### 2018 APC CONTRACT APPLICATION PROVISIONS:

The 2018 APC represents the third and final year of the 2016-2018 APC cycle. It is necessary for AAAs to submit new applications, schedules, certification forms, business associate agreement and other documents as specified. With the inception of SAGE, each APC is a one-year contract; therefore, effective dates of this contract period are January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2018.

#### A. Contract Application Review:

- 1. 2018 APC contract applications will be accepted on or before 10/16/17 at 4 pm and reviewed by DoAS staff through the SAGE system.
- 2. As part of the review process, AAAs will be notified through SAGE of any required changes to the APC application. APC approval is based on complete, accurate and substantive information per instructions. Notification of the Department's final acceptance of the plan will also be communicated via SAGE.
- 3. Deficient or incomplete APC contract applications will be returned to the AAA for correction, All required changes shall be made within 10 working days and returned to DoAS for review and approval. Failure to complete the required changes within 10 working days may result in delayed approval of the APC and may impact payments. The Department will not provide cash payments for any costs incurred in carrying out the terms of this contract until a fully executed Notice of Grant Award from DoAS has been processed. Upon completion of this process, payments will be made in accordance with the Contract provisions.
- B. Funding Applicability: All APC funds shall follow OAA Title III requirements in that non-federal funds shall leverage federal funds provided under the contract and thereby shall follow the same requirements. These requirements shall apply to every service funded in total or in part under the APC regardless of whether the service is provided by the AAA, a governmental source or by a subcontracted agency.

#### C. Integrated Program Summary (IPS):

- 1. All programs and services funded in total or in part under the APC, January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2018, must be included in an Integrated Program Summary (IPS).
- 2. Only the official name of an agency, as written on its business registration certificate, is permitted in APCs.
- 3. DoAS will accept a minimal number of "To Be Determined" IPSs if a service or provider has not been determined by the APC submission due date. See Instruction Guide for additional details.

- 4. Initial IPS documents in SAGE must be established at the level included on attachment B1 and B2. Local, other, and participant contributions can be included at a percentage equivalent to the initial allocation or higher. Full MOE and match requirement must be allocated by the time the AAA processes the mid-year amendment.
- 5. When completing an IPS for services to be delivered by the AAA, the Agency Name field on the IPS must begin with the letters "AAA" followed by the AAA's agency name. See Instruction Guide for additional details.
- 6. The Budget Plan will be filled in and completed automatically, from the information entered on the Integrated Program Summary (IPS) forms with the exception of sections that indicate, "INPUT REQUIRED."
- 7. If funds are included on the personnel line of the IPS, a corresponding personnel justification form must be completed. See Instruction Guide for additional details.

#### D. Waiver Provisions

#### 1. Direct Service and Proprietary Service Waivers

- a. Unless otherwise specified, approved waivers will remain in effect for the remainder three-year contract period ending December 31, 2018, as long as there are no changes in circumstances under which the original waiver was granted.
- b. Should circumstances warrant a waiver from Federal and/or State Guidelines for the 2018APC contract period, new direct service, priority, and/or proprietary waivers must be submitted in compliance with PM 91-9, III-4 "Waiver Forms & Procedures for Area Agencies on Aging." Blank waiver forms are available via the SAGE grants management portal. Further details are included in the 2018 APC Application Instruction Guide.)
- c. For the 2018 period, prior to service provision a new Direct Service waiver must be submitted. If circumstances may possibly warrant a waiver after submission of the 2018 APC, the AAA is required to promptly notify DoAS Office on AAA Administration. DoAS will provide technical assistance prior to contracting with the provider and before services begin. The AAA will be notified of waiver approval.

#### E. Using Governmental Providers

- a. Unless otherwise stated, approved governmental providers are valid for the remainder of the 2016-2018 area plan cycle, as long as there are no changes in circumstances under which the original governmental agency services request was approved and no additional services will be provided.
- b. When the AAA proposes to contract with another Government Agency (such as a State, county, municipal agency, etc.) the AAA is required to submit a completed signed Request for Governmental Agency Service Provider with all required substantiation to DoAS.

