WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders in the County of Passaic hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the 2020 budget year, the final appropriations of the County of Passaic shall, in accordance with this resolution and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 1.0%, amounting to \$2,606,536.80 and that the 2020 county budget for the County of Passaic be approved and adopted in accordance with this resolution; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Office of the Passaic County Sheriff, et al., docketed in the Superior Court of New Jersey (PAS-L-3510-18) to the law firm of Buglione Hutton & DeYoe for defense of defendant Passaic County Sheriff's Department, which firm has been qualified through a fair and open process; and

WHEREAS, that Resolution, in conformity with the policy of the County of Passaic, was for a fee of up to \$17,500.00; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution R2019-0606, dated July 16, 2019, the Board increased the legal fees from \$17,500.00 to \$50,000.00; and

WHEREAS the County of Passaic's Third Party Administrator, Bergen Risk Managers, has recommended to the Office of the Passaic County Counsel that because of the complexity of the litigation, the legal fee threshold be raised from \$50,000.00 to \$125,000.00 requiring an increase of \$75,000.00; and

WHEREAS a certification is attached hereto to reflect the availability of funds for the within contemplated expenditure.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A SHARED SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic and the Borough of Ringwood are desirous of entering into a Shared Services Agreement to allow for certain Passaic County-owned vehicles to be fueled at Township fueling facilities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Uniform Shared Consolidation Act (N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq.), public entities such as the County of Passaic and the Borough of Ringwood are encouraged to facilitate and improve services by use of shared services as a method of reducing local expenses funded primarily by property taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the said Borough of Ringwood is offering the fueling services for a five (5) year period beginning on April 1, 2020 through April 1, 2025 with a four (4) one year renewal option; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms and conditions as set forth in the attached agreement, the parties have agreed that the Borough will be entitled to be paid monthly for the actual cost of fuel plus a 10% administrative fee for the fuel used by the County (copy of proposed agreement attached hereto and made a part hereof); and

WHEREAS, this proposed arrangement was reviewed by the Freeholder Committee for Public Works at its January 29, 2020 meeting and recommended to the full Board for approval; and

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic that it hereby authorizes the execution of a Shared Services Agreement by and between the County of Passaic and the Borough of Ringwood to allow the County to fuel certain of its vehicles at the fueling facilities of the Township in conformity with the terms and conditions set out in the attached agreement.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Director and Clerk to the Board as well as the County Counsel are authorized to execute this agreement on behalf of the County of Passaic.

SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County") is a corporate body politic of the State of New Jersey, with its principal offices located at 401 Grand Street, Room 205, Paterson, New Jersey and the Borough of Ringwood (hereafter "Borough") is a corporate body politic of the State of New Jersey, with its principal offices located 60 Margaret King Avenue, Ringwood, New Jersey (collectively referred to as the "Parties"); and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, et seq., allows for any local unit to enter into an agreement with any other local unit or unit to provide or receive any services that each participating in the Agreement is empowered to provide or receive within its own jurisdiction, as set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:65-7; and

WHEREAS, the County recognizes a need for and wishes to enter into a Shared Services Agreement (hereafter "Agreement") for the Borough to allow certain Passaic County Vehicles to fuel at the Borough facilities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-5, the County and Borough each adopted resolutions authorizing entry into this Agreement, copies of which are annexed hereto and made part of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AGREED, in consideration of the promises and of the covenants, terms, and conditions hereinafter set forth, the County and Borough agree to perform in accordance with the provisions, terms, and conditions set forth in this Agreement as follows:

- 1. <u>Term.</u> The Agreement shall for a one year period to commence on April 1, 2020 and remain in full force and effect for one (1) year, terminating March 31, 2020, unless terminated sooner as provided in Section 8.
- 2. <u>Project Description</u>. The Borough of Ringwood, shall allow certain Passaic County vehicles to fuel the Borough facilities as directed by the Borough of Ringwood Director of DPW.
- 3. Responsibilities.

a. Passaic County Responsibilities.

- On or before April 1, 2020, Passaic County Officials will provide the Borough of Ringwood DPW Director with a list of vehicles that will be the subject of this agreement;
- ii. The list will include vehicles make, model year, VIN and license plate number;
- iii. Passaic County will provide a list of County employees eligible to operate each vehicle;
- iv. These lists will be updated as needed and any changes will be promptly recorded with the Borough of Ringwood DPW Director;
- v. The Borough of Ringwood will provide the appropriate fuel ID and PIN number for each employee on the aforementioned list;
- vi. The DPW Director will direct Passaic County personnel to the appropriate fueling station at the proper location;
- vii. The Borough shall send monthly invoices to Passaic County for reimbursement of the actual cost of fuel and a 10% administrative fee:

b. City of Clifton Responsibilities.

