As you know, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County") leases property from RMD Properties, LLC for the property located at 14-16 Howe Avenue, Passaic, New Jersey 07055 (hereafter "Property") that expires on June 30, 2021 (hereafter "Lease"). The Property had been previously occupied by the New Jersey State Judiciary, Probation Division, which has since consolidated offices in Passaic County at its Paterson site and vacated the Property as of December 31, 2019.

Consequently, the County desires to terminate the Lease effective March 31, 2020, pursuant the following conditions:

- 1. The County shall render payment for the remaining taxes left on the Property for 2019 in the amount of thirty three thousand and ninety three dollars (\$33,093);
- 2. The County shall render a himp sum amount of eighty thousand one hundred ninety six dollars and ninety six cents (\$80,196,96) representing all payments due for rent remaining in 2020;
- 3. The County shall render payment in the amount of sixteen thousand five hundred and forty six dollars and fifty cents (\$16,546.50), representing taxes owed for the first and second quarters of 2020;
- 4. Upon receipt of the preliminary tax bills from the City of Passaic for the third and fourth quarters tax bill for the Property, payment shall be rendered within thirty (30) days;
- 5. The County shall not be obligated to pay any utility bills or CPI adjustments on rent due for monies owed in 2019 and 2020;
- 6. If at any time in 2020 the Property is leased to a new tenant, the County shall not be obligated to pay any rent, taxes, or utilities, for the sixth month period between January 1, 2021 and June 30, 2021;
- 7. If the Property is not rented to a new tenant by December 31, 2020, the County shall only be responsible to pay rent to RMD Properties, LLC for the months of January 1, 2021 to March 31,

2020, in the amount of twenty thousand forty nine dollars and twenty four cents (\$20,049.24) and taxes, which shall be paid within thirty (30) days upon receipt by the County of the preliminary tax bills from the City of Passaic for the Property;

- 8. RMD Properties, LLC is required to inform the County if/when the Property is leased, in writing, at any time between April 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020;
- 9. The County will not be responsible for the remaining utility payments due as set forth in the Lease, effective January 1, 2019; and
- 10. The County agrees to repair any and all damage to walls to of the interior portion of the Property, including but not limited to spackling and painting damaged walls with a color selected by RMD Properties, LLC, making it ready for a new tenant to occupy, as soon as practicable.



SCOPE OF WORK:

- The UST(s) must be registered with the NJDEP in order to remove them (if not previously registered). If the UST(s) have not been registered, a UST Facility Certification Questionnaire, a site map, and a check payable to the "Treasurer State of New Jersey" will have to be submitted to the NJDEP. The NJDEP will then issue a Facility Registration number and Facility ID# for the application submitted. TSES will obtain the ID number and submit the next application "Closure of an Underground Storage Tank" for NJDEP approval.
- 2. Once TSES receives the approved NJDEP "Closure of an Underground Storage Tank System" form, we can then notify the local municipal agency and/or building department of the closure activity in writing and apply for necessary permits. A copy of the approved NJDEP closure form will be submitted with the permit applications. Once the building department approves the applications, TSES can then begin work.

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic(hereinafter "Board") and the Passaic Valley Water Commission, Wayne, NJ are desirous of entering into a Shared Services Agreement for the Two Bridges Road; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic recognize the importance of an accurate count when conducting a census, because the federal government uses census numbers to annually allocate billions of dollars in federal funds for community programs and services, such as health care services for the elderly, education programs, housing and community development, and job training; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Congress uses the census totals to determine how many seats a state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives, and states use the numbers to allocate seats in their law-making bodies; and

WHEREAS, Passaic County's 2010 census completion rate was 71%, an average largely brought down by the county's 41 (Low Response Score) LRS census tracks; and

WHEREAS, Passaic County established its own formal Complete Count Committee in February 2019, with the goal that Passaic County – a significant portion of which was undercounted during the 2010 census, resulting in the loss of one congressional seat within the State of New Jersey – never go under-counted again; and

WHEREAS, the county's Complete Count Committee has concentrated its efforts on educating the public; encouraging participation; conducting community activities through Local Complete Count Committees (LCCCs); increasing the number of public information forums; participating in community events to promote and bring awareness to the census; and establishing community support centers (kiosks); and

