RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICES
AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC AND THE
PASSAIC COUNTY IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY CONCERNING
PROVISION BY THE COUNTY OF CERTAIN SERVICES TO THE
PCIA RELATIVE TO PAYROLL AND BENEFITS GRANTED TO
PCIA EMPLOYEES

**WHEREAS** the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic (the "Board") is vested with all of the legislative and executive power of the County of Passaic (the "County"), pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:20-1, et seq.; and

**WHEREAS** the Board has previously adopted a resolution (R-02-685, 12/31/02) creating the Passaic County Improvement Authority (the "PCIA"), pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:37A-44 <u>et seq.</u>; and

**WHEREAS** the Board subsequently adopted a resolution (R-07-321, 06/26/07) authorizing an Interlocal Agreement between the County and the PCIA, pursuant to which the County agreed to provide PCIA with services relative to the processing of payroll for employees hired by PCIA, as well as providing them with health benefits and necessary insurance coverage for workers' compensation and temporary disability; and

**WHEREAS** pursuant to said Interlocal Agreement, the PCIA agreed to reimburse the County for the costs of these services and coverage for each of its employees at the average per cost per year to the County of Passaic from the previous calendar year (2006) plus an administrative fee of two and one-half (2 ½) percent per annum of the average gross monthly payroll, as more fully set forth the adopting resolution and agreement; and

**WHEREAS** the Interlocal Agreement had an initial term commencing July 1, 2007 and terminating June 30, 2008, and provided for automatic annual renewals thereafter, with a final termination date of June 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS the Board and PCIA are desirous of continuing this arrangement and executing a new Shared Services

Agreement memorializing same, substantially in the form attached to this resolution; and

WHEREAS pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Shared Services Act, specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:65-7 (4), the term of the Shared Services Agreement shall ten (10) years, commencing on July 1, 2014 and terminating on June 30, 2024 unless previously terminated by either party upon written thirty (30) days written notice; and

**WHEREAS** the Administration and Finance Committee reviewed this matter at its meeting of May 28, 2014 and recommended this resolution to the full Board for adoption;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic that it hereby authorizes a Shared Services Agreement by and between the County of Passaic and the Passaic County Improvement Authority for the said County to provide employee services and mandated insurance coverage, as more particularly set forth in the attached draft agreement; and

AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT entered into and agreed to on this day of

2014 by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic whose address is

Administration Building, 401 Grand Street, Paterson, New Jersey 07505 (hereinafter referred to

as the "County") and the Passaic County Improvement Authority, whose address is 930

Riverview Drive, Suite 250, Totowa, NJ 07512 (hereinafter referred to as the "Authority"); and

WHEREAS the Authority, a public body corporate and a body politic of the County of

Passaic created by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic pursuant to

N.J.S.A. 40:37A-44 et seq. with all the power and responsibilities set forth in the statute, are in

the process of hiring employees; and

WHEREAS said Authority is desirous of providing those employees with the ability to be

paid through payroll services, necessary health benefits such as medical, dental and prescription

drugs, and statutory employee insurance such as worker's compensation and disability insurance

coverage; and

WHEREAS the County of Passaic provides all these benefits to its employees through

various self-funded accounts, programs and trust funds authorized and permitted by law; and

WHEREAS the Authority has expressed an interest in providing the needed employee

services by contracting with the County to provide these services by enrolling its employees in

the necessary payroll and self-funded program at the per-employee cost for these services plus a

small administrative charge per employee; and

WHEREAS these services can be provided by the County to the Authority pursuant to an

Interlocal Services Agreement; and

WHEREAS, by resolution, the Authority has been authorized by its Commissioners at a

meeting dated

and the County by its Freeholders at a

meeting dated

authorized an Agreement for the provision of these

services to the Authority.

NOW THEREFORE for the mutual consideration hereafter stated the County and

Authority agree as follows:

1. County will permit the employee(s) of the Authority to join its health benefit(s) program

and provide the same level of coverage that is provided to regular full-time County employees.

These health benefits will include medical health coverage, prescription drug benefit coverage

and coverage for dental. The level of benefit to be provided to each employee can be uniform

but the Authority may determine how much of any of the costs should be borne by the

employee(s) including but not limited to the amounts of co-payments and/or deductibles.

2. The County will also insure, cover, and/or administer for the employee(s) of the

Authority for worker's compensation and temporary disability to the same extent it covers full-

time County employees.

The County provides the health benefits and insures its employees for worker's

compensation through self-funded trust funds. The Authority agrees that it will pay for these

benefits to its employees based upon the average monthly costs that the County incurs on a per-

employee basis. This average monthly cost will be based upon what the actual cost to the

County to insure and provide these services (health, worker's compensation and administration

of temporary disability). The determination of the cost will be set each November and notice

will be provided to the Authority, upon that determination. The new cost will take effect January

1 of the ensuring year and will continue in effect through the end of that calendar year.

3. In addition to that set forth above, the County will provide payroll/pension/human

resource services for the employee(s) of the Authority.

The Authority will deposit the gross amounts necessary to process each employees'

salary at least three (3) days prior to the County's payroll day, which normally are every other

Wednesday throughout the calendar year. The Authority will make sure that the County Finance

Department has all the information necessary to properly pay each of its employees and, in

return, the County through its payroll services, will make sure that all proper deductions.

including those requested by the employee (deferred compensation) or required by law to be

made (i.e. pension loans or court-ordered deductions). In addition, the County's Personnel and

Employee Benefit Departments will assist Authority employee(s) on answering inquiries in areas

such as pensions, health benefits, disability and other matters germane to those services being

provided under this Agreement.

4. In furtherance of the services to be provided under this Agreement, the Authority agrees

that it will notify the County in a timely manner concerning any changes in the number of

employees that are being covered under this Agreement and, more importantly, in changes in

compensation that each of those employees are to be receiving.

5. This Agreement shall be effective from July 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014. The

Agreement will automatically renew on January 1, 2014 and automatically renew for one year

periods thereafter, beginning each subsequent January 1. Either party may terminate this

Agreement upon thirty (30) days' written notice.

6. Authority agrees that it will make payment for the health benefits and insurance coverage

mentioned above based upon the average cost per month per employee for each category based

on the County's actual cost, as set forth in paragraph 2 of this Agreement. County agrees that it

will provide an updated costs in November of each year of this Agreement. In the event that

County fails to provide an updated cost to the Authority, the Authority will not be obligated to

pay any additional sums for the coverage set forth herein (other than payroll) until at least sixty

(60) days after the updated costs are presented to the Authority. Payment will be made for this

coverage to the County monthly and will be paid within 30 days of the month for which

coverage is being provided. The Authority will make retroactive payments to cover the

increased cost from January 1 of the contract year through the end of the sixty (60) day period

after which notification of an increase was provided.

