THIS RESTRICTED GRANT AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is entered into as of the day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2021, by and between Health Coaltion of Passaic County, Inc. (the "Grantor"), and [INSERT NAME] (the "Grantee"). The Grantor and the Grantee may be individually referred to herein as a "Party," and collectively as the "Parties".

### Background

The Grantor is a New Jersey nonprofit corporation organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes. The Grantee is an organization that is exempt from U.S. federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and described in Code Sections 501(c)(3) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi).

The Grantee is also a New Jersey nonprofit corporation organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes. The Grantee is an organization that is exempt from U.S. federal income tax under Code Section 501(a) and described in Code Sections 501(c)(3) and 509(a)(1). [Alternative: The Grantee is a for-profit entity seeking to assist the Granter with its COVID-19 relief efforts.]

The Grantor is the recipient of a grant from the State of New Jersey Department of Human Services (the "Grant"). The Grantor desires to use the Grant to make a sub-grant to the Grantee (the "Sub-Grant"). The Grantee desires to accept the Sub-Grant pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and agrees to use the Sub-Grant for the restricted charitable purposes set forth on Exhibit A hereof (the "Restricted Charitable Purposes").

#### Agreement

NOW, THEREFORE, intending to be legally bound, in consideration of the mutual agreements and covenants contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, it is mutually agreed by and among the Parties, as follows:

- 1. <u>Incorporation</u>. The "Background" section set forth above is incorporated herein by reference.

- (c) The Grantee shall hold the Sub-Grant outright and free of trust, separate and apart from the Grantee's operating account and in a separate "account" or "sub-fund." No part of the Sub-Grant shall be used to generate investment income.
- (d) The Grantee shall not be entitled to any management fee associated with the Sub-Grant.

### Budget, Receipts and Return of Funds.

- (a) The Restricted Charitable Purposes shall be executed by the Grantee in accordance with the budget attached hereto as <u>Exhibit C</u>. The Grantor shall approve, in writing, (i) any budgeted expenses that exceed ten percent (10%) of their budgeted amount and (ii) any non-budgeted expenses.
- (b) To the extent Grantee intends to use all or any portion of the Sub-Grant to reimburse itself for any budgeted expenses already incurred as of the date of this Agreement, the Grantee shall provide copies of all applicable receipts to the Grantor within ten (10) days of the date of this Agreement.
- (c) Any portion of the Sub-Grant not used to accomplish the Restricted Charitable Purposes by the Deadline shall be returned to the Grantee within thirty (30) days after the Deadline.
- 5. <u>Cy Pres.</u> If the Grantor determines that the Restricted Charitable Purposes have become unlawful, impracticable or wasteful, or if the U.S. Department of the Treasury, the State of New Jersey (or any agency thereof), the Attorney General or a court with jurisdiction over the Grantor determines that the Restricted Charitable Purposes have become unlawful, impracticable or wasteful, then the Grantee shall no longer be entitled to use, withdraw, distribute and/or pledge any remaining portion of the Sub-Grant for the Restricted Charitable Purposes; instead, the Grantee shall return such remaining portion of the Sub-Grant to the Grantor within thirty (30) days of receipt of notice from the Grantor requesting a return of funds pursuant to this Section 5.

### Reports and Deliverables.

(a) The Grantee shall submit timely written reports and any required deliverables to the Grantor in accordance with the reporting schedule set forth on Exhibit D hereof (each, a "Report"). Reports shall be submitted in a format set forth or previously approved by the Grantor and shall include copies of any receipts documenting amounts spent. The Grantee acknowledges

that its failure to submit timely and complete reports to the Grantor may adversely affect the Grantee's receipt of the Sub-Grant.

- (b) If the Grantee fails to deliver a Report to the Grantor in proper form by the due date, the Grantor shall (i) take all reasonable and appropriate steps to determine whether the Sub-Grant was used for the Restricted Charitable Purposes (an "Investigation"), and (ii) withhold any further distributions to the Grantee until the Grantor receives all outstanding Reports.
- (c) If, upon review of a Report or the findings of an Investigation, the Grantor finds that the Grantee has used the Sub-Grant for purposes other than the Restricted Charitable Purposes, the Grantor shall (i) take all reasonable and appropriate steps either to recover the Sub-Grant or to ensure that the Sub-Grant is restored, redirected and/or dedicated to furthering the Restricted Charitable Purposes, and (ii) withhold any further distributions to the Grantee until the Grantor receives the Grantee's assurance that future diversions will not occur and that the Grantee will take whatever precautions as may be necessary to prevent further diversions from occurring.
- (d) The Grantor shall determine, in its sole discretion, whether a Report has complied with the requirements imposed by this Section 6 and/or whether a Report or an Investigation reflects that the Sub-Grant has not been utilized properly to further the Restricted Charitable Purposes (each, a "Default"). The Grantee must cure any Default within thirty (30) days of such Default, to the satisfaction of the Grantor. A Default caused by the Grantee's failure to deliver a Report is cured when the Grantee delivers the missing Report to the Grantor. A Default caused by the Grantee using the Sub-Grant for improper purposes is cured when the Grantee refunds the misused funds to the Grantor (or, if the Grantor desires, to the restricted fund established by the Grantee to hold the Sub-Grant) and provides written assurances that (i) future diversions will not occur and (ii) the Grantee will take whatever precautions as may be necessary to prevent further diversions from occurring. The Grantor, in its sole discretion, shall determine whether a particular Default has been cured.
- 7. Record Retention. To assist the Grantor in complying with applicable state and federal laws, the Grantee agrees to retain, for a period of at least seven (7) years, all documentation related to the Sub-Grant. The Grantee acknowledges that such documentation is subject to audit by state and federal agencies.
- 8. Applicable Laws. The Grantee acknowledges that the Sub-Grant is governed by certain state and federal laws applicable to federal grants, state grants and COVID-19 relief efforts. The Grantee agrees to abide by such laws (including, but not limited to, State of New Jersey Department of the Treasury Circular 07-05-OMB and "Coronavirus Relief Fund Program Guidance", published at 86 F.R. 4182-4194) to the extent such laws are applicable to the Grantee's use of the Sub-Grant (collectively, the "Grant Laws").
- 9. <u>Use of Name or Logo</u>. Each Party shall be permitted to use the name or logo (as applicable) of the other Party in connection with any press release pertaining to the Sub-Grant, provided that the Party whose name or logo is being used approves such use in writing prior to publication, with such approval not unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed.
- 10. <u>Subgrants and Subcontractors</u>. The Grantee may further sub-grant all or any portion of the Sub-Grant or hire one or more subcontractors to execute the Restricted Charitable Purposes

without prior notice to, or consent from, the Grantor; provided, however, that the Grantee shall be required to ensure that any subgrantee or subcontractor acts in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The Grantee shall assume all liability for any and all subgrantees and subcontractors and shall remain primarily liable for the duties and obligations arising under this Agreement.

