WHEREAS, the Board of Freeholders in the County of Passaic finds it advisable and necessary to increase its 2020 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$2,606,536.80 in excess of the increase in the final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders in the County of Passaic hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the 2020 budget year, the final appropriations of the County of Passaic shall, in accordance with this resolution and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 1.0%, amounting to \$2,606,536.80 and that the 2020 county budget for the County of Passaic be approved and adopted in accordance with this resolution; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC, CITY OF PASSAIC, AND TRUST FOR PUBLIC LAND FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE DUNDEE ISLAND PHASE II PROJECT IN THE CITY OF PASSAIC, PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40:12-20, ET SEQ.

WHEREAS, in 2017, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County"), City of Passaic (hereafter "City") and Trust for Public Land (hereafter "TPL") began a joint effort to rehabilitate a seven (7) acre parcel of riverfront property in the City, on the Passaic River, known as Dundee Island Park; and

WHEREAS, construction is underway at Dundee Island Park, with substantial completion expected in the latter part of 2020, with the Park to be opened and incorporated into the Passaic County Park System thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the County, City, and TPL desire to continue rehabilitation efforts on the riverfront in the City, including the renovation of the railway property between Dundee Island Park and Pulaski Park, the adaptive reuse of the railroad bridge over the Passaic River as a pedestrian and bike thoroughfare and outlook area, and the redevelopment of North Pulaski Park (hereafter referred to as the "Phase II Project"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:12-20, *et seq.*, the State of New Jersey recognizes the needs of municipalities to enter into agreements to rehabilitate, improve, and maintain their parks, and thus authorizes municipalities and counties to establish mutually beneficial partnerships, through an agreement, with nonprofit organizations that will result in parks that are better maintained, operated, and improved for the use and enjoyment of the public; and

WHEREAS, TPL is a national, nonprofit, land conservation organization that conserves land for people to enjoy as parks, community gardens, historic sites, rural lands, and other natural places, and works in partnership with municipalities to design and develop parks, playgrounds, and greenways; and

WHEREAS, an agreement between the County, City, and TPL for the management of the Phase II Project is appended hereto, and made part of the resolution, outlining the roles and responsibilities of the parties in the Phase II Project (hereafter "Agreement"); and

THIS AGREEMENT made this _____ day of _____ 2020, by and between, the COUNTY OF PASSAIC (hereafter "County"), having its principal place of business at 401 Grand Street, Suite 205, Paterson, New Jersey 07505, the CITY OF PASSAIC (hereafter "City"), having its principal place of business at 330 Passaic Avenue, Passaic, New Jersey 07055, and THE TRUST FOR PUBLIC LAND, D/B/A TPL-NEW JERSEY, a California Not-for-Profit Corporation having an address at 60 Park Place, Newark, NJ 07102 (hereafter "TPL"), collectively, the "Parties":

WHEREAS, in 2017, the Parties began the Dundee Island Park Project, a joint effort to redesign and rehabilitate a seven (7) acre parcel of riverfront property in the City of Passaic, on the Passaic River, known as Dundee Island Park; and

WHEREAS, construction is underway at Dundee Island Park, with substantial completion expected in the latter part of 2020, with the park to be opened to the public and incorporated into the Passaic County Park System thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to continue rehabilitation efforts on the riverfront in the City, including the renovation of the railway property between Dundee Island Park and Pulaski Park, the adaptive reuse of the railroad bridge over the Passaic River as a pedestrian and bike thoroughfare and outlook area, and the redevelopment of North Pulaski Park (hereafter referred to as the Dundee Island Park Phase II Project or "Phase If Project"); and

WHEREAS, through enacting N.J.S.A. 40:12-20, et seq., the State of New Jersey recognizes the needs of municipalities to enter into agreements to rehabilitate, improve, and maintain their parks, and thus authorizes municipalities and counties to establish mutually beneficial partnerships, through an agreement, with nonprofit organizations that will result in parks that are better maintained, operated, and improved for the use and enjoyment of the public; and

WHEREAS, TPL is a national, nonprofit, land conservation organization that conserves land for people to enjoy as parks, community gardens, historic sites, rural lands, and other natural places, and works in partnership with municipalities to design and develop parks, playgrounds, and greenways; and

WHEREAS, the County and City would benefit from TPL managing the design and construction of the Phase II Project, and the parties wish to develop a framework Project Agreement and authorize and fund an initial scope of work for community engagement, concept design, and survey;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the mutual agreements and covenants herein, the Parties agree to perform and be responsible to each other as set forth in the following articles of this Agreement.