7. In addition to the amounts to be paid for services and coverage set forth under this

Agreement, Authority agrees to pay to the County a fee of two and one-half (2.5%) percent of its

average monthly payroll as a fee for the County supplying these services and coverage. This fee

will be paid monthly based upon the previous gross monthly payroll.

8. This Agreement may only be amended in writing by the written concurrence of both the

Commissioners of the Authority and Board of Chosen Freeholders on behalf of the County of

Passaic.

AN AGREEMENT, entered into between the Passaic County Department of Health, having its principal office at 18 Clark Street, Paterson, New Jersey 07505, hereinafter referred to as the PCDH and the Paterson Division of Health, having its principal office at 176 Broadway, Paterson, New Jersey 07505, hereinafter referred to as the "Local Health Department," in the County of Passaic, New Jersey, to ensure an adequate and appropriate level of countywide participation and collaboration for public health preparedness and response to bioterrorism, outbreaks of infectious disease and other public health threats and emergencies, and in accordance with the requirements of the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services' Local Core Capacity Infrastructure for Bioterrorism Preparedness Grant.

**WHEREAS**, Passaic County has created the Passaic County Department of Health pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:3A2-1 et seq., to provide an array of public health services; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services has designated the Passaic County Department of Health as the Local Information Network and Communication System — LINCS — agency for Passaic County; and

WHEREAS, the LINCS Agency has applied for a Local Core Capacity
Infrastructure for Bioterrorism Preparedness Grant with the New Jersey
Department of Health, Division of Public Health Infrastructure Laboratories
Emergency Preparedness (DHDPHILEP); and

WHEREAS, in the interest of public health preparedness and response, effective and coordinated countywide public health systems must be created utilizing the valuable assets, talents and experience residing in local health departments and LINCS agencies throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, the Local Core Capacity for Public Health Preparedness

Grant requires inter-local health services agreements between the Passaic

County Department of Health and Paterson Division of Health to cooperatively

work to plan and implement approved activities and work plans for Passaic

County; and

WHEREAS, the Paterson Division of Health, herein after known as the "Local Health Department," agree to cooperatively work with the LINCS Agency

for the planning and implementation of State approved services/activities for bioterrorism, infectious disease outbreaks, and other public health threats and emergencies preparedness and response for Passaic County; and

**WHEREAS**, the parties to this agreement are authorized to contract for said services pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-7 et seq.;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, agreements and other considerations between the parties, the parties do hereby mutually agree as follows:

#### 1. General Provisions

The LINCS Agency Health Officer, his/her Local Core Capacity Public

#### 2. LINCS Agency Activities

The LINCS Agency has agreed with the New Jersey Department of Health to build a public health infrastructure unit within its organization by hiring qualified personnel and supporting a DOH Planner to assist in implementing State approved activities in its Local Core Capacity For Public Health Emergency Preparedness Grant, including (LINCS COORDINATOR, EPIDEMIOLOGIST, PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE, HEALTH EDUCATOR/RISK COMMUNICATOR, INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SPECIALIST, PARTNERSHIP COORDINATOR, ETC.) and shall perform activities required by the grant, in cooperation with the Local Health Department, for the benefit of all local health department jurisdictions, their municipalities and residents, including but not limited to:

**a.** Preparedness Planning and Readiness Assessment: Establish and ensure countywide strategic leadership, direction, assessment, and

**b.** Surveillance and Epidemiology Capacity: Enhance, develop, and

d. Communicating Health Risks and Health Information Dissemination:

Ensure effective risk communications capacity that provides for timely

information dissemination within the county to citizens during a bioterrorist

attack, outbreaks of infectious disease, or other public health threat or

emergency; train key individuals in communication skills; identify key

Education and Training: Ensure the assessment of the training needs of key public health professionals, infectious disease specialists, emergency department personnel, and other public health care providers related to preparedness for and response to bioterrorism, other outbreaks of infectious disease, and other public health threats and emergencies, and ensure the effective coordination, marketing, facilitation and provision of needed education and training to key target audiences through multiple channels, including academic institutions, distance learning, and other sources.

## 3. Local Health Department Activities

The Local Health Department, pursuant to the terms and objectives of the Local Core Capacity Infrastructure for Bioterrorism Grant and this interlocal agreement, agrees to:

a. recognize the LINCS Agency, its Core Capacity Public Health staff and the DOH Planner as the planning and coordinating entity for countywide public health preparedness/response, as designated by the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services, and will work jointly with the LINCS agency and DHSS staff in determining the delineation of responsibilities of the LINCS Agency, the Local Health Department and other key local public health system

4. **Mutual Aid** 

In the event of a bioterrorist event or incident, outbreak of infectious

local health department with mutual aid in the form of human resources, materials, supplies, equipment, etc. to support the public health response to the incident, contain the threat, and protect the public's health. Mutual aid shall be requested and provided for large-scale incidents or other incidents that tax the resources of the impacted local health department, or that would otherwise result in an inadequate public health response. Mutual aid involving multiple local health department jurisdictions within the county will be coordinated by the LINCS Agency and with the Local Health Departments, in cooperation with the DOH Planner. For multi-county incidents, mutual aid will be coordinated by the DOH Regional Planners/Coordinators in cooperation with the LINCS Agencies and the effected local health departments, in cooperation with DOH Planners of those counties,

#### 5. Cost of Agreement

There is no cost to the Local Health Department nor the municipalities within its jurisdiction associated with the provision of services and the implementation of activities under this Agreement. However, the Local Health Department will designate appropriate staff and provide for the fullest participation of the Health Officer and other key personnel to support and implement activities under this Agreement.

#### б. Term of Agreement

This Agreement shall take effect on July 1, 2014 and shall remain in effect unless terminated by either party in accordance with section 8, below.

#### 7. Financial Terms

The total grant award for emergency preparedness for the Passaic County Department of Health is \$514,592.00 (Five Hundred Fourteen Thousand and Five Hundred Ninety Two Dollars). A sub-grant carved-out for the Paterson Division of Health will be \$226,525.00 (Two Hundred Twenty Six Thousand and Five Hundred Twenty Five Dollars),

The Passaic County Department of Health will reimburse Paterson Division of Health Grant payments contingent upon the satisfactory completion of all grant fiscal and programmatic deliverables for the grant period. The grant funds in the amount of \$226,525.00 are for the grant period effective July 1. 2014, through June 30, 2015.