- i. The Borough of Ringwood will provide the appropriate fuel ID and PIN number for each employee on the aforementioned list;
- ii. The DPW Director will direct Passaic County personnel to the appropriate fueling station at the proper location;
- iii. The Borough shall send monthly invoices to Passaic County for reimbursement of the actual cost of fuel and a 10% administrative fee.

4. Compensation.

- a. The Borough shall perform the services as described herein for a monthly average rate from the State of New Jersey Guideline;
- b. The Borough will invoice the County for services described herein at the monthly average rate set forth by the State of New Jersey;
- c. Payment shall be rendered to the Borough by the County within thirty (30) days of receiving an invoice from the Borough; and
- d. The Parties recognize that the County will make direct payments to the Borough under this Agreement. Should the Borough terminate this Agreement without performing its obligations hereunder, the Borough shall have no liability to the County for damages, direct or consequential. The Borough shall receive a prorated credit if the early

termination option is exercised, and be returned any monies paid for services that are no longer being rendered.

5. <u>Dispute Resolution</u>.

- a. Mandatory Mediation. In the event of a dispute, whether technical or otherwise, the objecting Party must request Non-Binding Mediation and the non-objecting party must participate in the mediation. The costs of such Non-Binding Mediation shall be borne equally by both Parties.
- b. Procedure. The Mediator shall be a retired Judge of the Superior Court of New Jersey or other professional mutually acceptable to the Parties and who has no current or on-going relationship to either Party. The Mediator shall have full discretion as to the conduct of the mediation. Each party shall participate in the Mediator's program to resolve the dispute until and unless the Parties reach agreement with respect to the disputed matter or one party determines in its sole discretion that its interests are not being served by the mediation.
- c. Non-Binding Effect. Mediation is intended to assist the Parties in resolving disputes over the correct interpretation of this Agreement. No Mediator shall be empowered to render a binding decision.
- d. Judicial Proceedings. Upon the conclusion of Mediation, either party may commence judicial legal proceedings in the appropriate division of the Superior Court of New Jersey venued in Passaic County.
- e. Temporary Injunctive Relief. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing herein shall prevent a party from seeking temporary injunctive relief to prevent irreparable harm in the appropriate division of the Superior Court of New Jersey venued in Passaic County.
- **6.** <u>Employment Reconciliation</u>. No employees are intended to be transferred or terminated by virtue of this Agreement.
- 7. <u>Notice</u>. All notices, reports, statements, requests, or authorizations required to be give hereunder shall be personally delivered or sent by first class mail to the Parties at the following addresses, unless a party has been notified of a change of address:

8. <u>Termination.</u> Each party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon ninety (90) days' written notice served upon the Parties by Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested.

- 9. Indemnification. To the fullest extend allowable by the law, each party, their successors, and assigns shall hold harmless, indemnify, defend, and release the other party and their members, directors, officers, employees, agents, and contractors, successors and assigns from and against all suits, liabilities, penalties, costs, losses, damages, expenses or claims, including, without limitation, reasonable attorney's fees arising from or in any way connected with the other party's performance, attempted performance, or failure to perform in connection with this Agreement or other activities as described in the Agreement, including, but not limited to, any injury to or the death of any person or any damage to any property resulting from any act, omission, condition, or other manner related to this Agreement, regardless of cause, unless due to the negligence of any of the indemnified parties.
- 10. <u>Assignment</u>. The County may not assign its rights or obligations under this Agreement without prior approval via resolution of the Ringwood Borough Council.
- 11. Severability/Waiver. All agreements and covenants contained herein are severable, and in the event any of them shall be held to be invalid by any competent court, this Agreement shall be interpreted as if such invalid agreements or covenants were not contained herein. Should one or more covenants or conditions be waived by either party, such waiver shall not be deemed to waive or render unnecessary the consent or approval of the waiving party to or of any subsequent similar act by the other party.
- 12. Governing Law. This Agreement is being executed and is intended to be performed in the State of New Jersey and shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of New Jersey.
- 13. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement contains all of the terms and conditions agreed upon by the Parties and supersedes all other negotiations, representations, and understandings of the Parties, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter.
- 14. Amendments and Modifications. This Agreement may be amended only by an instrument in writing signed by the Parties and effective as of the date stipulated therein. Moreover, for the amendment to be valid and binding on the County of Passaic, it must be accompanied by a resolution authorizing same.
- 15. Options to Extend. The Borough shall retain four (4) one (1) year options to extend the Agreement upon notice to the County sixty (60) days prior to its expiration by Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested.
- 16. <u>Authority</u>. By the signatures below, the Parties execute this Agreement and confirm that they are mutually bound by and fully authorized and empowered to enter into and bind their organization by all provisions contained therein.