I. Term.

This Agreement shall commence upon the date of this Agreement and shall terminate upon completion of the design and construction of the Project.

II. Intent.

The goals of the Phase II Project are:

- (a) To develop community driven concepts to connect Dundee Island Park, Pulaski Park, and North Pulaski Park into one jointly managed parkland.
- (b) To restore the railroad bridge that crosses the Passaic River for adaptive reuse as a pedestrian crossing and outlook area;
- (c) To incorporate the railroad bridge and North Pulaski Park into Dundee Island Park as part of the Passaic County Park System, to be maintained by the County's Department of Parks and Recreation;
- (d) To link Pulaski Park and Dundee Island Park, with the property being acquired and described in more detail herein being retained by the City for incorporation into Pulaski Park; and
- (e) To begin the process of developing an agreement between the County and City, to ensure consistency in policies adopted to manage Pulaski Park, Dundee Island Park, and North Pulaski Park.

III. Funding and Initial Scope of Work.

The County is authorizing two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00) for the initial concept development and design services set forth in the proposal submitted by TPL and attached hereto Exhibit A dated February 14, 2020 ("Initial Scope of Work"). Further scopes of work shall be added to the Project as funding becomes available, subject to the approval of the Parties.

As this initial outlay of funding from the County to TPL represents only a portion of the necessary funds required for TPL to finalize construction documents ready to be bid, the Parties agree to work in a collaborative manner to identify the funding necessary to finalize same.

Any grants or additional funding received by the County or City in furtherance of the Phase II Project shall be transferred otherwise made available to TPL to be managed as part of one project, in furtherance of the goals and responsibilities as set forth herein for all Parties.

Subject to any necessary approvals by the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders, Passaic City Council, and/or TPL's board, the Parties shall cooperate to execute such other agreements as are necessary to commit designated funds to the Phase II Project.

IV. Design and Project Management.

TPL shall be responsible for managing the design and construction, including retaining engineers and contractors, or any other consultants as required to complete the Scope of Work. The Project Area is

set forth in Exhibit B. TPL shall consult with the County and City on all major decisions regarding the design of the park, incorporating design ideas and concepts gathered from public information sessions, and any other input gathered from the Mayor of the City of Passaic, the Passaic City Council, and the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders. TPL's obligations to manage design and construction of this Project shall be contingent upon the provision of funding by the County and/or City for all costs of design, construction, including TPL's costs and the cost of engaging consultants and contractors

V. Property Acquisition.

The City shall be responsible for all of the costs related to purchasing and remediating the property known as Block 5000 Lot 1, City of Passaic, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey (hereafter "New York & Greenwood Lake Railway Property").

- a. The property acquisition of the New York & Greenwood Lake Railway Property includes the strip of property that was formerly operated as a railroad and splits Dundee Island Park and Pulaski Park, as well as the railroad bridge that crosses the Passaic River. After conclusion of the Phase II Project, the New York & Greenwood Lake Railway Property shall be subdivided, and the City shall retain ownership of the parcel splitting Dundee Island Park and Pulaski Park, and the County shall retain ownership of the railroad bridge;
- b. The City shall transfer ownership of Block 1001.06 Lot 12, City of Passaic, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey (hereafter "North Pulaski Park Property"), which shall be incorporated into Dundee Island Park. The North Pulaski Park Property parcel shall be subdivided, and the City shall retain ownership of the parking lot portion of North Pulaski Park;
- All transfers of properties mentioned shall be completed upon substantial completion of the Phase II Project; and
- d. A Tax Map of the City of Passaic, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, reflecting the properties mentioned in this Article, is attached hereto as Exhibit C.

VI. Grant Applications by the Trust for Public Land

TPL shall make application to the Green Acres Grant Program administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to fund the construction of the Phase II Project. The County and City shall pass authorizing resolutions committing to cover any matching funds required, and make available personnel necessary to complete the grant applications. Moreover, if other grant opportunities arise otherwise not mentioned herein, TPL shall make every reasonable effort to apply and secure funding for the Phase II Project.