Paterson must furnish quarterly grant expenditure reports to Passaic County for cost reimbursement. First, second, and third quarter expenditure reports are due 10 days after the close of each quarter (10/20/2014, 01/20/2015, and 04/20/2015); fourth final report is due no later than 45 days after the end of the budget period (08/25/2015).

The estimated time for disbursement of funds to the Paterson Division of Health will be approximately sixty (60) days of receipt of funds from the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services.

#### 8. Termination

This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice by the party desiring to terminate said agreement. Such notice shall be given no later than sixty (60) days prior to the termination date.

#### 9. Approval

This Agreement and any amendments hereto, shall be subject to the formal approval of the Health Officer of the LINCS Agency and the Health Officer of the Local Health Department, and their respective governing bodies as required, The Agreement shall be submitted for review and acceptance of the New Jersey Department of Health, Division of Public Health Infrastructure Laboratories Emergency Preparedness.

#### 10. Copy

- **a.** A copy of the fully executed Agreement is to be maintained on file at the administrative offices of both the Local Health Department and LINCS Agency, and subject to review by the DOH and other interested parties as provided by the Open Public Records Act.
- **b**. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:65-7, a copy of this fully executed agreement shall be filed by the local authorities with: NJDCA, Division of Local Government Services, 101 South Broad Street, PO Box 803, Trenton, NJ 08625-0803.

#### 11. Statutory Authority

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as a weakening or diminishing of The Local Health Department's LINCS Agencies, and/or DOH's statutory authority or responsibility to provide public health services.

#### 12. Indemnification of LINCS Agency

The Local Health Department hereby agrees to indemnify the LINCS

Agency for any and all claims which arise during the course of this agreement

and which allege negligence as a result of its work performed during the course

of the subject Grant.

The County will pay the percentage as indicated on the salary addendum, of the salaries/wages and fringe benefits if not provided by the state/federal government, estimated at \$126,425, for the period of January 1, 2014 to December 31, 2014 for employees listed on the salary addendum. Should employment of any person in a RCE position cease, RCE will request to utilize the remaining COUNTY funds for part-time temporary employee(s) in the programmatic area(s) in Passaic County with agreement to be indicated in writing.
- c. RCE will bill the COUNTY in quarterly installments for reimbursement of approximately one-fourth of the agreed percentage of the actual annual salary and wage costs with payments due on April 1, July 1, October 1 and January 1. The final quarter's payment will be adjusted to reflect the exact yearly payment of the predetermined percentage of the total annual salary and wage cost, not to exceed \$126,425. The quarter ending June 30 will reflect Rutgers University salary adjustments in accordance with the University's fiscal year end on that date. RCE and the COUNTY will be responsible to pay the same percentage of any salary increases or bonuses entitled to the employee through the University and/or contracted union agreements.

Introduced on: Adopted on: Official Resolution#: R20140420 This annual salary and wage agreement is meant to provide each party with simplified personnel and payroll administration for RCE faculty and staff and is not intended to alter the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding between the parties, the enabling federal and state legislation, nor the accepted county relationships established for these employees (*i.e.*, unclassified county employee status, supervision of county paid staff, driving county vehicles, liability coverage, *etc.*). This agreement shall be renewed by both parties on an annual basis with the completed and authorized copy to be returned to RCE by <u>April 1</u> of each year.

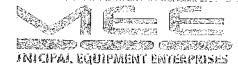

As requested, please find T&M Associates' Scope of Services and Engineering Fee for design services required for the Replacement of the Superstructure for the Crosby Avenue Bridge, PC#476 The existing bridge consists of a non-composite prestressed concrete voided slab beam superstructure with a variable depth bituminous concrete overlay. There are reinforced concrete sidewalks and three rail aluminum railings along each side of the structure. The total depth of the existing superstructure, including the bituminous overlay is 28". Due to the non-composite construction of the existing superstructure, the beams are susceptible to water leakage and infiltration, and exhibit large areas of delamination and spalling on their undersides, with heavy corrosion to exposed reinforcing steel and prestressing strands. The new superstructure will consist of prestressed concrete adjacent voided slab beams composite with a reinforced concrete deck with a combined total depth of the beams and deck equal to the total depth of the existing superstructure. New sidewalks and galvanized steel railings will be constructed along each side of the new superstructure.

#### SCOPE OF SERVICES

#### PHASE I – PRELIMINARY DESIGN

## TASK 1 - Supplemental Survey and Site Reconnaissance

T&M will perform supplemental topographic survey that will extend across the structure and at least 40 feet onto each approach roadway. Survey sections will be taken at 25 feet intervals and at each deck joint and bridge seat elevations will be taken at each abutment. T&M will also visit the site to identify and locate existing driveways and utilities that will be impacted by the proposed construction. Existing utilities that require temporary support during replacement of the superstructure will be identified.

#### NJDEP General Permit No.1 Application

A change order for additional work in the amount of \$121,675.83 was reviewed and recommended for approval by the Public Works Committee at its meeting of June 1, 2014. Since this change order increases the contract amount by more than 20%, the procedures at N.J.A.C. 5:30-11.9 are being followed. This change can be allowed since it was not reasonably possible to issue a new contract for the additional work. Final construction was underway and the nature of the work required by this change required that the work continue under the same contract.

Subsequent to receiving bids on the project, the Borough of Woodland expressed its desire to add curbing along McBride Avenue to the contract on a reimbursable basis. The County deemed this appropriate, and entered into an agreement with Woodland Park in the amount of \$300,000. This single item accounts for the majority of the total change orders leading to this request.

Redesign of the underground drainage project in Pompton Lakes due to utility conflicts caused the project to be moved deeper into the ground, necessitating

specialized construction procedures and oversized structures. This also contributed significantly to the increase in the cost of this contract.

2. Statement indicating why these circumstance could not have been foreseen:

It is often impossible to determine the true condition of structures and roadways prior to construction.

3. Statement indicating why issuance of the change order would be in the best interests of the contracting unit and would not constitute an abuse of these rules.

The County deemed it appropriate to include Woodland Park's curbing in the contract as installing the curb after paving would damage the new roadway surface. The County was able to negotiate a reduced unit price for this work.

Deleting the drainage items from the project would not have solved the problem of standing water in the roadway of Paterson Hamburg Turnpike or the subsurface failures due to the problems with the existing system.