Perselay Associates, in cooperation with JANUS Solutions, is requesting approval to provide additional services to the Passaic County Department of Human Services (DHS), at an additional cost to Passaic County, under our existing contract. We are pleased to provide the plan that we have developed for providing leadership and management expertise for the Department, as described below.

As you are aware, under our existing agreement with the County to provide management assistance to DHS, we have had the opportunity, over the past 4 weeks, to spend significant time in the DHS offices. During that time, we have uncovered a lot of information regarding the operation of the department and the related lack of systems and procedures to guide the work that has to be done. That has essentially resulted in a dysfunctional front office which has many challenges regarding contracting (RFP's and awarding contracts); financial responsibilities (processing requisitions, purchase orders, invoices etc. for providers and vendors); as well as, monitoring contract performance, grants management and reporting to the State. We believe that short term, hands on, operational management is needed at this time, and our consultant team is prepared to assume this responsibility. Our work with the current DHS Director will now shift to working with her in the role as county liaison for the needs assessment.

Coverage of DHS:

We have put together a leadership/management schedule to get the Department on its feet administratively. We have engaged Rafael (Ralph) Mata, of the Gambit Services Consulting Group will serve as our Executive Manager on site for 3 days a week with a firm commitment from the end of January for three months, with a continuing agreement through the end of May.

In addition, Fred Sambataro (Executive Management Consultant for Contracts) will also remain a member of the JANUS team. Fred started working on the contracting "challenges" in late December. We assume that with the new Community Services Director coming on board that Fred may not be needed beyond the end of March. If he is needed thru the end of May that is an option.

The balance of the existing team - Gena Haranis, Charlie Venti, and Tom Blatner - will be overseeing this work on a weekly basis virtually and at the DHS offices, and their time will be covered through our current agreement with you. This includes executive coaching for the new Community Services Director. We believe that we should get the Passaic County DHS to the point of solid functioning with an appropriate Director by the end of May.

Additional Costs:

As discussed, the additional resources will be an additional cost incurred by the County. However, they are necessary in order to improve the departmental operations to a point, administratively, that it will be able to conduct the overall needs analysis, including community input, and be part of the solution.

The total additional cost proposed for the additional resources, is \$78,500.

WHEREAS, Police Benevolent Association Local No. 286, Superior Officer's Association (hereafter "PBA"), represents employees in the Department, specifically said employees in the rank and title of Sergeant, Lieutenant, and Captain; and

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, This MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT ("MOA") is made on this _____day of _____, 20___, between the County of Passaic ("County"). Passaic County Sheriff ("Sheriff"), and Passaic County Police Benevolent Association Local #286, Superior Officer's Association ("PBA"); and

WHEREAS, the County, Sheriff, and PBA have agreed to amend the terms of their current Collective Bargaining Agreement on behalf of the Sheriff's Officers in Passaic County, which expired on December 31, 2018; and

NOW THEREFORE, having bargained in good faith and with the foregoing recitals incorporated herein by reference, the County, Sheriff, and PBA hereby agree as follows:

Article 1 - Witnesseth

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved, that the Employer and the Association mutually agree that the following shall represent the Agreement reached as a result of collective negotiations for the contract years, effective January 1, 2019, and shall remain in full force and effect until December 31, 2023, or until a successor Agreement is negotiated and executed, whichever shall last occur.

Article 3 - Grievance

A. The Employee shall present the grievance, in written form, to the Employee's immediate Shift Commander within ten (10) days of its occurrence. The Shift Commander shall then attempt to adjust the matter and shall respond in writing to the Employee within ten (10) working days.

Article 5 - Work Week - Hours of Work

A. All Employees employed in the continuous operation of the Sheriff's Office who have a workweek, consisting of four (4) consecutive days on and two (2) consecutive days off, shall have basic working hours consisting of 7:00AM to 3:00 PM, 3:00 PM to 11:00 PM and 11:00 PM to 7:00 AM with the ability to stagger shifts by 120 minutes. All four and two (4 & 2) Employees shall be allowed one (1) thirty (30) minute lunch period at a time and in an area designated by the Supervisor.

The basic hours of work for five and two (5 & 2) Employees shall be from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM. All five and two (5 & 2) Employees shall be allowed one (1) thirty (30) minute lunch period, with the ability to stagger shifts by 120 minutes.

B. For those Employees assigned to the Courthouse, the basic workweek shall consist of Monday through Friday from 8:15 AM to 4:15 PM, inclusive of a one (1) hour lunch period, with the ability to stagger shifts by 120 minutes. The Employer shall have the right to limit lunch periods of Courth ouse personal to thirty (30) minutes. The Sheriff specifically reserves the right to modify said schedule in emergent situations.