- 11. Release. The Grantee hereby absolutely and irrevocably releases, remises, quitclaims and forever discharges the Grantor, and its successors and assigns, of and from any and all actions, reckonings, liabilities, claims and demands arising out of, caused by or relating in any way to (i) the Grantee's use of the Sub-Grant, (ii) the role of any subgrantee or subcontractor in fulfilling the Restricted Charitable Purposes and (iii) any noncompliance on the part of the Grantee with respect to the Grant Laws to the extent such noncompliance is the result of gross negligence or willful misconduct on the part of the Grantee or its directors, officers, employees and agents.
- 12. <u>Indemnification</u>. The Grantee hereby agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Grantor, and its successors and assigns, against all liability, loss or expense (including, but not limited to, taxes, costs and counsel fees) arising out of, caused by or relating in any way to (i) the Grantee's use of the Sub-Grant, (ii) the role of any subgrantee or subcontractor in fulfilling the Restricted Charitable Purposes or (iii) any noncompliance on the part of the Grantee with respect to the Grant Laws to the extent such noncompliance is the result of gross negligence or willful misconduct on the part of the Grantee or its directors, officers, employees and agents.
- 13. <u>Assignment</u>. Except as otherwise provided herein, this Agreement shall not be assigned by any Party without the written consent of the other Party.
- 14. <u>Integration; Amendments.</u> This Agreement (with exhibits) contains the Parties' entire agreement regarding the Sub-Grant and the use of the Sub-Grant and supersedes any prior agreement of the Parties with respect to same. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all Parties.
- 15. Persons Bound and Benefited. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties and their respective successors and, to the extent assignment is permitted hereunder, their respective assigns.
- 16. <u>Severability</u>. If any one or more of the covenants, agreements, provisions or terms of this Agreement shall be held invalid for any reason whatsoever, then such covenants, agreements, provisions or terms shall be deemed severable from the remaining covenants, agreements, provisions or terms of this Agreement and shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of the other provisions of this Agreement.
- 17. Governing Law; Jurisdiction. This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of New Jersey without regard to principles of conflict of laws. Each Party hereby consents to the exclusive jurisdiction of the state and federal courts located in the State of New Jersey and irrevocably agrees that all actions or proceedings relating to this Agreement shall be litigated in such courts and each Party waives any objection which it may have based on lack of personal jurisdiction, improper venue or forum non conveniens to the conduct of any proceeding in any such court and waives personal service of any and all process upon them.

- 18. Notices. Any notice under this Agreement must be in writing and shall be deemed delivered and effective: (a) five (5) business days after being mailed by certified mail or (b) one (1) business day after delivery by one-day courier or email (provided to failure to deliver notice occurred). The address for purposes of this provision shall be as set forth on the signature page below, or at such other address as may be provided by either Party to the other, in writing, from time to time.
- 19. <u>Captions</u>. The captions of the Sections in this Agreement are for the convenience of the Parties and are not to be used to interpret this Agreement or any part thereof.
- 20. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original and all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 21. <u>Electronic Signatures</u>. For the purposes of this Agreement, a DocuSign, facsimile or e-mail copy containing a signature shall be deemed to contain an original signature.

- Facility's COVID-19 vaccination services must be conducted in compliance with CDC's Guidance for Immunization Services During the COVID-19 Pandemic for safe delivery of vaccines.<sup>2</sup>







The County undertook a Partial Fee Taking by way of Deed across the frontage less than two years ago in 2019 for the above-referenced application. This is a deed in fee, and not an easement. In its original review letter on our application, the County requested additional ROW consistent with the Master Plan for a future road improvement plan along Hamburg Tumpike and Alps Road. We conducted a zoom meeting with Staff afterwards in May and presented our plans in conjunction with the County's future road improvement plans which demonstrated that the existing taking from 2019 provides sufficient room for the County's future road improvement without the need for additional land (as shown on our site plans submitted with this application). We explained at the time that if the County required the additional land, it would impact the ability to utilize the existing front yard parking and would potentially render our project not viable and result in the possible termination of the transaction. We thought we had agreement with the County, subject of course to formal ratification by the County Board at the time. We subsequently presented our plans to the Wayne Planning Board, advised them of our discussions with County Staff regarding this issue, and received site plan approvals based on the plans as presented. Based on email correspondence from your office on August 4, 2021, it was determined that "no additional right-of-way is needed beyond that in the 10-foot Partial Fee Taking".

There is an existing encroachment within the Partial Fee Taking that we are formally requesting be permitted. If so, we will file the Encroachment Application with the County. The encroachment includes the driveway access to the site which is crucial for access since the County road is the only frontage. In addition, there is a partial encroachment of a drive alsle and curb/extended curb. The drive aisle must be within the encroachment to serve the parking along the frontage of the site. Without it, the drive aisle would be of insufficient width causing the need to reduce parking an exacerbate a parking variance with the Township and minimizing the feasibility of the site operations. The curb/extended within the partial fee taking benefits the county since it eliminates the need for the county to propose a retaining wall as part of their improvements. For these reasons, we believe the benefits of the encroachment outweighs the detriments and respectfully request the county to permit the encroachment.

All changes in the scope or the objectives of a project, key project personnel, or the duration of the project must be requested and approved in writing. Grant recipient must also receive approval before transferring substantive project work to new personnel.

#### 2. Use of Grant Funds.

Grant recipients must expend award funds as originally proposed in the grant application or subsequently amended. Grant recipients may transfer funds among allowable categories, provided that the scope or objectives of the grant award are not changed. Grant recipients are required to seek approval for changes that substantially alter the scope of work of the original proposal.