- c. The AAA must receive DoAS approval prior to the contracting with the governmental provider and before services take place.
- d. Changes in circumstances affecting service provision include but are not limited to administrative and fiscal oversight, capacity to serve the anticipated number of clients, cost of service and/or proposals to add services. A change in circumstance necessitates AAAs to submit a new Request for Governmental Agency Service Provider with all required justifications and must be approved by DoAS prior to the AAA contracting with the provider and provision of services.
- e. The AAA must submit the signed Request for Governmental Agency Service Provider forms in SAGE with the 2018 APC Contract Application. (Details on obtaining and completing the forms along with submission in SAGE are included in the 2018 APC Contract Application Instruction Guide.)
- Confidentiality: The AAA shall make every effort to maintain the privacy of personal and confidential information that may be provided by participants in the course of accessing services and supports. The AAA shall require all current users and future users of SAMS to sign a confidentiality agreement promulgated by DoAS prior to accessing SAMS and shall notify DoAS when SAMS user IDs must be deactivated upon a user's departure. The AAA shall review the confidentiality agreements signed by SAMS users as part of its monitoring/auditing process. Further details are outlined in 2018 Administrative Requirements, Subcontract Requirements and Supplemental Provisions document.
- G. Intent to Fund: This Policy Memorandum and Budget Attachments A 1-2 and B 1-2 shall serve as DoAS Intent to Fund AAAs for the 2018 Area Plan Contract. A Resolution adopted by county government officials utilizing either Attachment A or B is required in order to accept and obligate the APC funds. This resolution is not required by DoAS for execution of this contract however, it should comply with all county requirements and be maintained at the AAA for review. After the adopted resolution, APC funds shall be made available for use to ensure continued services to older adults as intended.

#### H. Notice of Grant Award:

- 1. An executed Notice of Grant Award will be available in SAGE upon approval by DoAS. AAAs will be notified by a message in SAGE when the application is fully approved. AAAs will then be able to print a copy of the signed contract documents located in SAGE. Paper copies of contracts will no longer be mailed.

# **Procedures for Budgeting 2018 Funding Sources**

Included with this memorandum are the Advance Planning Documents (APD) that establish the initial allocation for APC 2018. DoAS will be processing the APC contract applications to provide continued support to AAAs for the provision of comprehensive services for senior citizens. The formula utilized for the distribution of FFY18 Title III funds and related State match is detailed in our State Plan on Aging and in PM 92-13, III-6 "Funding Formula", PM 93-4, III-2 "Supplemental Funding Formula", and PM 2001-8, III-7, "Title III E, National Family Caregiver Support Program." Non-Title III funds are distributed based upon funding formulas established through policy memoranda issued at the inception of each program. The census figures in the formula are updated every two years using data in the American Community Survey (ACS). For the 2018 Advance Planning Document, the 2011-2015 ACS figures have been used.

#### Advance Planning Document Attachments:

A-1 and A-2: This is the anticipated 100% allocation for the 2018 Area Plan Contract- These are for AAA planning purposes only and should not be used to complete the initial Area Plan Contract. Use A-1 and A-2 as a guide for projecting service levels. Please note that the top row of Attachment A indicates the allocation code for each program. Be sure to use the correct codes when preparing all IPS documents as well as the Quarterly Program Reports (QPR A and B). County contracts with providers can be executed using the 100% funding level if allowed by your county.

B-1 and B-2: Use Attachments B-1 and B-2 to complete the APC budget plan. They show 50% of Title III Federal Funds and 100% State funding level allocations. These budget planning figures are based on the current available 2018 funding allocations. The balance of FFY18 funds will be included in the mid-year contract amendment upon receipt of a grant award from AoA. SFY19 funds will be fully available for payment once a signed State budget is in effect after July 1, 2018. Any FFY18 funds due in this contract period will be allocated upon the availability of funds.

Attachments B-1 and B-2 show 50% of anticipated Federal Title III B, C1, C2, D, E and related State Match, and 100% anticipated State funding, which includes State Weekend Home Delivered Meals (SWHDM), Safe Housing and Transportation (SHTP), Adult Protective Services (APS), Social Service Block Grant (SSBG), Care Management Quality Assurance (CMQA), Supplemental Funds (formerly known as COLA-Cost of Living Adjustment), Community Based Senior Program (CBSP), and State Home Delivered Meals (SHDM). Also included are the initial allocation of the Nutrition Services Incentive Program (NSIP) and 100% allocation of the anticipated Medicaid reimbursement amount.