WHEREAS, the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholder passed resolution R-2019-1178 accepting a grant award of \$254,540.00 from the DOS202C3-CTY County Grant Program – NJ 2020 Census to assist the County of Passaic and its partner municipalities in organizing complete county activities that will ensure the highest participation in the upcoming 2020 decennial census; and

WHEREAS, Passaic County will use its grant award to ensure that in each of its municipalities a complete count can be accomplished by encouraging a full participation of hard-to-count (HTC) populations through active outreach efforts in communities including African Americans; Latinos/Latins; Asians; various religious groups; Non-Native English speakers; indigent, homeless persons; college students; children under five years of age; men ages 18-49; senior citizens; the disabled; persons displaced by natural disasters; persons who are incarcerated; and members of the LGBTQ community; and

WHEREAS, the County is in need of services to create an all-inclusive public relation and digital communications plan for the County; guide a program of maid media advertising on television and digital platform, including all social media outlets, internet and cable providers; guide hyper local media ad campaigns; and execute the media campaign to increase visibility, and amplify the message of the Complete County Committee, and guide the paid media campaign to make the best use of State grant funding; and

DIGITAL COMMUNICATIONS CONSULTING AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic recognize the importance of an accurate count when conducting a census, because the federal government uses census numbers to annually allocate billions of dollars in federal funds for community programs and services, such as health care services for the elderly, education programs, housing and community development, and job training; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Congress uses the census totals to determine how many seats a state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives, and states use the numbers to allocate seats in their law-making bodies; and

WHEREAS, Passaic County's 2010 census completion rate was 71%, an average largely brought down by the county's 41 (Low Response Score) LRS census tracks; and

WHEREAS, Passaic County established its own formal Complete Count Committee in February 2019, with the goal that Passaic County – a significant portion of which was undercounted during the 2010 census, resulting in the loss of one congressional seat within the State of New Jersey – never go under-counted again; and





A. Introduction

1. Purpose

Pursuant to the citizen participation requirements of 24 CFR Section 91.105 and 24 CFR Part 5, the County of Passaic (referred to as the "County") sets forth the following Citizen Participation Plan (the "Plan") as it relates to the administration of the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Plan presents the County's plan for providing for and encouraging all citizens to participate in the development, revision, amendment, adoption, and implementation of:

- 1) The Citizen Participation Plan
- 2) The Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing (AI)
- 3) The Consolidated Plan (CP)
- 4) The Annual Action Plan (AAP)
- 5) The Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER), and
- 6) The Section 108 Loan Guarantee Program

Lead Agency

The County Department of Planning and Economic Development is the lead agency responsible for the administration of the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG).

Effective Date

Subsequent to approval of this Citizen Participation Plan by Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders and HUD, the Plan shall be effective until it is amended or otherwise replaced.

2. Encouragement of Citizen Participation

General

The County provides for and encourages citizens to participate in the development, revision, amendment, adoption and implementation of the Citizen Participation Plan, the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing, the Consolidated Plan, the Annual Action Plan, and the CAPER. The County encourages participation by low- and moderate-income persons, particularly those living in areas designated as revitalization areas or in slum and blighted areas and in areas where HUD funds are proposed to be used, and by residents of predominantly low- and moderate- income neighborhoods. With respect to the public participation initiatives included in this

Plan, the County will take appropriate actions to encourage the participation of all its citizens, including minorities, non-English speaking persons, and persons with disabilities, as described below.

Non-English Speakers

The County has determined that, based on 2015 American Community Survey data, the latest available source of information, 7.6 percent of its residents (age 5 and older) speak English less than very well. Of these, a total of 3.4 percent of County residents are native Spanish-speakers who speak English less than very well. Italian speakers also exceeded the 1,000 persons threshold with just under 1% of the County population. Unlike Spanish-speaking residents, few of the social services programs of the county indicated that they had frequent contact with Italian-only speaking persons.

To encourage these residents to participate in the development of the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing (AI) and the Consolidated Plan (CP), the County will undertake the following initiatives in addition to publishing advertisements in the Herald News and the Record for these activities:

- At least one stakeholder interview or focus group session will be scheduled during the stakeholder consultation processes for both the Al and CP and will focus on persons with limited English proficiency, and
- The County will provide a Spanish version of meeting agendas, handouts and surveys at meetings and stakeholder interviews conducted for each planning process. The County will continue to include the following language in the advertisements related to the development of these documents:

Persons with Disabilities

To encourage the participation of persons with disabilities, the County will include the following language in all of its public meeting notices published in the *Herald News* and the *Record*:

The County of Passaic will make reasonable accommodations and services necessary for sensory-impaired and disabled citizens at the public meeting. Additionally, translation services may be offered upon request and availability. Persons requiring such accommodations/services should contact the County at least three working days in advance of the meeting. Persons requiring information in alternative formats should contact the Department at (973) 569-4720 (TDD Users: 7-1-1 NJ Relay Center).