All costs must be incurred within the established grant period. Grant recipients have up to 90 days after the close of the grant period to liquidate all obligations and submit a final report.

#### 3. Payment Schedule

The Grant Recipient will be paid according to the following schedule and upon completion of the requisite conditions. The entire grant award, 100% of the total, will be paid within 30 days of receipt of this signed Grant Agreement. Any funds not expended within the grant period must be return to NICH within 90 days of the close of the grant period.

Failure to abide by the stipulations in all respects of this Grant Agreement will preclude payment of grant funds.

#### 4. Acknowledgment of Support

Recipients of NICH grant funds must acknowledge NICH and National Endowment for the Humanities as funders throughout the grant period in all printed and electronic materials, including advertisements and publicity materials, and whenever written or verbal presentations are made.

#### 5. Termination of Grants

If NJCH determines that the Grant Recipient has failed to comply with the terms and conditions of the grant agreement, NJCH may terminate the grant for cause. A grant may also be terminated by mutual consent of NJCH and the Grant Recipient's request. If your grant is terminated by NJCH:

- a. Grant Recipient will be provided with 30 days written notice of termination and will be consulted about the intended termination by NJCH. This termination will not affect any commitments made prior to the date of termination. If there is disagreement as to when these commitments were made, the judgment of NJCH will prevail.
- b. Grant Recipient must furnish NICH with an itemized accounting of funds spent, owed, and left over in your grant within 60 days of the termination date.
- c. Grant Recipient must return any money that is left over from your grant to NJCH within 30 days of termination of the grant award.

#### 6. Reporting on Grant

The Grant Recipient is required to submit an Interim Report approximately halfway through your grant period and a Final Report within 90 days after the end of the grant period (see Grant Award Information). - Affirmation that the organization did not use grant funds for lobbying, fundraising, the purchase of alcoholic beverages, the purchase, construction, or renovation of land or facilities or other unallowable costs (see 2 CFR 200, Subpart E - Cost Principles).
- Aggregate data summarizing activities, events, and other deliverables funded by the NJCH grant award, including the total number of events and attendance numbers for in-person activities, the total number of events and attendance numbers for virtual activities, the types of events funded (e.g., lecture, exhibit, planning process), and the total number of humanities scholars engaged throughout the grant period.

Failure to provide a final report will disqualify the award recipient from accessing other NJCH programs and services.

In addition to formal reporting requirements, NJCH staff will periodically conduct short and informal check-ins to offer Grant Recipients the opportunity to ask questions, share stories, and seek resources for confronting challenges.

#### 7. Indemnification

As part of the terms of this contract, the Grant Recipient agrees to hold NJCH, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and its employees and agents harmless. The Grant Recipient also agrees to defend and indemnify NJCH, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and its employees and agents against all claims, actions, liability, damage, loss, and expense, including attorney fees, in any matter arising (or alleged to have arisen) from acts or omission by the Grant Recipient and its employees, agents, and sub-contractors in connection with the grant. State or federal agencies that are not permitted to indemnify outside organizations or their employees should attach a statement to that effect as an amendment to the Agreement.

To protect your interests, NICH strongly recommends that you develop written agreements whenever services or goods are to be provided to you by others.

#### 8. Insurance

The Grant Recipient is required to maintain general liability coverage appropriate to the grant-funded project.

#### 9. Grant Products

The Grant Recipient agrees that all intellectual property, whether copyrighted or not, including but not limited to any script(s), production material, and related print, audio, visual, or digital materials produced under this Agreement ("Grant Products"), shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this section and the other terms hereof. The Grant Recipient assumes full responsibility for said conditions and for apprising other funders and project personnel of these terms and conditions.

- a. If the Grant Recipient uses any materials copyrighted by others in connection with the award, the Grant Recipient shall possess the necessary rights required to use such copyrighted materials.
- b. The Grant Recipient may copyright any Grant Products that are developed or acquired in connection with the award. The title to Grant Products developed under this Agreement shall remain solely with the Grant Recipient, unless a transfer of ownership rights is approved in writing by NJCH.
- c. NJCH and NEH hereby reserve, and Grant Recipient hereby grants to NJCH and NEH, a royalty-free, nonexclusive, and irrevocable right to reproduce, publish, or otherwise use for NJCH or NEH purposes any Grant Products created or acquired by the Grant Recipient in accordance with this Agreement. <u>msocom 2</u>
- d. The Grant Recipient agrees to request from any other person owning a copyright on all or any part of the Grant Product a release stating that NJCH and NEH may use or reproduce, without payment, such person's contribution to the Grant Product.

#### 7. Audit Requirements

#### 2. Labor Standards Assurances – Employment of Professional Performers

**WHEREAS**, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County") is a body politic and corporate pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:18-1 and vested with all rights contained therein; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:20-1 the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Passaic (hereafter "Board") is vested with managing the property, finances, and affairs of the County; and

**WHEREAS**, the specifications for the repairs to Passaic County Infrastructure have been prepared and conform with County and industry engineering standards, and the County Engineer is requesting that Purchasing Agent advertise and receive bids for same, in compliance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1, et seq.; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23, et seq. the County shall publish the advertisement for bids in advance of the date fixed for receiving the bids to promote competitive bidding; and

**WHEREAS**, this matter was discussed on September 15, 2021, by the Public Works Committee and is being recommended to the Board for approval.

