Any failure of the Bonds to be so insured or of any such policy of insurance to be issued, shall not in any way relieve the purchaser of its contractual obligations arising from the acceptance of its proposal for the purchase of the Bonds.

ISSUE PRICE DETERMINATION UNDER INTERNAL REVENUE CODE

If the "competitive sale requirements" are not satisfied, the winning bidder shall have the option to designate whether the "10% test" or the "hold-the-offering-price rule" shall apply to all the Bonds.

The following paragraphs contain the terms for the determination of issue price.

(a) The winning bidder shall assist the County in establishing the issue price of the Bonds and shall execute and deliver to the County at closing an "issue price" or similar certificate setting forth the reasonably expected initial

 - (2) all bidders shall have an equal opportunity to bid;
 - (3) the County may receive bids from at least three underwriters of municipal bonds who have established industry reputations for underwriting new issuances of municipal bonds; and
 - (4) the County anticipates awarding the sale of the Bonds to the bidder who submits a firm offer to purchase the Bonds at the highest price (or lowest interest cost), as set forth in this Notice of Sale.

Any bid submitted pursuant to this Notice of Sale shall be considered a firm offer for the purchase of the Bonds, as specified in the bid. Bids will <u>not</u> be subject to cancellation in the event that the competitive sale requirements are not satisfied. Unless the bidder intends to hold the Bonds for its own account with no intention to offer the Bonds to the public, the bidder, by submitting a bid, represents to the County that the bidder has an established industry reputation for underwriting new issuances of municipal bonds.

(c) In the event that the competitive sale requirements are not satisfied, the County shall so advise the winning bidder. In that case, the winning bidder shall have the option to designate (by 5:00 P.M. Prevailing Time on the sale date) whether the issue price will be calculated upon either (a) the first price at which 10% of each maturity of the Bonds (the "10% test") is sold to the public as the issue price of that

maturity, applied on a maturity-by-maturity basis, or (b) a commitment to neither offer nor sell any of the Bonds of any maturity to any person at a price that is higher than the initial offering price to the public as of the sale date (the "initial offering price") during the holding period (as defined herein).

- (f) By submitting a bid, each bidder confirms that: (i) any agreement among underwriters, any selling group agreement and each third-party distribution agreement (to which the bidder is a party) relating to the initial sale of the Bonds to the public, together with the related pricing wires, contains or will contain language obligating each underwriter, each dealer

who is a member of the selling group, and each broker-dealer that is a party to such third-party distribution agreement, as applicable, to (A) either comply with the hold-the-offeringprice limitations stated herein or to report the prices at which sells to the public the unsold Bonds of each maturity allocated to it, whether or not the Closing Date has occurred, until either all Bonds of that maturity allocated to it have been sold or it is notified by the winning bidder that the 10% test has been satisfied as to the Bonds of that maturity, provided that, the reporting obligation after the Closing Date may be at reasonable periodic intervals or otherwise upon request of the winning bidder, depending upon whether the holdthe-offering-price method or the 10% test is selected by the winning bidder, (B) to promptly notify the winning bidder of any sales of Bonds that, to its knowledge, are made to a purchaser who is a related party to an underwriter participating in the initial sale of the Bonds to the public (each such term being used as defined below), and (C) to acknowledge that, unless otherwise advised by the underwriter, dealer or broker-dealer, the winning bidder shall assume that each order submitted by the underwriter, dealer or broker-dealer is a sale to the public, (ii) any agreement among underwriters or selling group agreement relating to the initial sale of the Bonds to the public, together with the related pricing wires, contains or will contain language obligating each underwriter or dealer that a party to a third-party distribution agreement employed in connection with the initial sale of the Bonds to the public to require each broker-dealer that is a party to such third-party distribution agreement to either comply with the hold-the-offering-price limitations stated herein or to report the prices at which it sells to the public the unsold Bonds of each maturity allocated to it, whether or not the Closing Date has occurred, until either all Bonds of that maturity allocated to it have been sold or it is notified by the winning bidder or such underwriter that the 10% test has been satisfied as to the Bonds of that maturity, provided that, the reporting obligation after the Closing Date may be at reasonable periodic intervals otherwise upon request of the winning bidder or underwriter, depending upon whether the hold-the-offering-price method or the 10% test is selected by the winning bidder.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT THE COVID-19 VACCINATION SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING GRANT FROM THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY, DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:5-30