Article 6 - Overtime Payment

D. All Officers recalled to duty shall be guaranteed a minimum of two (2) hours of overtime compensation.

Article 7 - Salaries

- A. The salary schedules shall be modified at each step and rank by the following percentages on each effective date and retroactive to each effective date as applicable:
 - Effective and retroactive to January 1, 2019, employees will move one (1) step on the Salary Guide, and all those employees at maximum will receive a four percent (4%) cost of living adjustment in his/her salaries.
 - Effective and retroactive to January 1, 2020, employees will move one (1) step on the Salary Guide, and all those employees at maximum will receive a four percent (4%) cost of living adjustment in his/her salaries.
 - Effective and retroactive to January 1, 2021, employees will move one (1) step on the Salary Guide, and all those employees at maximum and will receive a three percent (3%) cost of living adjustment in his/her salaries.
 - Effective and retroactive to January 1, 2022, employees will move one (1) step on the Salary Guide, and all those employees at maximum and will receive a three percent (3%) cost of living adjustment in his/her salaries.
 - Effective and retroactive to January 1, 2023, employees will move one (1) step on the Salary Guide, and all those employees at maximum and will receive a three percent (3%) cost of living adjustment in his/her salaries.

Base annual wages for Employees covered by this Agreement shall be set forth in Schedule A annexed hereto.

B. Any Union Employee who is promoted shall suffer no decrease in base salary for accepting said promotion.

The employee shall either:

- a. Be placed at the next highest step on the new rank; or
- b. For those at max/off –guide for the underlying rank, the employee shall receive a three percent (3%) increase of base salary, prorated, for the year of said promotion.

- C. Upon expiration of this agreement, there shall be no movement on the steps/guide or cost of living adjustment, prior to the ratification of a successor agreement which will determine what, if any, amounts the membership is entitled to.
 - a. Upon expiration of this agreement, the only provisions which will end are step movement and cost of living increases. All other conditions/provisions shall survive expiration of the agreement.
- D. All E.M.T.'s will be paid an additional One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars per year incorporated in the base salary. This additional One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars will cease immediately if the Employee fails re-certification. All costs in obtaining an initial EMT certification will be paid by the employee. However, an employee who seeks to obtain an EMT certification may, with the Sheriff's approval, receive their certification from the Passaic County Community College at the employer's expense.

Article 8 - Increments and Longevity

- C. An Employee's anniversary date shall be determined based upon the employee's initial date of promotion as a supervisor within their title, as defined by the Civil Service Commission.
- E. Length of employment for all new Employees will be determined by length of service with the County of Passaic.

Article 9- Night Differential

- A. Employees hired prior to January 1, 2000 working on shifts whose working hours fall between 3:00 PM and 7:00 AM shall receive, in addition to their regular pay, an additional ten (10%) percent of their base salary which shall be incorporated into their base pay. This ten percent (10%) night differential shall be divided equally into the number of pay periods in each year, and said amount, incorporated into the base salary, shall be paid each regular pay. Said amount shall also be paid to all employees working the second and third shifts when on vacation, personal, sick and holiday leave.
- B. Up to an additional ten percent (10%) may also be paid to the employees who do not strictly fall into the above categories if their responsibilities sometimes call for odd hours, and if authorized by the Sheriff or his designee.
- C. Effective October 25, 2016, the current night differential paid to employees working the 3:00PM to 11:00PM shift, shall receive five (5) percent for all new employees hired after October 25, 2016.

Article 11 - Vacation, Sick, Personal, and Bereavement Leaves

D. Bereavement Leave

Employees are entitled to three (3) consecutive calendar days leave of absence for the death of an employee's immediate relative.

Bereavement Leave shall not extend beyond three (3) consecutive calendar days immediately following the death or funeral of a family member unless approved by the County Administrator. "Immediate Relative" includes spouse, civit union partner, child, parent, stepchild, stepparent, sibling, grandparents, mother-in-law, father-in-law, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, grandchildren, niece, nephew, uncle, aunt, or any person related by blood or marriage residing in an employee's household. Employees are paid for all working days during the Bereavement Leave. Employees may be asked for proof at the discretion of the Personnel Department or Administration.

An additional day shall be given in the event of the Employee's spouse or children's death.

Article 12 - Holiday Compensation

C. Those Employees having a four and two (4 & 2) workweek shall be granted fourteen (14) compensatory days in lieu of holiday pay

Article 14 - Payment for Education/Continuing Education

B. Any Employee who enrolls in and attends a course in Criminal Justice related studies at an accredited institution or college approved by the Middle State Association Colleges and Secondary Schools, shall be paid \$20.00 per credit, yearly.

Article 15 - Medical Benefits

A. Medical

5. All Employees shall no longer be allowed to enroll in the County's Traditional Health Care Plan. All employees shall exit the Traditional Health Care Plan. effective upon ratification of the agreement.