WHEREAS, the Passaic County Department of Planning and Economic Development is in receipt of a proposed Jurisdictional Agreement relating to the modification of an existing traffic signal at the intersection of Wagaraw Road and Lafayette Avenue at the access point to property located at 204 Wagaraw Road, Block 12, Lot 8, Hawthorne, New Jersey (hereafter the "Property");

WHEREAS, Wagaraw Road and Lafayette Avenue are both County Roads, and County concurrence is required to have improvements installed at the above-referenced location in accordance with plan prepared by Karl A. Pehnke, P.E., Langan Engineering dated December 21, 2020 entitled "Traffic Signal Plan" (hereafter "Traffic Signal Plan"); and

WHEREAS, on September 15, 2020, the Planning Board of the Borough of Hawthorne adopted a Resolution entitled "Resolution of the Planning Board of the Borough of Hawthorne" which approved preliminary and final major site plan approval to permit a mixed use development consisting of three buildings for use as (a) 100 residential market rate rental units, 17 low and moderate income rental units and one Superintendent Unit, (consisting of four stories and a total building area of 34,035 square feet); (b) approximately 16,400 square feet of combined health club/gymnasium and retail space; (c) 123,216 square feet of self storage space; and (d) related site amenities subject to conditions as outlined therein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, 204 Wagaraw Road, LLC (hereafter "The Applicant"), with a business address of 65 Harristown Road, #301, Glen Rock, New Jersey 07652, was granted conditional use approval on August 7, 2020 by the Passaic County Planning Board (hereafter "County Planning Board") under Passaic County File No. SP-20-016 pending certain conditions after reviewing the Applicant's Site Plan dated April 17, 2020, revised July 13, 2020; and



NOW THEREFORE, after due consideration the Planning Board of the Borough of

Hawthorne makes the following findings and conclusions, based upon the evidence presented:

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

I. THE PROPERTY

The Property consists of 8.7 acres located on the South side of Wagaraw Road. The

Property is generally flat and triangular. The Property is entirely within the R-11 Mixed Use

Affordable Housing Zoning District. Portions of the Property are impacted by wetland areas, flood

hazard and riparian zone limits, which are all indicated on Applicant's plans. There is

approximately 654 feet of frontage along Wagaraw Road, a Passaic County road.

ZONING COMPLIANCE 11.

As set forth below, with one modification to the Site Plan and Application (i.e the removal

of livable loft space on the top floor of the residential building), this is a variance free, waiver and

exception free application.

III. WITNESSES

> Gerard Fitamint, P.E. was sworn and accepted as an expert in the field of civil A.

engineering. The Site Plan, prepared by him and his furn describes the 8.7 acre property, It fronts

Wagaraw Road, is generally flat and is triangular in shape. There is "some flood plain" on the

property, and Applicant will need multiple permits from NJDEP to construct in the flood plain.

The proposed site plan provides the following features:

1. adequate on site parking;

2. a compliant streetscape plan;

3. an outdoor patio area for residents;

a mulched pedestrian access path to the Passaic River; 4.

5. a dog walking path;

underground detention; and 6.

7. adequate snow removal/storage on site.

The plan complies with all bulk criteria. As to soil movement, there is a net import of 7,000

cubic yards (or approximately 440 trucks). There is a utility plan which provides for a water main

loop throughout the Property, proper sewer connections, lighting and transformers. There are

significant plantings throughout the Property. The plan is ADA compliant. The internal parking

lot is well designed, safe and allows for emergency vehicle circulation. In order to avoid potential

noise concerns which could emanate from the Kohler's beverage distributor located west of the

Property, the plan provides for the installation and upkeep of a sixteen foot high "plywall" acoustic

barrier. There is sufficient trash and recycling stations located on site.

B. Perry Petrillo, R.A. was sworn and accepted as an expert in the field of architecture.

He and his firm designed the architectural plans for the proposed self storage facility. The structure

is proposed to be located near the westerly property line (near the Kohler facility). Four fleors are

proposed. Each floor has a floor area of 30,804 square feet, for a total floor area of 123,216 square

feet. In all, 946 storage units are proposed (with 41 of those units as "drive up" units). The front

of the building faces inward, namely in an easterly direction: three main wall signs and two

"advisory" signs are proposed.

C. Alan Lothian, P.E. was sworn and accepted as an expert in traffic engineering. The

site is well designed and provides ample and safe circulation for passenger and vehicles, delivery

trucks and emergency apparatus. There are 257 on site parking spaces, meeting the ordinance

requirement.

D. Linda Kreczkowski, R.A. was sworn and accepted as an expert in the field of

architecture. She and her firm designed the architectural plan for the residential building. NOTE:

The most current plan on file with the Board provides for livable loft/mezzanine space in certain

top floor units which would require "d" variance approval from the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

The floor creating the mezzanine space has been withdrawn by Applicant prior to the public

hearing. The other elements and building elevation remain unchanged. The building design

provides for a total of 118 units (17 of which are dedicated to low and moderate income rental

units). Also, a total of five ground floor units are designated as "live/work" units. The exterior of

the building is well designed and provides an acceptable array of different building elements and

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architectural features to break up the mass of the structure and provide an aesthetically pleasing

design.

Certain architectural features on the top floor provide for taller ceiling heights for certain

units. While the Board accepts that these architectural features meet the letter and intent of the

zoning code and Settlement Agreement (Exhibit A-2), the Board specifically disapproves of any

mezzanine and/or loft space in any residential unit within the building. Any such space is contrary

to the letter and intent of the Zoning Code and Settlement Agreement.

No members of the public came forward to express any concerns with respect to E.

the applications, plans or testimony.

IV. **CONCLUSIONS** 

This is a fully conforming major site plan application, meeting the criteria of all relevant

zoning and site plan ordinances as well as the Settlement Agreement, with the proviso that no loft

or mezzanine space shall be permitted in any of the residential units. The plan's configuration

provides for safety and efficiency and meets generally recognized engineering principles. During

the hearing, several conditions (hereinafter "Conditions") upon the Applicant and Application

were imposed and stipulated to by the Applicant. The following is a list of the CONDITIONS:

1. The Applicant must satisfactorily address all of Boswell Engineering and Burgis

Associates' comments.

2. ADA Complaint Design and Construction Certifications must be provided for

pedestrian facilities within the public right-of-way and must be submitted to the Borough.

3. A sign will be provided indicating that the Dog Park is a private facility.

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4. The property owner will be required to properly maintain on-site improvements,

especially the stormwater management system, the mulched access path to the Riverwalk and the

acoustic barrier at the west side of the site.

5. The Applicant will provide water supply calculations along with fire flow

calculations. Hydrant flow tests must also be performed to determine available flow and pressure.

6. Sanitary sewer calculations must be provided to confirm adequate sewer flow. This

includes confirming the condition and capacity of the sewer main downstream from the site.

7. Borough reserves the right to require modifications and changes to lighting for a

period of six (6) months after installation.

8. The Applicant must demonstrate a minimum average UL STC rating of 32 for the

windows of the residential building.