The County will conduct all public meetings in locations that are handicapped-accessible, when available.

If requested, the County will mail copies of public meeting notices to persons who are homebound and request such accommodation no less than seven days prior to the public meeting.

Low- and Moderate-Income Persons

The County will conduct at least one public meeting during the development of the Assessment of Fair Housing, the Consolidated Plan, and the Annual Action Plan in a municipality that contains at least 42.76% low- and moderate-income residents, or the most recent exception limit for Passaic County as set by HUD for determining if an area is considered low and moderate income.

Organizations and Agencies

The County encourages the participation of local and regional institutions, the Continuum of Care, businesses, developers, nonprofit organizations, philanthropic organizations, broadband internet service providers, organizations engaged in narrowing the digital divide, agencies whose primary responsibilities include the management of flood prone areas, public land or water resources, and emergency management agencies, and community-based and faith-based organizations in the process of developing, revising, amending, adopting and implementing all documents covered by this Plan. This will be achieved through stakeholder interviews, focus groups and/or public meetings.

Local Public Housing Agency

The County encourages, in consultation with the Passaic County Housing Agency (PHA), the participation of residents of Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers issued by the PHA, in the process of developing, revising, amending, adopting and implementing the documents covered by this Plan. The County will provide information to the Executive Director of PHA about the Assessment of Fair Housing, its affirmatively furthering fair housing strategy, and Consolidated Plan activities related to housing developments and communities so the PHA can make this information available at the annual public hearings required for its Public Housing Agency Plan.

The County encourages participation by PHA stakeholders. This will be carried out by providing to the PHA information on public meetings, surveys and other outreach initiatives related to the documents covered by this Plan. To the greatest extent possible, the County will collaborate with the PHA to prepare a joint Al.

Public Notices

Public review/comment periods and public hearings held in the process of developing, revising, amending, adopting and implementing the documents covered by this Plan shall be advertised in the Record and the Herald News no less than seven days before the public review and comment period commences or the public hearing is held.

Public Hearings

All public hearings will be scheduled at times and locations that are convenient for potential and actual program beneficiaries, and with accommodation for persons with disabilities and non-English Spanish speakers in accordance with this Plan.

Technical Assistance

CDBG staff are available to assist organizations and other eligible individuals that are interested in submitting a proposal to obtain funding through the CDBG program. All potential applicants are strongly encouraged to contact the County Department of Planning and Economic Development for technical assistance before initiating a funding request application.

B. In the Event of an Emergency

In the event of a local, state or federally declared disaster or emergency where public places may be closed to the public or in-person participation may not be feasible or large gatherings may be considered a public health risk, the County may opt to conduct public hearings and meetings virtually via conference call or live webstreaming with the ability to ask questions and provide comment in real time where public comment is required to be heard. D. The Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing (AI)

a. Revision Considerations

There are two types of amendments that may occur with the AAP: minor amendments and substantial amendments. An amendment to the approved AAP is considered substantial under the following circumstances:

- When an eligible activity is added or deleted
- When a change occurs in the purpose, location, or beneficiaries of an activity previously approved
- When a 50 percent change in federal funding occurs where the project is \$25,000 or less
- When a 25 percent change in federal funding occurs where the project is more than \$25,000.

All other changes to funding allocations or approved eligible activities that do not meet the criteria defined above will be considered minor amendments, and

will not be subject to public comments. These changes will be fully documented and executed by the Freeholder Director of the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders. The County may choose to submit a copy of each amendment to the AAP to HUD as it occurs, or at the end of the program year. Letters transmitting copies of amendments will be signed by the Freeholder Director of the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

b. Public Display and Comment Period

The draft Revised AAP will be placed on display for a period of no less than 30 days to encourage public review and comment. The public notice shall include a brief summary of the revisions, the dates of the public display and comment period, the locations where copies of the draft revised AAP can be examined, how comments will be accepted, when the document will be considered for action by the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders, and the anticipated submission date to HUD.