#### I. OLDER AMERICANS ACT (OAA) FUNDS

- A. New Funds: Allocations for Titles III B, III C1, III C2, III D, and III E are provided on spreadsheet Attachment B-1 and B-2. Allocation of these funds will be determined by the initial distribution.
- B. Administrative Funds: Show the anticipated source and amounts of Title III administration by subtracting appropriate amounts from any or all of the following four allocations: B, C1, and C2 & E. The total OAA administration amount will be pulled in from the IPS forms and must equal the amounts deducted from Titles B, C1, and C2 & E.

- 2) Administration expenses taken from Title III E must not exceed 10% of the total Title III E allocation.

- D. Allocation Transfers (INPUT REQUIRED): Show anticipated transfers between B, C1, and C2 (for 2018), up to 30% between B and C1 & C2 and up to 40% between C1 and C2) may be transferred. For calculation purposes, multiply the percentage x the total of C1 and C2 funds. Note: Fund totals for transfers should net to zero.
- E. Title III D Funds for Evidence Based Health Promotion (EBHP) Programs: To use Title III D funds AAAs must comply with the Administration for Community Living's requirement that all activities under Title III D be demonstrated to be evidenced-based.

    - b. Prior Year Excess Funds: Any funds over and above the maximum of 8% Prior Year Approved carryover, becomes Prior Year Excess Funds. If applicable, enter on Prior Year Excess Funds line.

- G. State Match: For current year shows the allocations from Attachments B-1 and B-2 that are pulled directly from completed IPS forms.
  - 1. Do not complete the following 2 sections until the midyear.
    - a. Prior Year Approved State Match c/o Carryover (INPUT REQUIRED): Enter the projected State Match carryover as accurately as possible. As with Title III funding, State Match carry over is limited to the maximum of 8%.
    - b. Prior Year State Match Excess Funds: Any funds over and above the maximum of 8% prior year approved State Match carryover, becomes Prior Year State Match Excess Funds. If applicable, enter on Prior Year State Match Excess Funds line.
- H. Local Public: Maintenance of Effort (MOE) Figures are based on the best available historical funding data for allocations as it relates to PM 2006-9, III-7, "Title III Maintenance of Effort (MOE) and State Program Match Requirements." MOE will be calculated for the 2018 APC based on the AAAs certification amounts from the prior year.
- I. Local Private: MOE Figures are based on the best available historical data and any anticipated private matching funds for new grantees as it relates to the PM 2006-9, III-7, "Title III Maintenance of Effort (MOE) and State Program Match Requirements".
- J. Maintenance of Effort (MOE) Requirement Columns: Enter the MOE requirement as provided by DoAS.
- K. Income, Client: Figures represent the total anticipated client contributions.
  Note: AAAs are required to encourage client contributions and participants must be given the opportunity to contribute for all services, except Adult Protective Services (APS). All income that is realized from participant contributions is to be included in this category. - E. Income, Client: Figures represent the total anticipated client contributions.

Dense pack insulation into walls, attics and other cavities where practical and according to menufacturer's specifications.

#### SECTION C SCOPE OF SERVICES

### 1. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:

This grant will enable the grantee agency to upgrade heating systems in eligible dwelling units. The measures to be undertaken will provide immediate and long range relief to New Jersey's eligible clients by lowering high fuel bills.

### 2. SPECIFIC PROBLEMS TO BE ADDRESSED:

- Fuel weste resulting from inefficient heating systems.
- b. Elimination of hypothermia associated with non-functioning heating systems.

This project will ensure energy efficiency, fuel savings and increased comfort for the low income residents of New Jersey, with an emphasis on those households containing the ciderly, persons with disabilities, children, of Native Americans.

### 3. TARGET POPULATION TO BE SERVED:

Applicants for assistance representing households containing the elderly, persons with disabilities, children, or Native Americans shall be given priority in the scheduling and carrying out of weatherization activities. As a result of this prioritization, it is predicted that the following percentages of the weatherization dweiling units will be occupied by households having priority status:

- a. 37% will contain senior citizens,
- b. 13% will contain persons with disabilities,
- c. 29% will contain children,
- d. 4% will contain Native Americans.

The priorities for dwelling units containing senior citizens, persons with disabilities, children and Native Americans will be determined by establishing an "adjusted application date" based on the numbers and types of prioritized individuals within the household, as stated in Chapter 1, Eligibility and Documentation of the New Jersey Weatherization Assistance Program Policy and Procedures Manual. This "adjusted application date" will have the effect of shortening the period prioritized households spend on the waiting list for the provision of services.