9. In accordance with Item 5a, of the Settlement Agreement, the Developer must file

Deed Notices with respect to the conditions that surround the property. The Deed Notice must be

provided to the Board Attorney for review and approval prior to filing.

10. The transformers for each building will be suitably landscaped in accordance with

the Board Engineer's recommendation.

11. Hydrant location and Fire Zoning Striping Plan will be submitted to the Fire

Department for their review and approval.

12. All on-site gates will be locked in accordance with the Fire Department's

recommendations and they will be provided with proper means of access.

13. The upper area of residential units is not to be converted to mezzanine or loft space

without further application and approval to/from the appropriate land use board. Applicant will

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revise its plans to climinate the internal floor that would have created such space.

The Applicant will provide self closing and locking gates for the trash and recycling 14.

area for the gym/retail building.

Parking spaces are not to be obstructed by piling up of snow during snow removal. 15.

This site plan application has been granted conditional approval pending receipt in an acceptable form of the following:

- The name and address of the applicant and the owner must be noted on the cover sheet.

- 2. The zoning table shall include existing conditions where applicable (i.e. impervious area). Incomplete.
- 3. The applicant shall submit two signed and sealed copies of the referenced survey by Bertin Engineering. Complete.
- 4. The existing Wagaraw Road sidewalk must be replaced with a 5-foot sidewalk. Complete.
- 5. The applicant shall install new curbing along the entire Wagaraw Road frontage, per the County curbing detail (attached), and provide cross-sections every 50 feet. The curbing replacement must be noted on the plans. The plans may include a typical section instead of cross-sections every 50 feet.
- 6. The curb ramps must be designed in accordance with ADA requirements. Curb ramps must also be installed on the north side of Wagaraw Road. The curb ramps must be placed in line with the crosswalks, not diagonally in the direction of the corner. The plans must include curb ramp details, which must satisfy ADA standards. Prior to the release of any bonds associated with the site plan, the applicant must submit a signed and sealed certification from a professional engineer that the curb ramps have been constructed in accordance with the current version of the USDOT "ADA Standards for Transportation

- All crosswalks must be striped continental-style (ladder bars without transverse lines). The crosswalk striping must be parallel to traffic flow.
- 8. A double yellow centerline must be provided at the unsignalized driveway intersection. Complete.
- All striping must be noted as thermoplastic. Complete.
- 10. The applicant must provide larger-scale plans for the Lafayette Avenue and May Street intersections with the site driveways. Incomplete.
- 11. The applicant shall construct a left turn lane into the site at Lafayette Avenue, Eastbound Wagaraw Road has excess pavement width to allow for this. This shall be included on a separate roadway improvement plan that shows all features of the Wagaraw Road roadway, including the existing bicycle fanes. This must include a typical section. A dashed yellow centerline must be provided across the intersection for eastbound Wagaraw Road through-traffic. The roadway improvement plan, which must include a typical section, must still be submitted for review. The striping of the bike lane should end at its current location near Coolidge Place.
- 12. At the unsignalized intersection with May Street, left-out turns must be prohibited due to the proposed level of service (E). As only 6 and 12 cars per hour (AM and PM Peak) make this movement, this will not be a hardship. The turn can be made at the signal. Left turns into the site shall be permitted. The driveway shall be constructed as a concrete turning island physically restricting left-out turns. The island must accommodate a raised sidewalk across the driveway. The applicant must provide appropriate signing at the driveway. The applicant must request the prohibition in writing from the Borough and submit any correspondence to County staff. The left-turn prohibition and Title 39 enforcement must be formally requested from the Borough and adopted prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy. The concrete island at the driveway must have a zero throat width in order to physically restrict left turns. Two additional "NO LEFT TURN" signs (R3-2) are needed for each movement (left-in and left-out) on each side. These additional signs shall he located in the concrete island.
- 13. The applicant must re-time the traffic signal at the intersection of Wagaraw Road and Lincoln Avenue. The northbound left turn lane in the PM peak hour will experience a 25% increase due to this project. The eastbound left turn lane will experience a 12% increase. The re-timing shall be included in the signal agreement requested below. The recommended re-timing of the Wagaraw Road/Lincoln Avenue signal must be included on the site plan OR on the signal plan for Wagaraw Road/Lafayette Avenue that is still to be submitted.
- 14. The applicant must submit a traffic signal plan for the proposed signal modifications at Lafayette Street and Wagaraw Road. Incomplete.

- 15. The applicant must submit a traffic signal jurisdictional agreement for the proposed signal modifications at the intersection of Lafayette Street and Wagaraw Road. Incomplete.

  - a) Lafayette Avenue driveway: The right-in turn is not acceptable, as it encroaches into the exit lane, where cars will be queuing to exit the site. The right-out and left-in turns are not acceptable, as they both encroach onto the curb and the edge of the left lane. The plans must show the SU-40 truck movement for the right-out turn at the signal. The westbound lane configuration has changed, and this turn may now be
  - b) May Street driveway: The left-in is not acceptable, as it encroaches into the exit lane, where cars will be queuing to exit the site.
    - To solve the above issues will require the widening of the driveway opening at the signal. However, the pedestrian crossing there is already proposed to be quite long approximately 45 feet. The safer solution for pedestrians is to prohibit WB-67 trucks from accessing the site. The plans must include signs restricting the maximum size truck that can enter the site to be an SU-40.
- 17. The site plan must show the lane widths for all approaches at the signalized intersection. Complete.
- 18. Drainage structures may be needed along the new curb line. The plans must include a profile along the proposed curb line. A profile along the curb line and gutter flow analysis must be provided in order for the drainage needs to be determined. This cannot be addressed through testimony as stated in the applicant's response letter.
- 19. The applicant must submit copies of any required NJDEP permits. Upon NJDEP approval, the applicant must submit copies of all permits referenced in the submitted Multi-Permit Application.
- 20. The 100-year flood hazard zone should be included on the grading plan. It must be verified that the zone is per the most recent update of FEMA's flood maps. Complete.
- 21. The applicant shall provide an easement for a future riverwalk along the rear of the property. The applicant shall provide copy of any requirements from the Borough to construct or provide an easement for a riverwalk.
- 22. The landscaping plan should incorporate the existing landscaping along the Wagaraw Road frontage, where appropriate. Complete.