Article 16 - Electronic Copies

O. The Employer shall make available electronically, a copy of the final agreement through the Data Management System within thirty (30) days of contract execution.

Article 17 - Ceremonial Activities

Whenever an sworn law enforcement Officer, as defined by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> §43:15A-97, is killed in the line of duty in the State of New Jersey the County agrees to send a minimum of two (2) uniformed supervisors (1 from Courthouse and 1 from Patrol) to participate in funeral services for the said deceased law enforcement Officer, so long as the funeral services take place

within the State of New Jersey, or, if outside the State of New Jersey, within a fifty (50) mile radius of the Passaic County Jail.

Subject to the availability of same, Employer will permit one (1) County vehicles to be utilized by the members in the funeral service.

Officers participating in such funeral service shall not be entitled to any compensation during the time in which they are participating in said funeral service unless otherwise agreed to by the Sheriff's Office.

Period of Agreement

This Agreement shall become effective and retroactive to January 1, 2019 and shall remain in full force and effect until December 3), 2023 or until a successor Agreement is negotiated and executed, whichever shall last occur.

The Parties agree to commence negotiations nine (9) months prior to the expiration of this agreement.

All issues agreed to shall be incorporated into the new agreement. All issues not previously agreed to and not mentioned herein are withdrawn. All other language in the expired Agreement shall continue in the new contract and will remain status quo.

Legislative Update Concerning Code Blue Law

DATE:

In response to your request for information concerning the revisions to New Jersey Code Blue Law, I am providing to you the following:

Effective January 21, 2020, a Code Blue Alert is to be declared when the National Weather Service predicts the following weather conditions within 24 to 48 hours:

- Temperature will reach 32 degrees Fahrenheit or lower; or
- Windchill temperature will be zero degrees Fahrenheit or less for two hours or more.

Therefore, shelters must open if the temperature is 32 degrees or lower. This new law was clarified in NJ S3422 which I attach for your convenience.

In addition, also effective January 21, 2020, the New Jersey Commissioner of Health is authorized to establish quidelines for offering health care and social services to atrisk individuals at a warming center. Under the new law, those services could include vaccines, physical and mental health screenings, and referrals for substance abuse treatment and various social services. NJ S3511 authorizes a coordinator to create a volunteer registry of health care workers, social service providers, and support personnel who could consent to voluntarily provide these services at a warming center during a Code Blue Alert. The legislation also states that volunteers would be protected by New Jersey's Good Samaritan Law, meaning they would not be liable for any civil damages as a result of

their efforts to provide care or treatment in good faith during a Code Blue Alert. I also enclose NJ S3511 for your review as well.





PASSAIC COUNTY CODE BLUE ALERT PLAN

I. Introduction.

The Passaic County Code Blue Alert Plan (hereafter "Plan") is being approved to ensure that at risk individuals are being protected from weather-related exposure and possible death. The Plan strives to clearly delineate the roles and responsibilities of the County of Passaic (hereafter "County"), municipalities and local emergency management coordinators, and non-profit actors in executing and fulfilling the requirements as set forth under N.J.S.A. A:9-43.18, et seq. (hereafter "Code Blue Law"), with the ultimate goal of ensuring that no residents in Passaic County are threatened by weather-related exposure.

II. Definitions.

As used in this Plan:

- (a) "At risk individual" means an individual living outdoors, on the streets, in the parks or in poorly insulated settings, and who is at risk for weather-related exposure and possible death.
- (b) "Board" means the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders.
- (c) "Code Blue Alert" means a designation issued by the Passaic County Director of the Department of Human Services where: (1) the temperatures [that] will reach 25 [32] degrees Fahrenheit or lower; without precipitation or 32 degrees or lower with precipitation; or (2) a wind chill temperature of zero degrees Fahrenheit or less for a period of two (2) hours or more.
- (d) "Code Blue Law" means N.J.S.A. A:9-43.18, et seq.
- (e) "Coordinator" means the Passaic County Office of Emergency Management Coordinator appointed pursuant to Section 12 of P.L. 1953, c.438 (C.App.A:9-42.1) by the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders.
- (f) "County" means the County of Passaic.
- (g) "Director" means the Director of the Passaic County Department of Human Services.

- (h) "Plan" means the Passaic County Code Blue Alert Plan.
- (i) "Sheriff's Office" means the Passaic County Sheriff's Office.

III. Authority.

The Passaic County Code Blue Alert Plan is being adopted by the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders pursuant to the authority granted to county governing bodies under N.J.S.A. A:9-43.18, et seq.

IV. Designation of the Human Services Department as the Lead Agency for implementing the Passaic County Code Blue Alert Plan and the Director's responsibilities in implementing same.