WHEREAS, the County of Passaic (the "County") is a government body incorporated pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:18-1, et seq. and vested with all rights contained therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:20-1 the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Passaic (hereinafter the "Board") are vested with decision making powers on behalf of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Health (hereafter "Department") is responsible for protecting and promoting the health of the approximately 510,000 residents of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Department has been administering COVID-19 vaccines to thousands of residents who live and/or work within the County at the Mega Distribution Site located at 1710 Route 46 West, Woodland Park, NJ; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey, Department of Health has informed the Department that it is eligible to apply for and accept the COVID-19 Vaccination Supplemental Funding grant for the grant period beginning July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023, with a total award allocated to the County in the amount of four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000.00); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this funding is to increase vaccine distribution capacity in the County, with a focus on supplying vaccines to high-risk and underserved populations, ensuring equitable distribution of vaccines, and increasing vaccine confidence through education, outreach, and partnerships; and

WHEREAS, this matter was discussed at the April 28, 2021 meeting of the Health and Human Services Committee and being recommended to the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Passaic for approval; and

II. INTRODUCTION AND EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

New Jersey's Local Health Departments (LHDs) are tasked with control of communicable disease in their jurisdictions. As a result, LHDs have been at the forefront of COVID-19 response activities in NJ. COVID-19 mass vaccination efforts are now underway, and LHDs were among NJ's first vaccination partners. LHDs provide an essential access point for vaccination in the communities they serve. As vaccine allocations increase, LHDs will continue to be called upon to execute these critical operations, with a particular focus on vaccination of vulnerable populations.

Therefore, the New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) is designating \$16,473,923 in federal funding to be awarded to county and local health departments to support COVID-19 mass vaccination efforts over the next two years (07-01-2021 to 06-30-2023). There will be a two-year project period with two annual budgets. This funding opportunity will support LHDs in sustaining vaccination operations and increase COVID-19 vaccination among high-risk, underserved, and vulnerable populations. Per N.J.A.C. 8:52, LHDs perform community health assessments and plan and develop programs and interventions related to the uninsured, underinsured, immigrant, Indigent, and other vulnerable populations. Consequently, LHDs are well-aligned with community partners who serve vulnerable populations and well-situated to increase vaccination rates within these communities.

III. GOAL

The New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) - Office of Local Public Health's (OLPH) COVID-19 Vaccination Supplemental Funding Program will provide funding to LHDs to increase vaccine throughput; vaccinate underserved communities with the use of vaccine strike teams, mobile vaccine clinics, satellite clinics, temporary, or off-site clinics; partner with critical organizations and businesses to vaccinate the public and essential workers; and leverage local partnerships to increase COVID-19 vaccine confidence in racial and ethnic minority and increase accessibility for people with disabilities.

IV. ELIGIBILITY

Eligible applicants are NJ's Local Health Departments, as designated in the NJ DOH Office of Local Public Health's 3/1/2021 version of the Directory of Local Health Departments in NJ. LHDs must be able to complete activities as described in this RFA and workplan to be eligible to receive funding.

V. APPROACH

LHDs must submit a workplan within the Methods and Evaluation section of SAGE and choose initiatives from the following activities: two initiatives from Activity 1, one activity from Activity 3, and one activity from Activity 4 of COVID-19 Vaccination Supplemental Funding Program. For clarity, there is no Activity 2 listed below. The LHD workplan will focus on Activity 1, Activity 3, and Activity 4 of CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Supplemental Funding Activities.

Grant Logistics

Is this a reimbursement-based grant?

Yes, this is a cost-reimbursement grant.

2. Is the funding for 2 years? Or if we use all of the funding in year one, we would potentially receive more funding in year 2?

This first amount of funding is guaranteed for year 1. There will be funding for year 2, but those amounts will be determined for the next budget year.

