separate Survey Task)

> Based on the defined survey limits in the Scope of Work for the Wanaque First Aid Squad, we have provided a separate fee to perform this task. It is our intent to provide a ground survey of this area rather than Aerial mapping to ensure higher accuracy for the limits from Belmont Avenue to 230 feet north of Furnace Avenue. It is our understanding that this is a possible alternate route to Mullen Avenue for the trail path. This option can be discussed at the initial field meeting.

#### NEW JERSEY HISTORIC TRUST 2020 CAPITAL LEVEL GRANT II COUNTY OF PASSAIC

#### **General Summary**

Passaic County, New Jersey has produced a rich heritage of historic and architecturally significant sites, many of which are still in existence today. These sites represent important historic events and trends, significant individuals, numerous architecture styles and illustrate craftsmanship of bygone eras. In order to help preserve these historic sites the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders approved, the expansion of the existing open space and farmland preservation trust programs to include historic preservation activities in 2017. The first grant round took place in 2018. Since its inception, the County has awarded seven (5) capital improvement preservation projects and (2) planning projects.

The County is seeking support and assistance from the New Jersey Historic Trust ("NJHT") to offer a new historic preservation grant program, by way of a re-grant. This would be considered a special initiative project outside of the traditional capital improvement projects funded by the NJHT.

#### Purpose & Need

Passaic County consist of sixteen (16) municipalities, the majority of which are under population of 30,000 residents, with three (3) major cities Clifton, Passaic, and Paterson which over 100,000 residents. With over a 1,000 designated cultural resources including parks, bridges, archeological sites, historic districts, industrial complexes, and early Dutch buildings spread across the County, many are in public ownership. Of the County's municipalities, only one has a structured historic preservation program and a Certified Local Government. The County needs direct access to preservation funding to conduct preservation stewardship County-wide.

Rolling out these services and funds through the County to smaller municipalities and non-profits will fast track and enable greater access to the communities heritage and raise the profile of the County's heritage tourism program. This will result in being the seed of a local economy based on heritage tourism, which is sorely needed in Northern New Jersey.

It is notable that many counties across the nation provide technical assistance, support, and access to funding to small rural communities that lack the capacity to engage in historic preservation methodology and practices. The County wants to explore this model and evaluate if it is appropriate for our State.

#### Grant Program Staffing & Organization

The County through the Department of Cultural & Historic Affairs ("DCHA") oversees operations, improvements, and interpretation of all historic sites owned by the County of Passaic.

All of these sites are integral to the story of New Jersey's rich history, carrying with them first
Introduced on: hand accounts of New Jersey's early settlements, Revolutionary War significance, and industrial

influence. Under the direction of the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders, the DCHA creates and maintains a flourishing cultural landscape throughout Passaic County. As the designated proponent for the County's heritage and the agent for arts and history programming, the DCHA is responsible for developing, promoting, and implementing an extensive public programs calendar and heritage tourism campaign to encourage public awareness and visitation to the County's various historic sites. Through this ongoing endeavor, the DCHA maintains several of its own sites and has engaged in various partnerships with local and State Historic sites for Passaic County residents and visitors to enjoy today, and will ensure that these sites are preserved for the benefit of future generations.

The project continues a recent trend in Passaic County for the long term restoration and preservation of its historic assets. This began with the creation of the Department of Cultural & Historical Affairs in January 2017, which was charged with the unprecedented attention to County-owned resources that had not been addressed since the development of the County Park System in the 1930s and 1940s. The Department expanded their role to include providing guidance and partnerships on projects, programs, and resources.

In order to implement this program effectively, the County of Passaic will be hiring a full-time historic preservation specialist. Since many of our municipalities and nonprofits do not have the capacity to manage or implement any historic preservation projects that are guided by proper preservation methodology or standards, the historic preservation specialist will fill the gap. In addition, historic preservation specialist will support the County with planning, monitoring, conducting field work, and implementation of the re-grant program.

The full responsibilities and duties of the historic preservation specialist are attached. It is important to note that while, the historic preservation specialist is crucial to the re-grant program, it also provides benefits to the County and the State.