- 25. The applicant must submit as-built plans prior to the release of any bonds associated with the application.
- 26. The applicant must provide a Corridor Enhancement Fee payable to Passaic County. Staff will be able to calculate the fee upon receipt of the requested survey by Bertin Engineering. The Corridor Enhancement Fee of \$13,303.00 must be provided payable to Passaic County.

### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A DEVELOPER'S AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC AND ABDELMOEEN DANDIS FOR PROPERTIES AT 199-207 WEST BROADWAY, BLOCK 608, LOTS 10, 11, AND 12 AND ADJOINING BLOCK 608, LOT 13, PATERSON, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Passaic County Department of Planning and Economic Development is in receipt of a proposed Developer's Agreement requiring ABDELMOEEN DANDIS (hereafter "Applicant") to adhere to stipulated conditions related to shared access to the driveway at the site located at 199-207 West Broadway, Block 608, Lots 10, 11, and 12 and adjoining Block 608, Lot 13, Paterson, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, on April 15, 2020, the City of Paterson Planning Board adopted a Resolution granting site plan approval to the Applicant to construct a three story mixed use building/development containing one (1) commercial tenant space, nine (9) two-bedroom apartments and three (3) one-bedroom apartments, identified as Block 608, Lots 10, 11, and 12, more commonly known as 199-207 West Broadway, Paterson, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, West Broadway is a Passaic County roadway and approval of the Applicant's site plan is required from the Passaic County Planning Board (hereafter "Board"); and

WHEREAS, the Board reviewed the Applicant's site plan, dated March 16, 2021, revised June 21, 2021, pursuant to the provisions of the Passaic County Site Plan Resolution (Passaic County File No. SP-20-011) and granted conditional approval on August 19, 2021 pending receipt of Developer's Agreement setting forth certain driveway restrictions which will be recorded with the Passaic County Clerk and run with the land; and

WHEREAS, as part of the conditional approval, the Applicant agreed to install a curb cut and provide driveway access to Block 608, Lot 12 as part of the aforementioned site plan;

**WHEREAS**, the driveway is within ten (10) feet of the side property line with adjoining Block 608, Lot 13, and is non-compliant with the Passaic County Site Plan Resolution standards; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has requested a design waiver from said standards with the understanding and agreement that the proposed site driveway will always provide combined and shared access to Block 608, Lot 12, and Block 608, Lot 13, now and forever, irrespective of any future development on Block 608, Lot 13; and

WHEREAS, both Block 608, Lot 12, and Block 608, Lot 13 are under common ownership by the Applicant; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant agrees to restrict the future installation of any curb cuts along the frontage of Block 608, Lot 13, since the currently proposed driveway along the frontage of Block 608, Lot 12 will also provide future access to Block 608, Lot 13;

WHEREAS, the Board has requested a Developer's Agreement restricting future driveway access to Block 608, Lot 13, to the currently proposed driveway access along the frontage of Block 608, Lot 12; and

WHEREAS, the language included in the Developer's Agreement was previously reviewed and agreed upon by the Planning/Engineering staff and the Planning Board Counsel; and

WHEREAS, this matter was discussed at the September 16, 2021 meeting of the Planning and Economic Development Committee and is being recommended to the Passaic County Board of County Commissioners for approval;

NOW THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Passaic County Board of County Commissioners that the County Commissioner Director and Clerk of the Board be and are hereby authorized to execute the attached Developer's Agreement by and between the County of Passaic and Abdelmoeen Dandis, for property located at 199-207 West Broadway, Block 608, Lots 10, 11, and 12 and adjoining Block 608, Lot 13, Paterson, New Jersey, as set forth above.

#### DEVELOPER'S AGREEMENT

THIS DEVELOPER'S AGREEMENT, entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2021 by and among the County of Passaic (hereinafter referred to as the "County") with an address of 401 Grand Street, Paterson, NJ 07505, and Abdelmoeen Dandis (the "Applicant"), with an address of 116 Liberty Ridge Trail, Totowa, NJ 07512 with respect to the proposed driveway access to Applicant's Property located at 199-207 West Broadway in the City of Paterson, Passaic County, New Jersey ("Property").

WHEREAS, on April 15, 2020, the City of Paterson Planning Board adopted a Resolution granting site plan approval to the Applicant to construct a three story mixed-use building/development containing one (1) commercial tenant space, nine (9) two-bedroom apartments and three (3) one-bedroom apartments, identified as Block 608, Lots 10, 11, and 12 on the Tax Assessment Map of the City of Paterson, more commonly known as 199-207 West Broadway, Paterson, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, West Broadway is a Passaic County roadway and approval of the Applicant's Site Plan is required from the Passaic County Planning Board ("Board"); and

WHEREAS, the Board reviewed the Applicant's Site Plan dated March 16, 2021, revised June 21, 2021, pursuant to the provisions of the Passaic County Site Plan Resolution (Passaic County File Number SP-20-011) and granted conditional approval on August 19, 2021 ("Conditional Approval") pending receipt of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the Conditional Approval, the Applicant agreed to install a curb cut and provide driveway access to Block 608, Lot 12 as part of

WHEREAS, the proposed site driveway is within ten (10) feet of the side

property line with Block 608, Lot 13, and is non-compliant with the Passaic County

Site Plan Resolution standards; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has requested a design waiver from the standards of

the Passaic County Site Plan Resolution, which require that all driveways on Passaic

County roadways have a minimum ten (10) foot offset from any side property lines,

with the understanding and agreement that the proposed site driveway will always

provide combined and shared access to Block 608, Lot 12, and Block 608, Lot 13;

WHEREAS, the proposed sited driveway will now and forever provide for shared

access to Block 608, Lots 12 and 13, irrespective of future development on Block 608,

Lot 13; and

WHEREAS, both Block 608, Lot 12 and Block 608, Lot 13 are under common

ownership; and

WHEREAS, the Conditional Approval granted by the Board requires the

Applicant enter into an agreement with the County of Passaic restricting the future

installation of any curb cuts along the frontage of Block 608, Lot 13, on the presumption

that the currently proposed driveway along the frontage of Block 608, Lot 12 will also

provide future access to Block 608, Lot 13;

WHEREAS, all agreements related to the shared access of the proposed site

driveway will be recorded with the Passaic County Clerk and run with the land; and