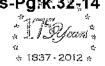

In my capacity as Chief Executive Officer of the County of Passaic, I am hereby requesting that the Board of Chosen Freeholders adopt a Change Order for the above-referenced contract above the 20% increase in contract award price, which is permitted under the Local Public Contract Law. By way of background to the request I received a letter dated June 3, 2014, from Assistant County Engineer Timothy R. Mettlen, along with proposed and certification dated June 3, 2014 from Passaic County Engineer Steve Edmond, outlining the various facts and conditions that contributed to his project exceeding the 20% limitation on change orders.

Last May, the Board of Chosen Freeholders adopted Resolution R-13-296 Awarding the Mid County Roadway Resurfacing for Haledon, Little Falls, Wanaque, Pompton Lakes, Woodland Park, Totowa and Wayne, in the amount of \$1,593,902.30. Subsequent to the adoption of the Resolution, the County was approached by the Borough of Woodland Park, who requested that as part of the Resurfacing Project, the County have its contractor J.A. Alexander, Inc., install additional curbing along McBride Avenue, on a reimbursed basis. The Board of Freeholder agreed to the request and the County and Woodland Park entered into a shared services agreement. I have been advised that this additional work cost approximately \$300,000, and will be reimbursed to us, by Woodland Park, under the Agreement. It is my understanding this item accounts for the majority of this Change Order.

Under these circumstances, I join in the recommendations of both the County Engineer and Freeholders of the Public Works and Buildings & Grounds Committee that this change order in excess of 20% of the original contract award of \$1,593,902.30 be taken up and adopted by the Board, bringing the new contract price to \$2,003,343.90.

Maser Consulting, P.A. is pleased to submit this proposal to provide additional professional engineering services for the design of improvements to Oldham Road in Wayne Township. Our current contract for this project includes design services along Oldham Road from Preakness Avenue to Paterson Hamburg Turnpike/Central Avenue. The proposed improvements and design services in the original contract were limited to Oldham Road. The County has indicated that it is now desirable to expand the design services to include portions of Preakness Avenue and Paterson Hamburg Turnpike/Central Avenue, in order to provide left turn lanes from these intersecting streets onto Oldham Road. In addition, the County has indicated that traffic signals will be installed at the intersections of Oldham Road with Preakness Avenue, and Oldham Road with Paterson Hamburg Tumpike/Central Avenue. This proposal includes the necessary additional services for the design of the expanded road limits as well as the two (2) new signals.

The following additional professional services will be required:

# Phase 1A - Survey and Geometrics

Maser Consulting will expand the previously completed field survey limits along Preakness Avenue and Paterson Hamburg Tumpike/Central Avenue. In order to accommodate the design limits for the left turn lanes the following additional limits will be surveyed:

- Along Preakness Avenue, an additional 350° of survey is needed west of Oldham Road.
- · Along Paterson Hamburg Turnpike/Central Avenue, an additional 350' of survey is needed east of Oldham Road.

We will also collect existing deed and filed map information for the expanded limits, and update the project base map to include all of the field and right of way collected data.

Once the base map has been updated, Maser Consulting will prepare an updated geometrics plan depicting the additional improvements on Preakness Avenue and Paterson Hamburg Turnpike/Central Avenue.

### Phase 2A - Permits, Utilities and Preliminary Plans

Maser Consulting will prepare the necessary permit plans and applications, provide utility investigations, and prepare the preliminary plans for the additional project limits, on Preakness Avenue and Paterson Hamburg Tumpike/Central Avenue. The preliminary design and required plans will be prepared in accordance with the original project scope of work. This Phase includes additional services to be provided by our subsurface utility engineering subconsultant, InfraMap, to perform additional utility designations and test holes within the expanded limits.

Please note that in accordance with our original contract, we have not included any costs for a driller/borings/traffic control associated with geotechnical services for retaining walls. The County will contract directly for these services which will be performed at locations specified by Maser Consulting.

Maser Consulting will utilize the previously collected manual turning movement counts at the intersections of Oldham Road with Preakness Avenue and Oldham Road with Paterson Hamburg Turnpike/Central Avenue to analyze the operation of the intersections in iterative Highway Capacity Software (HCS) runs and analysis using Synchro and SimTraffic. The capacity will be maximized and phasing recommendations will be made. Depending on the results of these analyses, separate timing plans will be prepared for AM and PM conditions provided, as well as off-peak, as necessary.

Please note that Warrant Analyses were previously conducted at the Preakness Avenue and Paterson Hamburg Turnpike/Central Avenue intersections and both warranted the installation of traffic signals. For the purposes of this proposal, we assume that these warrant analyses will be used to justify the traffic signal installation and we will not prepare new/updated Warrant Reports as part of this effort.

Once the analyses are performed, and the phasing patterns are set, a Traffic Signal Layout Plan will be prepared for each of the intersections. The Traffic Signal Layout Plan will be prepared depicting proposed signal layout, pavement markings, channelization, signing, and parking restrictions. The signal plan will be prepared in accordance with the 2009 edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). We will also evaluate the need for any "Red Signal Ahead" signs. Once the traffic signal design and analysis is complete, the traffic signal

timing directive will be prepared and submitted to the County as a hard copy and a Microsoft Word Document. The timing can also be included on the plan if desired.

It should be noted that the traffic signal will be designed to maximize pedestrian safety and all signal equipment will be located to conform to MUTCD and ADA guidelines.

#### Phase 3A - Final Plans and Specifications

Upon receipt of comments from the County on the preliminary design plans, Maser Consulting will prepare final plans, quantities and estimate for the work within the expanded project limits. Under this Phase, we will also prepare the Traffic Signal Electrical Plans in accordance with the NJDOT Design Manual, Passaic County, and Wayne Township design guidelines. These plans will include junction box locations, conduit layout, controller location, electrical wiring and construction notes. We will also prepare the necessary supplemental specifications, details, quantities and estimate for the traffic signal related items.

Due to the expanded roadway limits, additional parcel maps and descriptions will also be required. This Phase includes preparing these documents for the additional project limits, in accordance with the original project scope of work.

#### Phase 4A - Plan and Specification Revisions

Under this Phase, Maser Consulting will make final plan and specification revisions to address any final County comments. This work will be related to the additional roadway project limits as well as the traffic signal installations.

#### Phase 5A - Bidding Phase

Maser Consulting will provide responses to bidders' questions, and perform the bid review and provide recommendations for the work associated with the additional roadway project limits as well as the traffic signal installations.

### Phase 6A - Construction Phase

Under the original project contract, it was anticipated that Maser Consulting would need to provide up to 10 hours of onsite inspection per week, for the duration of construction. The County has indicated that these services will not be needed, as they will provide the necessary full time inspections. However, Maser Consulting will provide engineering design support on an as-needed basis, with an estimate of 150 total hours. Please note that the Fee for this Phase includes a credit for removing the onsite inspection services from our contract.