3. Can a grant recipient opt out of Year 2?

Yes. Official departmental notice of grant conclusion would be required and must be received 60 days prior to the end of the Budget Period for Year 1. The Budget Period for Year 1 ends on June 30, 2022, so notice would need to be provided on or before April 30, 2022.

Funding

4. Will there be additional funding available for health departments that provide services to multiple communities through an interlocal service contract??

No. This grant awards funds for up to 104 LINCS Agency and non-LINCS Agency local health departments (LHDs) that were listed in the March 1, 2021 Directory of Local Health Departments in New Jersey on the New Jersey Department of Health OLPH web page at https://www.nj.gov/health/lh/documents/LocalHealthDirectory.pdf. Funding will be awarded based on two tiered, population based formulas, one for LINCS agencies and one for non-LINCS agency LHDs.

5. Is the LINCS agency eligible for the full amount of funding regardless if local health departments in LINCS jurisdiction apply?

Yes, LINCS agencies are eligible for the full amount listed in the funding table, which is based on the population estimate for the entire LINCS jurisdiction, as outlined in the RFA.

We too currently have our jump bag for vaccination clinics, which includes epi. Benadryl etc. We just ordered an AED for the vaccination site, can this be used to ward the \$3,000?

Yes, as long as it has not been purchased through another grant or reimbursed through another funding source (e.g. FEMA) and purchase date falls on or after 3/1/2021.

POD/Allocation Questions

7. As an approved and activated vaccine provider that has not yet received vaccine since January, how will we be assured that we will have vaccine to coincide with the grant start date?

Applying for the grant does not guarantee direct allocation of vaccine to the potential applicant. As supply to NJ increases, NJ DOH expects that additional POD sites will be activated.

8. Can we expect to get a consistent stream of vaccine (and ancillary supplies) in order to schedule and conduct this vaccine campaign in an orderly and timely manner?

Vaccine allocations to the State of NI are determined by the CDC. COVID-19 Vaccination Supplemental Funding also comes from the CDC. That said, while NJ does not control allocations into the State, every effort will be made to maintain predictability where possible.

9. There is speculation about a COVID-19 booster shot being needed. How would that impact this grant?

This question will need to be addressed as the Federal COVID-19 Vaccination Program continues to evolve.

10. If we are to vaccinate school students, how would this impact vaccine operations?

This question will need to be addressed as the Federal COVID-19 Vaccination Program continues to evolve.

11. Since the funding is specific to LHDs, can they have closed PODs for their geographic service areas/residents as long as they provide to the eligible populations outlined in the grant?

Yes, POD sites may do closed PODs to target eligible populations in line with the regulrements of the grant.

NJ DOH will continually assess vaccination progress. As a reminder, costs may be submitted for reimbursement retroactive to 3/1/2021.

Yes. Each DOH grantee would need to have their own separate contract/professional services agreement/MOA and billing, which would need to be provided on each DOH grantees' Schedule B in SAGE. 16. Can we have sub-grantees in this grant?

It would be set up as a contract, not specifically as a grantee/subgrantee relationship. We would need a Professional Services Agreement, Contract or MOU on each organization's Schedule B. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AWARD OF CONTRACT TO THERMOFISHER SCIENTIFIC FOR LEAD ANALYZING EQUIPMENT, PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:11-3, ET SEQ.

WHEREAS, the County of Passaic (the "County") is a government body incorporated pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:18-1, et seq. and vested with all rights contained therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:20-1 the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Passaic (hereinafter the "Board") are vested with decision making powers on behalf of the County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-3(c), the Governor, in consultation with the Department of Treasury, shall, no later than March 1 of every fifth year beginning in the lifth year after the year in which P.L. 1999, c.440 takes effect, adjust the [bid] threshold amount, in direct proportion to the rise or fall of the index rate as the term is defined in section 2 of P.L. 1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-2), and shall round the adjustment to the nearest \$1,000; and

WHEREAS, on June 30, 2020 the Board approved Resolution No. R20200514 setting the bid threshold at forty-four thousand dollars (\$44,000,00), in accordance with the law; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Health (hereafter "Department") is responsible for protecting and promoting the health of the approximately 510,000 residents of the County; and







This proposal anticipates services from initial design through Construction Documents, Construction Administration and Project Close-out.