WHEREAS, to ensure that Applicant complies with the terms of the

previously granted site plan approval, the Board will require Applicant to enter into

this Agreement to adhere to the previously stipulated conditions related to the

driveway operations; and

#### NOW, THEREFORE, the County and the Applicant agree as follows:

- 1. Future driveway access to Block 608, Lot 13 shall be restricted to the currently proposed driveway access along the frontage of Block 608, Lot 12.
- 2. Violations. Applicant understands and agrees in the event it is in violation, after fifteen (15) days written notice and opportunity to cure, of any of the terms of this Agreement, or the previously granted site plan approvals, the Board and/or the County may, in its discretion, formally request that the local zoning board withhold or deny the issuance of any further building permit(s) and/or certificate of occupancy or revoke any issued certificate of occupancy until the violation has been corrected, or file an action in chancery/equity for specific performance to enforce the provisions of this Agreement. Applicant understands and acknowledges that all terms and conditions of the previously approved site plan(s), and this Agreement, were critical and an essential part of the Board's decision to grant approval of the Applicant's project. A violation of the terms and conditions of the Board's approval(s) will be considered a material breach and may result in the revocation of the Board's approval(s), and shall terminate the Applicant's right to construct, develop and/or occupy the property. In addition, Applicant may be subject to prosecution for violating any and all local, county, state and federal laws, codes and regulations. The remedies available to the Board and the County shall not be limited to the remedies specified herein. The parties reserve their rights to exercise and any all rights and remedies available under the law and in equity, including an action for specific performance to enforce their rights herein.
- 3. <u>Indemnification</u>. Applicant agrees to indemnify and hold the County, its officials, consultants, agents, servants, representatives and employees, harmless from and against any and all claims, liability, costs or expenses of any and every kind and nature, in law or in equity, arising from Applicant, or Applicant's agents, contractors, employees, firm, person, entity or corporation, acting on Applicant's behalf, for its performance, or failure to perform, pursuant to its obligations under this Agreement, and the terms and conditions of any and all site plan approvals issued by the Board with respect to the project subject to the site plan approvals.
- 4. Complete Agreement. This Agreement, including the Conditional Approval and all documents submitted in connection with the Conditional Approval, constitutes the complete and only Agreement among Applicant and the County regarding the subject matter hereof. This Agreement shall supersede all prior agreements, grants, reservations of rights and/or understandings with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may only be modified in writing signed by the parties; however, the parties agree to make such modifications as may be reasonably necessary to further its intent and purpose. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey.

- 5. Applicant agrees to comply with all rules, regulations, statutes, resolutions and ordinances of the State of New Jersey, County of Passaic, and City of Paterson.
- 6. Applicant shall not assign an interest in this agreement or transfer any interest without the prior written consent of the County, which shall not be unreasonably withheld. Applicant must provide a minimum of 60 days advance written notice to the County prior to any assignment or transfer of interest in the agreement. The County reserves the right to deny the assignment or transfer if such assignment or transfer is incompatible with the rights given to Applicant.
- 7. Agreement No Waiver. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed a waiver by any party of its rights under any ordinance or state statute or other law, or be construed as an abridgement, preemption, or waiver of the powers of the County, the Board, or any other agency or public body.
- 8. Provisions Enforceable as Conditions. Each of the provisions of this Agreement shall have the same force and effect as if set forth at length as conditions of the resolution, and/or approved site plan(s).
- 9. This Agreement shall run in perpetuity and shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their heirs, successors and assigns.
- 10. Notices. Any notices required to be served upon any of the parties to this Agreement shall be served at the addresses previously set forth in the top of this Agreement unless a party serves a written change of address on the remaining parties. All notices given hereunder shall be in writing, shall be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, and shall be deemed given when mailed.

**WHEREAS**, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County") is a body politic and corporate pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:18-1 and vested with all rights contained therein; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A, 40:20-1 the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Passaic (hereafter "Board") is vested with managing the property, finances, and affairs of the County; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 9, 2020, New Jersey Governor Philip Murphy, in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the people of the State of New Jersey, signed Executive Order No. 103, declaring a Public Health Emergency and State of Emergency exist in the State of New Jersey, and subsequent executive orders extending same; and

WHEREAS, Governor Murphy signed Assembly Bill No. 5820, allowing for the continuation of certain State agencies to modify and issue new emergency orders for certain purposes that can continue after the Public Health Emergency declared in Executive Order No. 103 is terminated to avoid disruption in New Jersey's emergency response; and

**WHEREAS**, in light of this legislation becoming law, Governor Murphy signed Executive Order No. 244, that, among other items, lifted the Public Health Emergency in New Jersey, but left in place the State of Emergency declared in same pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A</u>. App. A.: 9-33, <u>et seq.</u>, to allow for the continued management of New Jersey's recovery and response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 provides that during times of emergency, any contract may be negotiated or awarded for a contracting unit without public advertising for bids and bidding when an emergency affecting the public health, safety or welfare requires the immediate delivery of goods or the performance of services; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with the Section 5.3 of the Passaic County Administrative Code which sets forth emergency powers, the County Administrator is empowered to enter into contracts for goods or services needed to preserve the health, safety and welfare of the public, subject to ratification of the Board; and

WHEREAS, on December 30, 2020, the County Administrator, pursuant to the authority stated herein, executed a COVID-19 Vaccine Administration Agreement by and between the County of Passaic and Vault Medical Services of New Jersey, P.C. (hereafter "Vault"), to assist the Department of Health in managing and operating COVID-19 Vaccination Sites in Passaic County, which is attached to and made part of this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, on June 22, 2021, the Board approved Resolution No. R20210594 authorizing the COVID-19 Vaccine Administration Agreement (hereafter "Agreement") by and between the County and Vault Medical Services of New Jersey, P.C. and appropriated monies for same; and

## AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO THE VACCINE ADMINISTRATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN VAULT MEDICAL SERVICES OF NEW JERSEY, P.C. AND COUNTY OF PASSAIC

This Amendment No. 2 to the Vaccine Administration Agreement (the "Second Amendment") is entered into and effective as of this day of September, 2021 by and between Vault Medical Services of New Jersey, P.C., a New Jersey professional services corporation ("Vault") and the County of Passaic, a corporate body politic of the State of New Jersey ("County").