Services under this Phase will also include the review of shop drawing submittals for the traffic signal related items (roadway item shop drawing review is already included in our original contract).

Upon completion of construction, we will prepare an as-built traffic signal plan and as-built roadway plans for the additional project limits, based upon the Contractor's red-line plans. The as-built plan will not be based on an actual survey of the constructed improvements by a survey field crew; rather our services will include a site review to confirm general conformance to the contract plans. Any additions, deletions or modifications to the improvements will be noted. These plans will not include elevations or actual quantities installed on the project.

Maser Consulting will also conduct a final inspection of the two (2) traffic signals, and will be present at the traffic signal turn-on. A final As-Built Traffic Signal Plan and Timing Directive will be sent to the County for their use in obtaining the ordinance. Also, a Design Certification will be issued indicating that the signal was designed in accordance with the MUTCD, the engineer has inspected the signal, and the installation is in accordance with the design plan.

### Phase 7A - Traffic Protection Services for Utility Test Holes (Optional)

Our current contract does not include traffic protection services that will be necessary for the subsurface utility investigations by our subcontractor. It is assumed that these services will be requested through the County, and that the County will arrange for the necessary services. Alternatively, these services can be arranged through InfraMap. The advantage of this is that InfraMap will have direct control and responsibility for scheduling these services, in conjunction with their schedule to perform test hole investigations.

The following are specifically excluded from these additional services:

- Design of additional roadway improvements beyond the limits stated in this Scope;
- Construction administration and construction inspection;
- Traffic signal structural design services;
- Manual turning movement counts and data collection;
- Traffic signal warrant analysis/report
- · Overhead utility clearance sketches;
- Interim or temporary traffic signal plans;
- Intersection lighting design.

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of Passaic

**WHEREAS**, the County of Passaic has been awarded a grant by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (NJDCA) for US Housing and Urban Development (USHUD) Disaster CDBG-DR funds of \$11,854,865 on behalf of those municipalities in Passaic County impacted by disasters during 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Passaic County Board of Chosen

Freeholders adopted resolution R-12-970 on December 11, 2012

accepting the grant from the New Jersey Department of

Community Affairs (NJDCA) for US Housing and Urban

Development (USHUD) Disaster Recovery CDBG-DR funds; and

WHEREAS, the Passaic County Board of Chosen
Freeholders adopted resolution R-2013-396 on June 11, 2013
authorizing the execution of sub-recipient agreements with the participating municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the municipalities of the Borough of Hawthorne, Township of Little Falls, City of Passaic, City of Paterson, Borough of Pompton Lakes, Borough of Totowa, Township of Wayne, and Borough of Woodland Park have requested additional funds to engage a Construction Manager to assist the municipalities in the implementation of their projects; and

**WHEREAS,** the Passaic County Board of Chosen

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS in 2005 the Passaic County Planning Board identified a need for a Corridor Enhancement Program to encourage and enhance economic development along the commercial and recreational corridors of Passaic County; and

WHEREAS the Corridor Enhancement Program would serve to bring more business and tourism to Passaic County by providing a better, safer and more attractive environment along the commercial and recreational corridors of the County; and

WHEREAS the Corridor Enhancement Program would increase the safety to the travelling public as well as improve the health and welfare of citizens and visitors to Passaic County by encouraging exercise and pedestrian, bicycle and mass transit usage; and

WHEREAS the Corridor Enhancement Program would improve the health of the various communities in Passaic County by enhancing the corridors which are often downtown areas and making them more conducive to economic development or redevelopment; and

WHEREAS on June 13, 2005 the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders did adopted the necessary amendments to the Passaic County Subdivision Resolution and Passaic County Site Plan Resolution to create the Corridor Enhancement Program and designate specific roads in all 16 municipalities as corridors; and

WHEREAS the Passaic County Planning Board did on July 24, 2008 adopt a Corridor Enhancement Plan Element of the Passaic County Master Plan to implement the Corridor Enhancement Program; and

WHEREAS since 2008 the Passaic County Planning Board has adopted further elements of the Passaic County Master Plan building on the principles identified in the Corridor Enhancement Plan Element; and

The story with the golf resolution is as follows:

In 2009, the golf course contracted with US eDirect for 5 years for a point of sale program. That contract has since expired. In the time since then, the folks at the golf course have identified several shortcomings with the eDirect system.

In pursuing options, we discovered ForeUP Golf, whose system will allow us to resolve many of the issues that have plagued the golf course and our customers. The ForeUP system is vastly superior in many ways. Chiefly, this system will allow us to take reservations on both courses, rather than just the west course as we have today.

If we can, I would like to get this on for Tuesday. Because the sooner we can do the purchase, the sooner we can fix the reservation problem we are having. And given that we are heading full steam ahead into golf season, time is not on our side.

Anyway, the agreement is attached, reflecting a yearly amount of 4,800.00, a one time 150.00 setup/training fee, and a term of 3 years, for a total award of 14,550.00.

The certification of funds should be for the first year only, with later years dependent on funds being allocated.

#### LICENSE AGREEMENT

This License Agreement (this "Agreement") is made and entered into effective as of the 29th day of May, 2014 (the "Effective Date"), by and between Golf Compete, Inc., a Delaware corporation doing business as Licensor ("Licensor") and Passaic County, the owner or operator (the "Manager") of Preakness Valley Golf Course located at 209 Totowa Road, Wayne, NJ 07470 (the "Course," also referred to herein as "Licensee").§

#### RECITALS

- A. Licensor has developed the Licensed Technology (as defined below) that can be integrated with the point of sale system at the Course that (i) manages tees times on the Course, (ii) manages sales and inventory at the golf course, (iii) allows for online booking of tee times and payment of greens fees via Approved Locations (as defined below) and (iv) markets and advertises the Course through the Approved Locations.
- B. Licensee wishes to license from Licensor, and Licensor wishes to grant to Licensee, a license for Licensee to use such Licensed Technology subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and Manager confirms to Licensor that Manager is authorized to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the Course.

#### **AGREEMENT**

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and upon the terms and conditions set forth below, the parties hereto agree as follows:

#### 1. **DEFINITIONS.**

"Approved Locations" means http://www.[insert golf course website here] and Licensor's website and mobile applications.

"Improvement" means any improvement made by either of the parties hereto, bug fixes, modification, enhancement or any other derivative work of the Licensed Technology created after the Effective Date.

"Licensee's Business" means Licensee's operation and management of the Course.

"Licensed Technology" means the Software and the Materials.