Hiring an additional preservation staff purpose to the County of Passaic allows for the following; 1) additional staff support to efficiently support all municipalities throughout the county in cultural resource preservation and awareness, 2) expanding the roles of preservation in the County by having the ability to provide more programs, 3) provide an arena for more preservation professionals being hired in the State of New Jersey, and 4) increasing the County's capacity to monitor preservation initiatives on behalf of the New Jersey Historic Trust.

#### **Grant Process Outline**

Enclosed you will find several documents that showcase how the grant will operate and function. The documents include:

- 1) Fact Sheet a general synopsis of the program and applicant eligibility
- 2) Rules & Regulations in draft format. This document outlines what the re-grant will fund and how it will be funded.
- 3) Historic Preservation Workshop Sample like the NJHT model, a workshop on how to apply and what the program entails will be conducted prior to the application deadline.

4) Applicant Materials - attached are proposed applicant materials for project submission. These are in draft form and will be revised accordingly to include the NJ Historic Trust as a beneficiary and its grant requirements.

#### Grant Match

The County of Passaic is ready to provide a monetary match in two ways:

- 1) By providing a salary for a historic preservation professional for a salary range of \$65,000 - \$75,000 with associated benefits (55%), and
- 2) Adding up to \$300,000 in matching funds towards the overall grant awards.

The intent is to provide a total of \$800,000 in grant funds to be disbursed to municipalities and non-profit organizations each year. This funding source is expected to grow based on tax revenues and allocations to the the open space tax, and increased funding support from the NJHT or other local and state partners.

#### Impact & Benefit

The benefits of this preservation re-grant program are to yield a more robust, coordinated, and informed approach to heritage tourism including: strengthening the local economy, increasing visitor expenditures, generating employment, preserving the unique character of the region and promoting community pride. The parties that benefit will include municipalities, local communities, parks, art and cultural organizations, educational institutions, businesses and most importantly, historic sites in need of capital improvements and visitation.

Despite having a number of strong interpretive sites and investing in places like the Great Falls. National Historical Park in Paterson, some sites often lack compelling interpretive strategies, staffing needs, and general maintenance. If given the appropriate planning tools and capital funding, heritage tourism can eventually become a major component to the County's economy and, if successful, the community's involvement in preservation investments will increase over time.

Our expectation is to culminate the project with a unified vision and narrative to tie together Passaic County's historic sites in order to implement goals of our Heritage Tourism Plan (2013) and the state's Heritage Tourism Master Plan (2010) which include increasing visitation and multi-disciplinary events (i.e. living history programs, lecture, musical events, special tours, and increased school visits), capital site improvements for visitor readiness, and building long lasting constituency among partners on a County-wide scale.

#### 1. General provisions and funding policies

- 1) All grant applications for historic preservation projects shall be capped at a maximum of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) for local government units and one hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000.00) for nonprofit organizations.
- 2) All applicants are required to submit a letter of intent thirty (30) days prior to the grant deadline to the Department of Cultural & Historic Affairs for determination on the eligibility of the proposed application for funding.

#### 2. Eligible applicants

The following organizations or groups are eligible to apply for PCHT historic preservation project grants:

- 1) Local government units in the County and
- Nonprofit organizations improving historic eligible properties in the County

#### 3. Ineligible applicants

- 1) The following organizations are ineligible to apply for funding:
- 1) Nonprofit applicants applying for improvements that further a religious use; and
- 2) Any school board, education institution or similar public agency without primary recreation and conservation responsibilities.

#### 4. Grant application process

For all historic preservation grant applications received, including applications for any project involving a historic site or a park development project within a designated historic district, the Historic Preservation Specialist shall prepare a memorandum outlining the strengths and/or weaknesses of the application, to be distributed to the advisory committee prior to the award of a grant.

Eligible applicants shall submit an application, as provided by the County's Director of Cultural and Historic Affairs, along with the following supporting documents:

1) Architectural or engineering drawings, site plans, signed by a licensed professional;

#### 5. Eligible properties

- 1) A local government unit or nonprofit may submit an application for the restoration or preservation of a historic building, structure, site, landscape, object or district, in the County if the property is falls under one of the following categories:
  - Recognized by or listed on a register of historic places by a local government unit;
  - Individually listed in the New Jersey Register of Flistoric Places and/or the National Register of Historic Places:

- 2) If the property is not listed on any Register of Historic Places or has not received a Determination of Eligibility and/or Certification of Eligibility from SFIPO, the applicant must submit information concerning the site at least forty five (45) days prior to the application deadline so that a Certificate of Eligibility letter is received and included with the application.
  - If there is ambiguity regarding the eligibility of a property, the applicant shall request a written memorandum by the Director of the County's Department of Historic and Cultural Affairs to determine eligibility,
  - If a nonprofit does not own the historic site or property in fee simple, the nonprofit must have:

  - A description of the project to be developed;
  - The estimated cost of the development project and the award amount;
  - Special conditions, if any;
    - The requirements for recordkeeping and project administration;
  - A two (2) year project term whereby all PCHT grants monies must be distributed;
  - The reimbursement process whereby the County will reimburse the nonprofit for costs incurred in the project, following the submission of invoices to the County's Director of Cultural and Historic Affairs;
  - A fifteen (15) year easement agreement that places a deed restriction on the site to ensure a long-term preservation and proper maintenance limiting changes in use or appearance and preventing demolition



WHEREAS, the County of Passaic is planning on undertaking a project known as the Reconstruction of Paterson Hamburg Turnpike & Alps Road Intersection that requires the County obtain partial fee takings and/or easements owned by private parties; and

WHEREAS, the firm Lasser Sussman Associates, LLC of Summit, New Jersey has completed a real property appraisal report relative to the value of the land that needs to be acquired and the value of damages associated with the acquisition of the necessary land and easements; and

WHEREAS, the Passaic County Board of Commissioners by Resolution R2019-0815 dated September 10, 2019 authorized the Office of the Passaic County Counsel to acquire twenty-two partial fees and/or easements of land in connection with the Reconstruction of the Paterson Hamburg Turnpike & Alps Road Intersection; and

- 3. Parcel #E19 1211 Hamburg LLC, c/o Pashman Realty (owner) 1211 Hamburg Turnpike Block 2711, Lot 104, Wayne, NJ, partial taking of Parcel E19A (Roadway Easement) consisting of 21,300 square feet and a permanent slope easement on Parcel E19B consisting of 785 square feet. 




WHEREAS, the Passaic County Board of County Commissioners (hereafter "Board") adopted Resolution R-2020-0660 on August 11, 2020, authorizing the submission of an Annual Action Plan for the Community Development Block Grant CV1 (hereafter "CDBG-CV1") special grant assistance funded by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (hereafter "CARES Act") to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus (hereafter "COVID-19") through the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (hereafter "HUD") in compliance with the rules and regulations governing the CDBG-CV1 Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County") is a body politic and corporate pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:18-1 and vested with all rights contained therein; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:20-1 the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Passaic (hereafter "Board") is vested with managing the property, finances, and affairs of the County; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 5, 2020, the Purchasing Agent unsealed bids for the Carriage House Restoration and Rehabilitation Project, Project No. C-20-025 (hereafter "Project No. C-20-025) in compliance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1, et seq.; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A</u>, 40A;11-13.2(a) and <u>N.J.S.A</u>, 40A;11-13.2 (b), the Board may reject all bids if the lowest bid substantially exceeds the cost estimates for the goods or services or if the lowest bid substantially exceeds the Board's appropriation for the goods or services; and

**WHEREAS**, the bids received for Project No. C-20-025 were reviewed by the County's Director of the Department of Cultural and Historic Affairs, and the lowest bid received substantially exceeds the cost estimates and appropriations made for same, and is recommending that the bids be rejected in accordance with the law; and

**WHEREAS**, on December 29, 2020 the Board approved Resolution No. R20201183 rejecting all bids received for Project No. C-20-025 as the lowest bid received substantially exceeded the cost estimates and appropriations made for same; and

**WHEREAS**, on February 2, 2021, the Purchasing Agent unsealed bids for the Re-Bid Carriage House Restoration and Rehabilitation Project, Project NO, C-21-001 (hereafter "Project No, C-21-001") in compliance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1, et seq., which included the same terms, conditions, restrictions, and specifications as set forth in Project No. C-20-025; and

**WHEREAS**, the bids received for Project No. C-21-001 were reviewed by the County's Director of the Department of Cultural and Historic Affairs, and the lowest bid received substantially exceeds the cost estimates and appropriations made for same, and is recommending that the bids be rejected in accordance with the law; and