VII. North Pulaski Park.

The North Pulaski Park Property shall be incorporated into Dundee Island Park as part of the Passaic County Park System upon substantial completion of the Phase II Project.

VIII. Agreement between the County of Passaic, City of Passaic, and Trust for Public Land for the Management of the Passaic Riverfront Park Project at the Dundee Island Site in the City of Passaic.

All of the terms set forth in the Agreement between the County of Passaic, City of Passaic, and Trust for Public Land for the Management of the Passaic Riverfront Park Project at the Dundee Island Site in the City of Passaic approved by the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders via Resolution No. R20170649 and the City of Passaic Resolution No. 17-17-207 shall remain in full force and effect.

IX. Stakeholder Committee.

The County, City, and TPL shall form a Passaic Riverfront Park Stakeholder Committee that shall meet at least once every three (3) months to coordinate management of the Project and to keep all parties informed on the progress of the Project. The Stakeholder Committee shall consist of the following individuals:

- (a) Passaic County Freeholder Director or designee;
- (b) Passaic City Mayor or Designee;
- (c) Passaic County Administrator or Designee:
- (d) City of Passaic Administrator or Designee;
- (e) Passaic County Parks and Recreation Department Director or designee;
- (f) City of Passaic Engineer or designee;
- (g) County of Passaic Engineer or designee;
- (h) County of Passaic Director of Planning and Economic Development or designee;
- (i) Trust for Public Land New Jersey State Director; and
- (j) Trust for Public Land Project Manager.

TPL Project Manager shall schedule and develop agendas for the Stakeholder Committee meetings, as well as distribute meeting minutes following the conclusion of each meeting.

X. Management Agreement for Dundee Island Park, Pulaski Park, and North Pulaski Park.

The County and City affirmatively declare the intent to develop a management agreement for Dundee Island Park, Pulaski Park, and North Pulaski Park to ensure that the interconnected parkland owned by the City and County is managed, maintained, programmed, and permitted in a uniform and consistent process.

XI. Vendor Selection for Concession at Dundee Island Park.

As part of the Dundee Island Park Project, a concession area is being constructed as part of the field house on the park. The County is going to select a concessionaire in compliance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1, commonly known as competitive contracting. As part of the legal process set forth therein. the City's designee shall be a member of the review committee and take part in selecting the successful respondent.

XII. Procurement Standards.

Procurement shall be consistent with the New Jersey Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq., and other statutory or grant requirements, as applicable.

XIII. Construction of Agreement; Modification; and Waiver.

This Agreement shall be construed without regard to any presumption or other rule requiring construction against drafter. Provisions of this Agreement may only be supplemented, modified, waived or amended in writing and signed by the parties duly authorized to execute this Agreement. No waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed or shall constitute a waiver of any other provision, whether or not similar, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts and by the manual or facsimile signature of the parties hereto. Each of such counterparts, when so executed, shall be deemed an original and when taken together shall constitute a single instrument.

XIV. Insurance.

During the period of this Agreement, TPL, its consultants, and its contractors shall procure and maintain:

- a. Commercial General Liability Insurance in limits of not less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury, death, personal injury and property damage, including but not limited to coverage for Broad Form Property Damage. Such coverage shall not contain any exclusions for property damage arising out of explosion, collapse or underground property damage hazards and no exclusion for waterfront activities. For environmental assessment and/or abatement work, such coverage shall include pollution liability coverage.
- b. The policies described above shall be endorsed (1) to include the County, City, and TPL, if from its contractors, as additional insured and (2) to provide that notice of an occurrence to the insurance company from any insured shall serve as notice from all insured.
- c. Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance in limits of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) combined single limits per occurrence for bodily injury, death and property damage covering all owned, non-owned and hired vehicles in connection with the work to be performed in connection with this Agreement.
- d. Worker's Compensation and employer's liability insurance of at least no less than the State of New Jersey statutory limits for all employees, in connection with the work and, if any work is subcontracted, TPL shall require each contractor or subcontractor to provide Worker's Compensation and employer's liability insurance for the latter's employees, unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by TPL. Employer's liability insurance shall have limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- e. Where, applicable, professional errors and omission coverage in the amount of \$2,000,000.
- f. All insurance required to be maintained pursuant hereto shall provide that the County and City shall be given prior written notice of the suspension, cancellation, termination, non-renewal or lapse of such policy or a material change in coverage thereunder.