"Materials" means any instructions, manuals or other documentation and materials, including, without limitation, source code for the Software and related comments, white papers, error reports and help files, related to the development, installation, maintenance or use of the Software existing as of the Effective Date.

"Software" means Licensor's proprietary software product, including both source code and executable format, in the version that exists as of the Effective Date that is designed to offer one retail product at a time via a web interface which displays the next product in the database

queue upon the trigger of a definable event. The term "Software" also includes Improvements and custom modifications to the Materials.

#### 2. LICENSE.

- **2.1** License Grant. Licensor hereby grants to Licensee a non-exclusive, year-to-year, nontransferable, worldwide license to use the Licensed Technology.
- 2.2 Approved Locations. Licensee shall use the Licensed Technology only at the Approved Locations. Licensee may temporarily transfer the Licensed Technology to a different website for testing purposes but in no case for more than twenty-four (24) hours unless Licensee provides Licensor advance notice, in writing, identifying the location of the test site. Licensee acknowledges and agrees that it will purchase an additional license from Licensor if Licensee desires to use the Licensed Technology for commercial purposes on a different site. Any additional licenses required by Licensee will be entered into on terms and conditions negotiated and specified in a separate license agreement between Licensor and Licensee.
- 2.3 Restrictions on Use. Licensee agrees to use the Licensed Technology only for Licensee's Business. Licensee shall not (a) permit any parent, subsidiaries, affiliated entities or third parties to use or have access to the Licensed Technology, (b) process or permit to be processed the data of any other party captured through any site other than the Approved Locations, (c) permit any other party to create any data connections to the Software to use such data for the display, offer, or sale of any retail goods, except that Licensee shall be permitted to push data to third parties whose services are used to facilitate Licensee's Business, which services may include, but are not limited to, merchant processing, product shipping, web analytics, state sales tax reporting or the like or (d) permit, give, or authorize any other party to possess the Licensed Technology source code or executable code, except that Licensee, its employees, and its software programming contractors are permitted to possess, view, and modify the Licensed Technology source code to debug or create Improvements to the Licensed Technology.

#### 3. PROPRIETARY RIGHTS.

- 3.1 Licensor. Licensee acknowledges and agrees that as between Licensee and Licensor, except for the license granted under this Agreement, Licensor retains all right, title and interest in and to the Licensed Technology and any Improvement created by or for Licensor, including any Improvements created by Licensee after the Effective Date, and all copyright, trade secret, trademark, patent and other intellectual property rights therein.
- 3.2 General. Each party hereto hereby reserves all intellectual property rights not expressly granted hereunder. Except as expressly provided otherwise herein, this Agreement will not be construed to assign or transfer from either party hereto to the other party any intellectual property rights developed or acquired after the Effective Date.
- 4. TECHNICAL TRANSFER. Within three (3) days after the Effective Date, Licensor shall deliver to Licensee one (1) copy of the Licensed Technology in the format requested by Licensee.

5. LICENSE FEE (TEE SHEET, POS, ONLINE BOOKING, MARKETING). In consideration of the license granted in Section 2.1, Licensee shall pay Licensor an annual license fee of Four Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$4,800.00) ("License Fee"), which shall be due and payable each year on the anniversary of the Effective Date. A One-Time setup and training fee of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) will be due on the Effective Date. The License Fee payable under this Section 5 is exclusive of, and Licensee shall pay and hold Licensor harmless from, any local, state, federal or foreign sales, use, value-added, excise, customs, export, import or similar taxes or duties that may be imposed by any jurisdiction (other than taxes on the net income of Licensor).

#### 6. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION.

- 6.1 Obligations. The parties hereto acknowledge and agree that proprietary or nonpublic information disclosed by one party (the "Disclosing Party") to the other party (the "Receiving Party"), directly or indirectly, which information is marked as "proprietary" or "confidential" or, if disclosed orally, is designated as confidential or proprietary at the time of disclosure and is summarized in writing within thirty (30) days of disclosure, constitutes the confidential and proprietary information ("Confidential Information") of the Disclosing Party. The Receiving Party shall retain in confidence and not disclose to any third party any Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party without the Disclosing Party's express written consent, and the Receiving Party shall not use such Confidential Information except to exercise the rights and perform its obligations under this Agreement. Without limiting the foregoing, each party shall use at least the same procedures and degree of care which it uses to protect its own Confidential Information of like importance, and in no event less than reasonable care.
- **6.2** Exceptions. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Confidential Information will not include information to the extent that, in each case, such information, as demonstrated by written documentation:
- (a) was already known by the Receiving Party, to the extent such information was so known by the Receiving Party without an obligation of confidentiality, at the time of disclosure hereunder:
- (b) was generally available to the public or otherwise part of the public domain at the time of its disclosure to the Receiving Party hereunder;
- (c) became generally available to the public or otherwise part of the public domain after its disclosure and other than through any act or omission of the Receiving Party in breach of this Agreement; or
- (d) was subsequently lawfully disclosed to the Receiving Party after the Effective Date by a person other than a party or developed by the Receiving Party without reference to any information or materials disclosed by the Disclosing Party.
- 6.3 Required Disclosure. Nothing in this Agreement shall prohibit either party from disclosing Confidential Information of the other party if legally required to do so by judicial or governmental order or by deposition, interrogatory, request for documents, subpoena, civil investigative demand or similar process in a judicial or governmental proceeding ("Required")

**Disclosure**"); provided that the disclosing party shall (a) give the other party prompt written notice of such Required Disclosure prior to disclosure, (b) cooperate with the other party in the event that it elects to contest such disclosure or seek a protective order with respect thereto and (c) in any event only disclose the exact Confidential Information, or portion thereof, specifically requested by the Required Disclosure.

- 6.4 No Licenses or Warranties for Confidential Information. All Confidential Information shall remain the property of the respective Disclosing Party. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, no license under any intellectual property right is granted or implied by the conveying of Confidential Information to Receiving Party. None of the Confidential Information which may be disclosed by Disclosing Party shall constitute any representation, warranty, assurance, guarantee, or inducement by Disclosing Party of any kind and, in particular, with respect to the non-infringement of any intellectual property rights, or other rights of third persons or of Disclosing Party.
- Injunctive Relief. In the event of breach of this Section 6, the non-breaching party may have no adequate remedy at law and will be entitled to seek immediate injunctive and other equitable relief, without the necessity of showing actual money damages.