The Passaic County Department of Human Services is hereby designated as the lead agency in implementing the Code Blue Alert Plan. The Director or the Director's designee of the Department shall be responsible for the following:

- (a) Ensuring compliance with N.J.S.A. A:9-43.18, et seq. and all other applicable laws, rules, and regulations related to protecting Passaic County residents who are at risk to weather-related exposure;
- (b) Coordinating with municipal officials and local non-profits in establishing and managing warming shelters where at-risk individuals can be transported during Code Blue Alerts;
- (c) Conducting an Annual Point in Time Count as set forth in Section V of this Plan to determine the number of homeless population of at least ten (10) in each municipality, and coordinating with municipal emergency coordinators;
- (d) In the winter months, monitoring weather reports on a daily basis to determine if a Code Blue Alert is necessary;
- (e) Issuing a Code Blue Alert through multiple channels, including but not limited to email, reverse 911, press release, social media, and any other means necessary to inform the public, and ensuring that all local municipal officials, all County personnel set forth herein with a role in implanting the Plan, and all other non-profit partners operating warming shelters are informed that a Code Blue Alert has been issued and it is no longer safe for individuals to be outside for extended periods of time, as set forth in further detail Section VI;
- (f) Informing the County's Public Information Officer of the Code Blue Alert Declaration, providing all the applicable information, and ensuring that a press release is issued informing the public of the Code Blue Alert Declaration has been issued;
- (g) Informing the Passaic County Administrator, Passaic County Freeholder Board Director, Chairperson of the Board's Human Service Committee, the Passaic County Sheriff, the County Emergency Management Coordinator, municipal emergency management coordinators, and all non-profit partners operating warming shelters of the declaration of a Code Blue Alert;
- (h) Coordinating with the Passaic County Sheriff's Office to ensure that at-risk individuals are transported pursuant to the policies as set forth in Section VIII;

- (i) Issuing a notification ending the Code Blue Declaration after the weather warms to levels outside of the necessary parameters as set forth herein;
- (j) Issuing a status report to the Board after a Code Blue Alert is designated, setting forth the number of warming shelters that were activated, the number of at-risk individuals that were served, the number of at-risk individuals that were transported, and any other pertinent information as determined by the Director; and
- (k) Any other duties or actions necessary to carry out the Plan and ensure compliance of the County of Passaic with the Code Blue law.

V. Annual Point in Time Count.

At least once a year, the County, under the direction of the Director of the Department of Human Services, shall conduct an Annual Point in Time Count to calculate the number of municipalities in the County with a documented homeless population of at least ten (10) individuals. The Annual Point in Time Count shall be presented to the Board's Human Services Committee and included on an agenda of the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholder's meeting as a received report from the Human Services Department. The Point in Time Count Report shall be posted on the Passaic County website.

VI. Code Blue Alert Declaration.

If the Director is informed that: (1) the temperatures [that] will reach 25 degrees Fahrenheit or lower without precipitation or 32 degrees or lower with precipitation; or (2) a windfall temperature of zero degrees Fahrenheit or less for a period of two (2) hours or more, a Code Blue Alert Declaration shall be made to all applicable County personnel, local municipal officials, and non-profit partners, triggering the roles and responsibilities as set forth herein to protect at risk individuals and the homeless population in Passaic County.

During the Code Blue Alert, if an individual identifies a homeless person in need of shelter, the following procedure should be followed:

- (a) Contact the Passaic County Sheriff's Office Dispatch at (973) 389-5951 and advise the dispatcher that there is an at-risk individual in need of shelter under the Passaic County Code Blue Alert Plan. This dispatcher or applicable Sheriff's Office personnel shall notify the Director of the Human Services Department, or his/her designee, that an at-risk individual has been identified;
- (b) Thereafter, the Sheriff's Department shall send an officer to attempt to transport the at-risk individual to a designated warming shelter as previously established by the County;
- (c) The at-risk individual should not be transported to the warming shelter until contact is first made with an official from said warming shelter via telephone, and informing them that a person is being transported; and
- (d) If the at-risk individual refused to be housed in a shelter under the Code Blue Alert Plan, the Sheriff's Office and/or local municipality should follow the established policies and procedures for evaluating the individual for additional services.

VII. Coordination with Municipal Emergency Coordinators.

The Director or his/her designee shall coordinate with all duly appointed municipal emergency coordinators in the County to ensure cooperation and continuity in implementing the Code Blue Alert Plan.

VIII. Transportation of At-Risk Individuals.

Following a Code Blue Alert Declaration by the Director, a notice shall be sent to the designated Passaic County Sheriff's Office officials to inform Sheriff's Office Personnel that any at-risk individuals that are either called in or identified should be transported to the closest warming shelter in proximity to where the person is identified.