#### 4. PROJECT OBJECTIVES AND GOALS:

The number of eligible dwelling units which will be weatherized during this grant period will be determined by both the types of service provided and the extent of the investment in each building. Of the total number of eligible dwelling units weatherized during this grant period, it is projected:

- a. 62% will be Single-Family dwelling units,
- b. 36% will be Multi-Family dwelling units.
- 58% will be Owner-occupied dwelling units.
- d. 42% will be Renter-occupied dwelling units.

NOTE: IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE GRANTEE AGENCY TO MONITOR PRODUCTION AND EXPENDITURES THROUGHOUT THE TERM OF THIS GRANT AWARD TO ENSURE THAT A SUFFICIENT NUMBER OF DWELLING UNITS ARE COMPLETED SO AS TO FULFILL THE CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT.

### 5. HOW THE PROJECT WILL BE IMPLEMENTED:

The Grantee may provide these services to income eligible households that meet the following criterion:

- Households that were previously served, but received regular weatherization services only.
- b. Households that received a heating system
- Households that received a heating system retrofit, and are now in need of a heating system replacement.
- d. Households never previously served and based on a completed energy audit, only need a heating system upgrade.
- Homeowners who apply for emergency heating system repairs through the HOME Energy Assistance Program.

The Grantee may also expend these funds to pay up to 50% of the cost of a heating system upgrade in a rental unit, if the landlord has contributed 50% of the costs.

The Grantee will be responsible for ensuring that all heating system work completed with these funds meets program standards as outlined in Chapter 6, Heating Systems, of the Weatherization Assistance Program Policy and Procedures Manual.

Any other measures determined as appropriate by the Department and conveyed in writing to the Grantee or other additional measures as determined as needed to increase the thermal efficiency of the unit, except that any improvements over and above those listed above must be approved in writing in advance by the Department.

We are writing to provide you with our additional scope and fee for the above-referenced project.

As you know, the County wishes to implement bicycle lanes along the following roadways, which were not previously included in the project:

- High Mountain Road from Belmont Avenue to North Haledon Avenue in North Haledon
- Union Avenue / Union Boulevard from US Route 46 in Totowa to the end of the roadway at West Broadway in Paterson.

Striping plans will be required to indicate the installation of additional traffic striping and pavement markings along these roadways. The construction plans prepared for Union Avenue from Sherwood Avenue to West Broadway under the 2016 Road Resurfacing Project indicated bicycle lanes. However, since the road is to be resurfaced by PSE&G, the paving and striping was not implemented. The County's contractor only constructed the curb ramps along this roadway to support the utility's paving work. These plans will be adapted to produce plans only indicating the remaining striping work. Additional striping plans will be prepared to extend the bicycle lanes to Route 46.

Additionally, the County wishes to modify the striping proposed on Browertown Road as part of this project. The implementation of bicycle lanes along Browertown Road is proposed as part of the Federally funded Morris Canal Greenway Browertown Road project, where feasible. However, that project's design did not reflect the resurfacing of the road, so full replacement of the striping was not anticipated and the design included partial bicycle lanes based on the constraints of the existing striping. Now that the resurfacing of Browertown Road is proposed under the 2017 Road Resurfacing Program, this constraint no longer applies and the County wishes to modify the striping layout to further extend the proposed bicycle lanes. The striping will still be installed under the Federal Browertown Road contract, but the design work will be performed under the 2017 Resurfacing Project since the resurfacing project has provided the opportunity to revise the striping design.

The Passaic County Parks Department has utilized services from tree companies as needed when we encounter tree issues that cannot be handled in house. Due to the increased volume of dead ash trees due to the emerald ash borer and other related tree issues such as bacterial leaf blight, we have been forced to use contractors on an as needed basis more than we usually would.

At the 8/15/2017 Board meeting, a resolution (R20170687) for over threshold in the additional amount of \$20,000 was passed for Boulder Hill Tree Service (Hasbrouck Heights, NJ 07604.) To date, \$1,800 of the approved \$20,000 has been paid to Boulder Hill Tree Services for their services.

A resolution request was made to take the remaining \$18,200 and reestablish the funds under Tree King (Landing NJ). This was discussed and approved at the 9/25/17 Public Works Committee meeting. Tree King (Landing NJ) is a tree removal service, a member of the Morris County Cooperative Pricing Council, and the lowest bidder.

I recommend that the Board of Chosen Freeholders adopt the necessary resolution authorizing the request to take the remaining \$18,200 and reestablish the funds under Tree King (Landing NJ).
