WANT TO COUNT? GET COUNTED! Why Census 2020 is So Important

The U.S. Census, under Constitutional requirement, is required to count every person living in the U.S. every ten years, and Passaic County is organizing to make sure that there is a *complete count* of all residents.

"A complete count is so important because Census data helps determine how crucial resources will be distributed across our State and our nation for the next decade," says Freeholder Director John Bartlett. "Count all of our seniors, and there will be more federal funding for the programs and services you enjoy."

"Count all of our children, and we can build a new school to ease overcrowded classrooms and provide other kinds of family support. Count all our workers and businesses, and we'll get more infrastructure funding to keep roads and bridges in good repair and make everyone's commute a little easier."

Census data also determines the distribution of political power in our nation. New Jersey was under-counted in 2010, and lost a seat in Congress as a result. Additionally, Census data is confidential. The personal information you provide cannot be shared with any other government agency. The Census Bureau can only use your answers to produce the statistics that paint a picture of Passaic County and New Jersey as a whole.

Starting in early 2020, you will be able to respond to the U.S. Census by phone or online, or you can participate by mail. In early March of 2020, every home will receive a mailed census survey which you can return. In May, the Census Bureau will begin visiting homes that haven't responded to the 2020 Census to make sure everyone is counted. By July 2020, the count is over, and in 2021 we'll start seeing the results. Please be sure your household participates, and encourage your family and neighbors

What is Register Ready?

Register Ready is a free, secure, voluntary database designed to help emergency managers and first responders plan for and support people with disabilities and access and functional needs (DAFN) who may need assistance in the event of a disaster.

You (or someone on your behalf) are encouraged to register if you have a physical, developmental, cognitive or behavioral impairment, language barrier, or transportation challenge that may make it difficult for you to safely shelter in place or evacuate in a disaster.

Who should register?

Permanent and seasonal NJ residents with DAFN who may need help evacuating, sheltering in place or at a public shelter, or requiring emergency assistance should register. Individuals with a temporary disability, such as high-risk pregnancy or other serious medical condition, should register.

How can I register?

What is Passaic County C.A.R.E.S. CAREGIVERS ASSISTANCE RELIEF EDUCATION SUPPORT

C.A.R.E.S. is a client directed program, meaning the caregiver and care recipient work jointly with an appointed care manager to develop and oversee individual services. Services include homemaker, adult medical day, medical alert, and education/support.

Who provides these services?

Qualified service providers receiving federal funding from the Older Americans Act and included in the Passaic County Area Plan certified service providers.

Where to apply?

Applications for services under Passaic County C.A.R.E.S. are processed through the County Department of Senior Services. A caregiver has to specifically contact the office and request a community screen be completed to determine eligibility.

The State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) is a statewide program administered by the New Jersey Department of Human Services with financial assistance through a grant from the U.S. Administration for Community Living (ACL). Currently in the Nation there are 59 million Medicare beneficiaries, including people who are 65 and older and people who have a permanent disability. Many have difficulty navigating Medicare and the health care system on their own. Some do not get the care they need because they cannot pay and do not know about programs that provide help. Others, (the many caregivers who assist family members, friends and neighbors) need answers and guidance. SHIP counselors provide free one-on-one Medicare counseling.