IX. Passaic County Warming Centers.

The Director of the Department of Human Services shall be responsible for securing non-profit partners to act as warming shelters in the event of a Code Blue Alert Declaration. A master list of the warming shelters should be maintained by the Director, which shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

- (a) The name of the warming shelter;
- (b) A contact person;
- (c) A contact phone number;
- (d) Address of the warming shelter location;
- (e) A description of the site including but not limited to square footage, maximum occupancy, number of restrooms, handicap accessibility; and
- (f) Any other relevant information.

Additionally, the Director or his/her designee, shall present to the Human Services Committee and Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders a Memorandum of Understanding with each non-profit partner outlining procedures for opening and closing the warming shelters, and other responsibilities as necessary to comply with the Code Blue Alert law. The MOU shall be approved in form and legality by the Passaic County Counsel's Office and shall be ratified by the Board and non-profit.

X. Public Notification.

The list of Passaic County Warming Shelters shall be maintained by the Department and be updated regularly on the Passaic County website, and distributed as necessary to officials with designated roles under the Plan as set forth herein.

XI. Review and Revisions.

The Plan shall be reviewed on a yearly basis by the Director, Coordinator, Passaic County Administrator, Passaic County Sheriff, and Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders as necessary to ensure that all at-risk individuals are being protected from weather exposure during the winter months.





CHA is pleased to submit this proposal for the Goffle Brook Rea Avenue Athletic Field Improvements in the Borough of Hawthorne. We offer the following for your consideration.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

CHA understands that Passaic County seeks engineering design services for the planning design, bidding and construction administrative services for various improvements at the Rea Avenue athletic fields in Goffle Brook Park. CHA understands that these improvements include field replacement for softball and soccer use, drainage improvements, irrigation system, backstop, team benches, fencing, new curbs and sidewalks along Goffle Road and Rea Avenue, and landscaping improvements.

CHA will prepare plans, details, technical specifications, cost estimates, permitting formwork, Stormwater and utility design as required for the task items noted below.

CHA will assist the county during bidding to prepare addenda, review the bids and make a recommendation for award.

CHA will provide construction phase services to include a pre-construction meeting, review shop drawings and RFI's and will attend four construction phase project progress meetings. CHA will perform a final inspection of the project and file a report with the county engineer.

SPECIFIC TASK ITEMS

- 1. Replace the existing field with new field.
- 2. Analyze the geometry and size of the area and determine the optimum layout of the new field (60' base paths).
- 3. Provide sufficient grass space to allow the County to maximize the size of one lined small sided soccer field. Dimensions to be determined during the design phase.
- Upgrade drainage within the field area as needed (in particular by 3rd base dugout area).

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- 5. Amend existing topsoil as required to provide a soil matrix conducive to establishment and maintenance of sod/grass.
- 6. Install a water irrigation system of the grass playing areas (no existing irrigation system).
- 7. Project area to be regraded, sodded and fertilized.

- 1. CHA will analyze the geometry and size of the area and determine the optimum layout of the new field.
- 2. CHA will examine field layout options and provide up to three (3) concept plans for development of the field with various field configuration (softball/baseball and soccer).

D. Utility Engineering

CHA will perform the following:

- Determine the location (horizontal and vertical) of all utility facilities within the project limits. Utility markouts shall be made through coordination with the individual utility companies. Utility locations, as field markup by the utility companies, are to be recovered by survey and shown on the plans.
- 2. Contact the utility companies that may be affected by the construction to verify current or future facilities at the project site. Prepare utility verification plan and conflict identification plan for each utility and send to the utility owners. The Consultant shall request if the utility has any proposed future utility plan for the project area.
- 3. CHA will coordinate and attend up to two (2) utility meetings with all involved utility companies prior to finalizing the project. If available, the County will attend the field meeting. 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- 4. Prepare a separate utility relocation plan for the affected utilities. Coordinate with each affected utilities
- and show the locations of the proposed relocations on the utility relocation plan. Submit the utility relocation plan to the affected utilities for their concurrence. The utility relocation plan will be included in the Contract Plans.
- 5. Notify each utility in writing when the Contract Plans are finalized.
- 6. All copies of correspondence between CHA and each utility shall be submitted to the County Engineer in a timely manner.
- 7. No test pits are anticipated during the design phase.
- 8. Coordinate with water utility and provide on the plans the required equipment and material for the irrigation system. Irrigation controls to be located in Art Center building or independently onsite.

E. Geotechnical Engineering

1. No geotechnical investigation is anticipated for this project.

F. Soils Analysis

1. CHA will sample the existing soils and analyze the soils to determine if any soil amendments are required to create a soil matrix conducive to growing and maintaining sod/grass.