WHEREAS, Vault and County entered into that certain Agreement for Vaccination Administration Services dated the 31st day of December (the "Agreement") and the

WHEREAS, Vault and County entered into that certain Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement, dated July 19, 2021 (the "First Amendment); and

WHEREAS, Vault and County desire to amend the Agreement to continue the provision of Vaccination Services; and

WHEREAS, capitalized terms used but not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed to such terms in the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein exchanged, and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Effective as of the date hereof, the Agreement is hereby amended as follows:
  - 1.1 Section 1.7 entitled "Dose" and "Dose Price" is added, and reads as follows:

"Dose" means an injection of COVID-19 vaccine, whether that Dose is commonly regarded as a "first dose," "second dose," or booster shot." "Dose Price" means the price payable to Vault per Dose of vaccine administered.

Section 7(a) of the Agreement is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the 1.2 following:

"Term. This Agreement shall be effective beginning December 31, 2020, and shall continue in effect for a term of twelve (12) months (the Term). Thereafter, the Term will continue on a month to month basis as agreed-upon by the parties."

- 1.3 The parties further agree that County will not exercise its rights under Section 7(c) of the Agreement until three months after the effective date of this Second Amendment (the three months being the "Booster Term"). The parties agree that, during the Booster Term, the County will commit that each Vaccination Site will hold a minimum of two (2) clinics per week.
- 1.4 Table 2, at the end of Section 4(a)(A) of the Agreement, as amended, is hereby replaced with the following:

- 2. Except as set forth in Section 1 of this Second Amendment, all other terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement remain in full force and effect.
- 3. This Second Amendment, the Amendment No. 1, and the Agreement constitute the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersede any prior agreement or undertaking among the Parties with respect to such subject matter. No amendment hereto may be made unless made in writing signed by all Parties to this Amendment.
- 4. This Second Amendment may be executed in counterparts (including by means of facsimile or by electronic mail in electronic format), each of which shall be an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same agreement.

BOND ORDINANCE TOAUTHORIZE THE CONSTRUCTION OF Α NEW BIOTECHNOLOGY FACILITY FOR THE VOCATIONAL SCHOOL IN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC IN, BY AND FOR THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$24,737,301 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE A STATE GRANT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF ISSUANCE OF ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Vocational School in the County of Passaic (the "Board of Education") has heretofore determined by resolution that funds are necessary for the construction of a new Biotechnology Facility and has delivered a statement of the estimated cost of such project and the amount of money presently needed for such project (the "Board of Education Statement") to the Board of School Estimate of the Vocational School in the County of Passaic (the "Board of School Estimate"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has been notified that a grant in the amount of \$18,552,976 (75% of the total project cost of \$24,737,301) from the State of New Jersey Department of Education County Vocational School District Career and Technical Education Grant Program (the "State Grant") has been awarded for such project; and

WHEREAS, the Board of School Estimate has heretofore determined by resolution that funds are necessary for the project specified in the Board of Education Statement and has determined the sum of money presently needed for such project (\$24,737,301) and the amount thereof to be raised by the State Grant (\$18,552,976) and by the County of Passaic (\$6,184,325 - 25% of the total project cost) and has delivered a certificate to that effect together with the Board of Education Statement to the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Passaic, New Jersey; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Passaic, State of New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), as follows:

Section 1. The County of Passaic (the "County"), State of New Jersey is hereby authorized to construct a new Biotechnology Facility, including original furnishings equipment therefor, for the Vocational School in the County of Passaic (located in Wayne) in, by and for the County. Said improvement shall include all work, materials, equipment and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor. It is hereby public determined and stated that said building being constructed will be of "Class B" or equivalent construction as

defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 2. The sum of \$24,737,301 is payment of the cost of appropriated to the making the Section 1 hereof improvement described in (hereinafter collectively referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the State Grant appropriated by this ordinance. down payment is required pursuant to the provisions of NoSaid improvement shall be made as a general N.J.S.A. 18A:54-31. improvement and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefitted.

It is hereby determined and stated that Section 3. said purpose is not a current expense of said County, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said County pursuant to the Local Bond Law and Chapter 54 of Title 18A, Education, of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended (the "Education Law"), and (3) the total estimated cost of said purpose is \$24,737,301, and \$18,552,976 of said sum is to be provided by the State Grant hereinafter appropriated, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is

\$6,184,325, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore

stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$2,000,000 which is

estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose,

including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and

inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including

interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section

20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that

the sum of \$18,552,976 received or to be received as the State

Grant is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of such

purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said

County of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$6,184,325

are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond

Law and the Education Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a

rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the

limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said

bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by

resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond

anticipation notes of said County of an aggregate principal

amount not exceeding \$6,184,325 are hereby authorized to be

issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law and the Education Law in

anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Each bond anticipation note pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Director or Deputy Director of the Board of County Commissioners and by Director of Finance and shall be under the seal of said County and attested by the Clerk or Deputy Clerk of the Board of County Said officers are hereby authorized to execute Commissioners. said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said

notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to

sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Director of Finance

who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time

or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared

that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its

reasonable life, is a period of thirty years computed from the

date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that

the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law

has been duly made and filed in the office of the Clerk of the

Board of County Commissioners of said County, and that such

statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said County, as

defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by

this ordinance by \$6,184,325, but said \$6,184,325 shall be

deducted from gross debt pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:54-31 and that

the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance

is permitted by an exception to the debt limitations prescribed

by the Local Bond Law as provided in N.J.S.A. 18A:54-31.

Section 10. Any funds received from the State of

New Jersey or any of its agencies or any funds received from the

United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such

purpose (other than the State Grant hereinbefore appropriated

which shall be applied to the cost of such purpose, but shall

not be applied to the payment of outstanding bond anticipation

notes and the reduction of the amount of bonds authorized),

shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or,

if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of

the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized

for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to

conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of

any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by

the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended

capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director,

Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk

of the Board of County Commissioners and is available for public

inspection.

Section 12. The County intends to issue the bonds

or notes to finance the cost of the improvement described in

Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the County incurs such

costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the County

expects to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the

proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount

of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the County are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the County, and the County shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.
