



We are currently recruiting candidates to participate in the Program projected to start on Saturday, May 10th at 10 A.M. As previously stated, the Program targets 64 youth participants providing training and on course experience to assist them to improve their golf skills and knowledge of the game Hank loved to play.

The program will consist of 10 training sessions in total, 7 consecutive Saturdays from the May 10th start. The on course opportunities begin the first week of July at which time participants will receive 2 nine hole rounds of golf per week through August sponsored by the Program. Every attempt will be made to accompany the participants with an adult golfer to teach etiquette on the course which we feel is as important as their golf skills. To finish the clinic schedule we will host one mid July, a second mid August and then two closeout clinics in September.

Our intent is to divide the 64 participants into 4 groups of 16 players. There will be four one hour clinics per clinic-day taught by 4 certified teaching professionals. That brings our ratio down to a very desirable 4:1 player to professional. As previously projected the overall budget breaks down as follows:

We have reviewed the grant application submitted to New Jersey Historic Trust and feel confident that we can provide you with the necessary professional services to prepare National Register Nominations for these two important historic buildings.

Statement of Purpose

Based on Dan Saunders October 17th 2012 letter providing a Certificate of Eligibility, both these buildings are important under Criterion C for several reasons: 1) they embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, and method of construction; 2) they represent the work of two master architects, Samuel Burrage Reed for the Passaic County Court House and Fred Wesley Wentworth, Architect for the United States Custom House and Post Office also known as the Passaic County Court House Annex; 3) the buildings possess high artistic value and have significant individual architectural distinction.

Historic Building Architects, LLC Qualifications

Historic Building Architects, LLC (HBA) have for many years worked with architectural historians to prepare National Register Nominations. 

The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be

obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the

payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication

thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL

IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC, NEW

APPROPRIATING \$29,461,708 THEREFOR

AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$9,550,000 BONDS OR NOTES

OF THE COUNTY TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE

COUNTY OF PASSAIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof

affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond

ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the County of Passaic,

New Jersey (the "County") as general improvements. For the several improvements or

purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of

money therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such

sums amounting in the aggregate to \$29,461,708, including \$19,411,708 in grants and

Open Space Trust Fund Contributions (as detailed in Section 3 hereof, the "Grants and

Funds") and further including the aggregate sum of \$500,000 as the several down

payments for the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. The down

payments have been made available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital

improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the several improvements or purposes

not covered by application of the several down payments referred to in Section 1 and the

Grants and Funds, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal

amount of \$9,550,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The several improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for which the bonds are to be issued, the estimated cost of each improvement and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the down payment for each purpose.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Director of Finance; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the County Director of Finance. The County Director of Finance shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the County Director of Finance's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The County Director of Finance is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Director of Finance is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when

any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is

made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the

maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of

the purchaser.

The County hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a Section 5.

temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the

County is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the

extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein

are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or

temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared,

recited and stated:

The improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond (a)

ordinance are not current expenses. They are all improvements or purposes that the

County may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof

has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective (b)

amounts of obligations authorized for each purpose and the reasonable life thereof within

the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 22.45 years.

The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has (c)

been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate

thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government

Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such

statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in the Local Bond Law is

increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by

\$9,550,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations

prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$4,500,000 for items of expense listed

in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated

herein for the purposes or improvements.

Section 7. The County hereby declares the intent of the County to issue bonds

or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance

and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes or

improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a

declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations.

Any grant moneys received for the purposes or improvements Section 8.

described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the

improvements or, if other than the Grants and Funds referred to in Section 1, to payment

of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations

authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so

used.

Section 9. The County Director of Finance is hereby authorized to prepare and

to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed

in connection with the sale of obligations of the County and to execute such disclosure

document on behalf of the County. The County Director of Finance is further authorized to

enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of

the County pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the

ARule@) for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the County and

to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or

interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a

nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the

event that the County fails to comply with its undertaking, the County shall not be liable for

any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the

undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the County are hereby pledged to the

punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this

bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and

the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property

within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without

limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication

thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