The team for this project includes key members of the current Project Team: Clarke Caton Hintz (CCH) for architecture, landscape architecture and historic preservation, Schnabel Conservation for masonry assessment and repair, Crystal Fountains for fountain engineering, and Pennoni for site/civil, structural, and electrical engineering.

The landscaping around the Castle is as significant as the building itself. The original sitework of Lambert's era created a lush setting for the Castle; then in the 1930's the Passaic County Park Commission expanded the site, incorporating it into the regional park system, and developed a naturalistic site plan. Work was executed to the designs of the Olmsted Brothers.

As documented in the Conditions Assessment and Feasibility Study, dated August 2018, and prepared by CCH, the site was in fair condition, the gardens were well maintained. However, the massive stone retaining walls had been undermined either by water erosion or by animals burrowing under the footings. The undermining of the footings have created voids requiring stabilization. Further conversations with the County following the report showed interest in repairing the fountain and addressing the hardscaping and parking lot the northwest of the Castle.

2. REASON FOR CHANGE

item No. 65 - 15" Reinforced Concrete Pipe: During the Installation of the Wayne water main, an existing corrugated metal pipe (directly adjacent to the Wayne main) collapsed. The Contractor was directed to replace the collapsed pipe with 15" reinforced concrete pipe. This resulted in an increase in the quantity for 15" Reinforced Concrete Pipe.

item No. 122 - Water Service Connection (if & Where Directed): During the Installation of the Wayne water main, a second water service connection was encountered and connected. (The contract provided only one (1) if and where directed connection.) This resulted in an increase in the quantity for Water Service Connection (if & Where Directed).

Supplemental Item Nos. S-13 to S-18: The sheeling for the west wall of the pier cofferdam cannot be advanced. There may be subsurface obstructions damaging the sheeling and preventing it from being driven to its tip elevation. In order to determine why the sheets cannot be advanced in their proposed location and to determine an alternative line, if needed, where the sheets can be advanced, an exploratory boring program will be utilized. The need for an exploratory boring program resulted in establishing the following new pay items:

Item No. S-13 - Exploratory Borings - Mobilization & Access Road. This Item will include all labor, equipment, and materials for modifications to the existing access road necessary to provide clear access for the drill rig to perform the borings; the drill rig mobilization; and all necessary supplies.

item No. S-14 - Exploratory Borings - Daily Craw Cost. This item will include all daily costs for the drill rig and misc. drill equipment; the drill crew; and Konkus support orew and equipment.

Item No. S-15 - Exploratory Borings - Remove Access Road. This item will include all labor, equipment, and materials to remove the additional portions of the access road constructed under Item No. S-13 - Exploratory Borings - Mobilization & Access Road (see above).

Item No. S-16 - Exploratory Borings - Permit Fees & Drill Bits. This item will include all permit fees required by regulatory agencies for the borings to be paid as paid/involced by driller. This item will also include any drill bits that are destroyed, above and beyond which is typical in normal drilling practices, as a result of drilling/coring through the riprap access road.

Item No. S-17 - Exploratory Borings - Grouting Holes & Coring Rock. This Item will include the driller services to grout holes upon completion and to core the rock/obstructions.

Item No. S-18 - Alternate Construction Access to Pier. This item will include all labor, materials, and equipment necessary to construct, maintain, and remove an alternate access road to the pier, for pier construction, white allowing construction of the west abutment to proceed.

WHEREAS, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County") is a government body incorporated pursuant to N.J.S.A, 40:18-1, et seq. and vested with all rights contained therein; and

WHEREAS, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County") is a body politic and corporate pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:18-1 and vested with all rights contained therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:20-1 the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Passaic (hereafter "Board") is vested with managing the property, finances, and affairs of the County; and

WHEREAS, the County requires the services of a real estate appraiser to provide expert testimony pertaining to the fair market value of nine (9) easements and six (6) partial takings at the Commissioners Hearing involving the County's acquisitions on portions of Block 302 Lots 2 & 72 in the Township of Wayne in reference to the Two Bridges Road Bridge over the Pompton River and West Belt Extension Project; and