#### 7. COVENANTS OF THE PARTIES.

- 7.1 The parties hereto covenant and agree with respect to the following matters during the term of this Agreement:
- No Restrictions on Other Activities. Except as otherwise specifically (a) provided herein, neither party hereto is restricted from engaging into relationships with other clients or customers or from generating revenue from advertising on its website or mobile applications and, except as specifically provided herein, all revenues generated by each party will be retained by such party.
- <u>Indemnification</u>. Manager agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Licensor and its affiliates, officers, directors, agents and employees, from and against any claims, lawsuits, investigations, penalties, damages, losses or expenses arising out of or relating to the use by golfers of the Software, it being understood that the Manager is to bear all risks associated with Course conditions and risks associated with golfers playing the Course.
- Manager will provide Licensor with live access to the Course's tee sheet, (c) so that users of Licensor's website and/or mobile applications can view available tee times at the Course by accessing such website and/or mobile applications.
- 7.2 From Licensor. Licensor makes the following representations and warranties to Licensee, each of which is true and correct as of the Effective Date and shall continue to be true and correct at all times during the term of this Agreement (as set forth in Section 9.1):
- No Conflicting Agreements. Licensor is not currently obligated nor will it assume any future obligation under any contract (including without limitation any license,

Introduced on: Adopted on: Official Resolution#: R20140448 covenant or commitment of any nature) or other agreement, instrument or arrangement that could conflict with its material obligations under this Agreement.

- Right to License. Licensor owns all right, title and interest in and to the (b) Licensed Technology. Licensor has the full right to grant to Licensee the license granted under this Agreement, and Licensee's right to exercise such license will be unrestricted (except by the terms of the license). The Licensed Technology provided to Licensee under this Agreement is the most current version of the Licensed Technology and is comprehensive of all available materials related to the Software.
- No Infringement. The Licensed Technology does not and will not infringe or violate any copyright, trade secret, patent, trademark or other proprietary right of any third party. There are no liens, encumbrances or claims pending or threatened against Licensor or, to Licensor's knowledge, anyone else, that relate to the Licensed Technology.
- 7.3 Warranty Disclaimer. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED OTHERWISE IN THIS AGREEMENT, LICENSOR DOES NOT MAKE ANY OTHER WARRANTIES WHATSOEVER, EITHER EXPRESS, IMPLIED, STATUTORY OR OTHERWISE, WITH RESPECT TO THE LICENSED TECHNOLOGY, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION. THE IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. ALL SUCH WARRANTIES ARE HEREBY EXPRESSLY DISCLAIMED.

#### 8. LEGAL RIGHTS.

- Limitation on Liability. Licensor shall not be liable to Licensee for indirect. special, incidental, exemplary or consequential damages (including, without limitation, lost profits) related to this Agreement or resulting from Licensee's use or inability to use the Licensed Technology, arising from any cause of action whatsoever, including contract, warranty, strict liability or negligence, even if Licensor has been notified of the possibility of such damages.
- Limitation on Recovery. Under no circumstances shall the liability of Licensor to Licensee, under this Agreement, exceed the amounts paid by Licensee to Licensor under this Agreement,
- 8.3 Indemnification. Licensor shall indemnify and hold harmless Licensee from and against any claims, including reasonable legal fees and expenses, based upon infringement of any United States copyright or patent by the Licensed Technology. Licensee agrees to notify Licensor of any such claim promptly in writing and to allow Licensor to control the proceedings. Licensee agrees to cooperate fully with Licensor during such proceedings. Licensor shall defend and settle at its sole expense all proceedings arising out of the foregoing. In the event of such infringement, Licensor may replace, in whole or in part, the Licensed Technology with a substantially compatible and functionally equivalent computer program or modify the Licensed Technology to avoid the infringement.

- 8.4 Prosecution of Infringers. During the term of this Agreement, Licensor and Licensee shall give each other written notice of any acts of infringement related to the Licensed Technology of which Licensor or Licensee has knowledge.
- 8.5 Sole Remedy. Licensor's performance under this Section 8 shall be Licensee's sole and exclusive remedy in the event of infringement or misappropriation of any copyright, patent, trademark, trade secret or any other intellectual property rights of any third party by the Licensed Technology.

#### 9. TERM AND TERMINATION.

- 9.1 Term. This Agreement will be effective as of the Effective Date and will continue in full force and effect for a term of three (3) years ("Expiration Date"). Unless Licensee provides written notice of termination to Licensor at least sixty (60) days prior to the Expiration Date, this Agreement will automatically renew for an additional one (1) year term and will continue in full force and effect unless and until this Agreement is otherwise terminated as provided in Section 9.2 below. Licensee's obligation to pay the annual Licensee Fee becomes absolute fifty-nine (59) days prior to the then current Expiration Date.
- 9.2 Termination. Each party hereto shall have the right to terminate this Agreement and the license granted herein upon the occurrence the following events:
- (a) In the event the other party hereto violates any material provision of this Agreement;
- (ii) becomes subject to any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding under Federal or state statute, (iii) becomes insolvent or subject to direct control by a trustee, receiver or similar authority, or (iv) has wound up or liquidated, voluntarily or otherwise (together with 9.2(a), each an "Event of Default"); or
- (c) In the event that Licensor determines that Licensor cannot continue to provide the Licensed Technology to Licensee for any reason at any time during this Agreement, Licensor may terminate this Agreement by providing at least four (4) weeks' written notice to Licensee.
- 9.3 Notice and Opportunity to Cure. Upon the occurrence of an Event of Default, the non-defaulting party shall deliver to the defaulting party a Notice of Intent to Terminate that identifies in reasonable detail the Event of Default. If the Event of Default remains uncured for thirty (30) days, the non-defaulting party may terminate this Agreement and the license granted herein by delivering to the defaulting party a Notice of Termination that identifies the effective date of the termination, which date shall not be less than thirty (30) days after the date of delivery of the Notice of Intent to Terminate.
- 9.4 Proration and Refunds. Upon the occurrence of the event indicated in Section 9.2(c) or upon any Event of Default caused by Licensor, Licensor shall refund to Licensee an amount equal to the Licensee Fee paid for the then current term divided by 365 days, multiplied

by the number of days remaining in the then current term as of the license termination date. No refund shall be issued to Licensee for any Event of Default caused by Licensee.

9.5 Procedure. Within ten (10) days after termination of the license, Licensec shall return to Licensor, at Licensee's sole expense, the Licensed Technology and all copies thereof, delete or destroy all other copies of the Licensed Technology, and deliver to Licensor a certification, in writing signed by an officer of Licensee, that the Licensed Technology has been returned, all copies deleted or destroyed, and its use discontinued.