G. Right-of-Way

- 1. It is anticipated that all work will be performed within the limits of the County Park and existing public right-of-ways.
- 2. No additional ROW and/or easements (temporary or permanent) are anticipated for this project.

H. Permits

- 1. CHA will obtain the necessary design and construction approvals for all agencies having jurisdiction (i.e., NJDEP, Hudson Essex Passaic Soil Conservation District, Stormwater Management, Green Acres, HPO, etc.) under design phase.
- 2. NJDEP Freshwater Wetlands and Flood Hazard Area Permits
 - a. A review of the NJDEP's environmental mapping tool, the NJ-GeoWeb, reveals the presence of freshwater wetlands and streams onsite. The information provided on the GeoWeb is informational only and does not represent regulated boundaries. The onsite stream is Goffle Brook which is classified as FW2-NT (freshwater, non-trout) by NJDEP and as such will require a 50-foot riparian zone along the top of bank. The existing fields are located within this 50-foot riparian zone.
 - b. Goffle Brook is a State studied Stream; the floodplain delineation plan is titled "Delineation of Floodway and Flood Hazard Area Goffle Brook", dated 1977 prepared by Tippetts Abbett McCarthy Stratton, Sheet #22. The site is also shown on the FEMA FIRM Maps, effective date 9/28/07 and Preliminary Dated1/9/15. The delineation shows that a portion of the existing fields are located within the Flood Hazard Area Limit. However, it appears that the proposed improvement will quality for a Permit by Rule under the Flood Hazard Area Control Act for construction at or below grade in a fluvial flood hazard area. The riparian zone with within the project limits is actively disturbed with ball fields. Improvements generally do not encroach further into the riparian zone. CHA will prepare an FHA Applicability Determination for written confirmation from NJDEP that the improvements do not require an Individual Permit.

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- c. Based on a visual observation, the waterway includes steep embankments on each side and some armoring (boulders). The waterway is anticipated to be a Sate open water with no wetland fringes along the project limits. Therefore, Freshwater Wetland permits are not anticipated.
- d. CHA will prepare the NJDEP Flood Hazard Area (FHA) Applicability Determination (AD) application includes application form, photographs, figures, mapping, and project description. There is no fee for an AD.

3. Soil Erosion and Sediment Control

- a. CHA will prepare the application for a Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Certification to the Hudson-Essex-Passaic Soil Conservation District (HEPSCD), including site plans, grading plans, erosion control plan, and related notes and details.
- b. In addition, the project will also require a New Jersey 5G3 Construction Activity Stormwater for construction activities, since the overall disturbance is anticipated to be over one acre. This permit was formerly referred to as a Request for Authorization (RFA). The permit is now submitted online to the State following local SCD approval. CHA will provide guidance and direction for the Owner to complete the online application.

4. Green Acres

- a. Goffle Brook Park is in the Green Acres/Open Space database. 

Thank you for the comprehensive email (dated January 6, 2020) providing the status of outstanding West Milford Township Open Space grant projects. Since the year-end departure of the Director of Community Services and Recreation, staff have been gathering information and rectifying issues detailed in the email. In certain cases projects have advanced with funds drawn from Township funds until the project status is known. In regards to the projects with expired deadlines, West Milford requests the following:

Farrell Field - Phase 1 (2014) Phase 2 (2016)

The construction plans and specifications are complete. Bids are scheduled to be received on Friday, March 6, 2020. The remaining Farrell Field – Phase 1 balance of \$37,315.59 will be applied to the Phase 2 project, and drawn down first. The project cannot begin until after the summer recreation season ends and should take no longer than 6 weeks to complete. Therefore, the Township is requesting a deadline time extension to October 31, 2020.

Apple Acres - Design

The January 21, 2020 pre-application meeting in Trenton with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) was not very hopeful for the proposed soccer field with parking lot project. The final direction forward cannot be determined until more information is received from the NJDEP Land Use,

Environmental Specialist. The Township expenses incurred to date is less than \$6,000 and the Township will know by June 31, 2020 if the project can proceed further. Once the viability of the project is known, Township can discuss with the County the projects continuation or conclusion. In addition the Township will draw down expenses paid to that date. Therefore, the Township is requesting a deadline time extension to December 31, 2020.

Bubbling Springs Park

An engineering survey, design and plan preparation quote has been secured from the consulting engineer for softball field regrading and environmental permitting to solve a long-standing soil erosion condition. The Township has funded the local contribution to the project and all related engineering. The goal is to complete the design work in late Spring/early Summer 2020, and then apply for required Soil Conservation permits and potentially Highlands review (given the proximity of surface water). Assuming these go well, the Township will bid the project in early Spring 2021 with construction after completion of the summer recreation program at the Park. Therefore, the Township is requesting a deadline time extension to October 31, 2021.