#### 10. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

10.1 Notices. Any notice to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and may be effected by personal delivery or by e-mail or facsimile that provides confirmation of delivery, or by next day delivery through Federal Express or other reputable, overnight courier service, in each case delivered or addressed as set forth below, or to such other address or number as to which a party may provide notice hereunder:

- 10.2 No Assignment. Neither this Agreement, nor any rights under this Agreement, may be assigned or otherwise transferred by either party, in whole or in part, whether voluntary, or by operation of law, without the prior written consent of the other party; however, Licensor may assign, without such consent, all its rights and obligations under this Agreement to a wholly-owned subsidiary, or to an entity that succeeds to substantially all of the business or assets of Licensor through merger, acquisition or similar transaction. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement will be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns.
- 10.3 Independent Contractors. In performing this Agreement, each of the parties will operate as, and have the status of, an independent contractor. This Agreement does not create any agency, employment, partnership, joint venture, franchise or other similar or special relationship between the parties. Neither party will have the right or authority to assume or create any obligations or to make any representations, warranties or commitments on behalf of the other party or its affiliates, whether express or implied, or to bind the other party or its affiliates in any respect whatsoever.
- 10.4 Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under, and the legal relations between the parties hereto shall be determined in accordance with, the laws of the State of Utah, without giving effect to such state's conflicts of law principles. The parties hereto hereby submit to the personal jurisdiction of, and agree that any legal proceeding with

respect to or arising under this Agreement shall only be brought in federal and state courts located in Salt Lake City, Utah as the case may be.

- Severability. If any provision of this Agreement or portion thereof is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction, or declared under any law, rule or regulation of any government having jurisdiction over the parties hereto, to be invalid, illegal or otherwise unenforceable, then such provision will, to the extent permitted by the court or government not be voided but will instead be construed to give effect to its intent to the maximum extent permissible under applicable law, and the remainder of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect according to its terms.
- Entire Agreement; Modification; Waiver. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties concerning its subject matter and supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous, written or oral negotiations, correspondence, understandings and agreements, between the parties respecting the subject matter of this Agreement. No supplement, modification or amendment to this Agreement shall be binding unless evidenced by a writing signed by the party against whom it is sought to be enforced. No waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed, or shall constitute, a waiver of any other provision, whether or not similar, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver. No waiver shall be binding unless executed in writing by the party making the waiver.
- Execution; Counterparts. This Agreement shall not be binding in whole or in 10.7 part upon the parties unless and until duly executed by or on behalf of both parties hereto, in which event this Agreement shall be effective as of the Effective Date. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original instrument enforceable in accordance with its terms and all of which shall constitute but one and the same agreement of the parties.

The preparation of a jail population study which assess and identify opportunities to improve criminal justice system efficiency and effectiveness and recommend practical and quantifiable strategies to reduce unnecessary detention while maintaining public safety and the integrity of the judicial process.

This is to request an award of a contract without the receipt of formal bids as an Extraordinary Unspecifiable Service [N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(1)(a)(ii) and N.J.A.C 5:34-2.3(b)] I do hereby certify to the following:

- The consultant (Luminosity, Inc.) will prepare a population management study regarding
  the Passaic County Jail, which will include extensive consultation with the staff of the
  Jail, as well as efforts to enlist the cooperation of various other participants, including
  but not necessarily limited to representatives of the court system, the County
  Prosecutor and Public Defender.
- 2. The contemplated population management study will be undertaken in accordance with a settlement previously reached between the County of Passaic (and related defendants) and counsel for a class of plaintiffs in litigation entitled Colon, et als v. County of Passaic et als., venued in the United Stated District Court for the District of New Jersey. Pursuant to the terms of that settlement (as approved by the Hon. Dennis M. Cavanaugh, U.S.D.J.), the County is required to commission such a study "if the average monthly population of the [jail] exceeds one thousand and twenty-two (1022) inmates for four (4) or more months out every six (6) months (on a rolling basis).

- 3. The services are of such a specialized and qualitative nature that the performance of the services cannot reasonably be described by written specifications because the complexity of the various factors contributing to the jail population, and the necessity that the consultant possess a broad range of knowledge and sophistication in working with multiple government entities within the State of New Jersey and balancing often diverging demands.
- 4. In identifying an appropriate vendor to perform the services enumerated above, consultation was had with representatives of other counties in the State of New Jersey that had commissioned similar studies in the past. Accordingly, no other quotes were solicited or submitted.

#### INTRODUCTION

#### Bockground

The Corrections Services Division of the Passaic County Sheriff's Office provides detention and other correctional services for Passaic County inmates who are awaiting trial in Municipal or Superior Court, pending community supervision violations, county sentenced, state sentenced, and those awaiting transfer to other facilities. The jail was the target of a class-action lawsuit in 2008 stemming from overcrowding (population counts of over 1700 with an authorized capacity of 1283 beds) and complaints regarding living conditions and treatment of inmates. The lawsuit was settled in 2012 and the jail abides by a federal consent decree which covers numerous aspects of the jail's operation including measures designed to limit the size of the jail's population, such as restrictions on accepting inmates from other jurisdictions. A key component of the settlement is the production of a population management study if the jail's average daily population exceeds 1,022 inmates for a set period of time. Pursuant to that agreement, Passaic County Corrections seeks an assessment of the jail population and local criminal justice system with an emphasis on the impact on the jail population. The purpose of the assessment is to identify potential areas of improvement in efficiency and/or effectiveness in system operations, case processing, and alternatives to incarceration that may reduce the jail population.

#### Gont

The primary goal of the assessment is to identify opportunities to improve criminal justice system efficiency and effectiveness and recommend practical and quantifiable strategies to reduce unnecessary detention while maintaining public safety and the integrity of the judicial process.

#### Methodology

A systemic analysis approach will be used to identify the factors contributing to the fail population and strategies to reduce and manage the population in the future. This approach requires an indepth examination of those criminal justice system dynamics that contribute to excessive numbers of admissions to the fail or unnecessarily long lengths of stay – the two factors that determine a fail's population. This type of analysis will include an examination of the relevant practices of all key stakeholder agencies, including law enforcement, prosecutor, public defender, courts, alternatives to detention and diversion programs, the state prison system, post-conviction supervision including probation and parole, and the fail itself. Each of these entities, by their policies and practices, contribute to the flow of cases through the criminal justice system – a process that can usually be made more efficient. At the same time, this approach will be used to identify opportunities to improve case processing efficiency, thereby reducing average length of stay, and patterns of overuse of the jail for defendants and offenders who could be supervised or sanctioned using methods that would be more effective and efficient than confinement in jail.

The systemic analysis approach to the current assessment will include three primary components: preparation; extensive jail data analysis; and justice system stakeholder interviews.