XV. Records Retention.

TPL shall maintain all Project records for a period of not less than three (3) years. Moreover, a copy of a Project records shall be sent to the Passaic County Engineer's Office for filing and reference following the completion of the Project.

DUNDEE ISLAND PARK PHASE II IMPROVEMENT PROJECT PASSAIC COUNTY PARK SYSTEM

I. Purpose

The County of Passaic (hereafter "County") is seeking a consultant (hereafter "Firm" or "Consultant") to conduct community input meetings, survey, and develop a schematic design and construction estimates for the Dundee Island Park Phase II Improvement Project (hereafter "Project"). The Project includes the area delineated in the attached map (hereafter "Project Area"). Specifically, the Project Area includes the adjacent abandoned railway and bridge and the property north of Dundee Island commonly known as North Pulaski Park.

Over the past three (3) years, the County and City of Passaic (hereafter "City") worked collaboratively to redevelop Dundee Island Park. Currently, Dundee Island Park is in the midst of a transformation and is under construction, with a new athletic field, field house, community garden, river walk, and amphitheater being installed. Once completed, Dundee Island will be transferred to the County and incorporated into the Passaic County Park System.

Currently, the adjacent railway area and bridge act as a dividing point between Dundee Island and Pulaski Park. Moreover, the property is a haven for illicit drug use and homeless encampments. Although not completed, the City is in the process of acquiring the railway and bridge property. This Project is focused on developing a community driven process to link the two (2) parks, repurpose the railway bridge as a pedestrian crossing, and rehabilitate North Pulaski Park by extending the river walk across the Monroe Street Bridge and improving and expanding the amenities therein to create one cohesive parkland across Pulaski Park, Dundee Island, and North Pulaski Park.

II. Project Goals

The Project is broken down into four (4) components. First, the County and City are seeking community engagement to solicit feedback from residents on the types of amenities and features to be installed on the parkland in the Project Area. Second, a survey containing, among other pertinent information, property owner information, that can be used by the County to begin the process of acquiring parcels needed for the Project, if necessary. Third, the Consultant will conduct a preliminary environmental assessment to determine what, if any, remediation work will need to be completed as part of the Project. Fourth, the County is seeking conceptual designs that include construction cost estimates and construction documents at the thirty percent (30%) phase. The fourth phase will also include identifying the necessary permits required to execute the Project.

The Consultant should suggest possible amenities, including but not limited to the following features:

- (a) Access and circulation plan to integrate Pulaski Park and Dundee Island byway of the railway property and new access points for the parks at Wall Street and 7th Street and Hudson Street;
- (b) Proposed pedestrian crossing and connectivity of the river walk at Dundee Island and the river walk at North Pulaski Park over the Monroe Street Bridge;
- (c) Inspection and determination of whether the existing railway bridge can be converted to a pedestrian and overlook crossing of the Passaic River;
- (d) Rain gardens and green infrastructure elements;
- (e) Landscape and tree planting;
- (f) Playground equipment;
- (g) American with Disabilities Act improvements;
- (h) Signage and wayfinding in conformance with the Passaic County Wayfinding Standards;
- Monuments or other historic elements highlighting the history of Passaic County and City of Passaic; and
- (j) Other features as suggested by the Consultant or suggested during community input meetings.

The Consultant must be familiar with the previous improvements completed, and when necessary, consult the final plans for said projects.

III. Project Planning and Personnel Coordination

The Project requires field work and historic research. Certain field and research data will be provided by Department of Engineering and Parks and Recreation Department. Nordan Murphy, Principal Engineer, will serve as the project coordinator for the County and will be involved in all aspects of the Project. He will provide access to research documents available in County's collections and assist with coordination as needed. The Consultant will coordinate efforts in tandem with him. The Project is on an intensive track, and all final deliverables must be delivered in one hundred fifty (150) days or less following award of contract. The Consultant will hold a Preliminary Meeting with County and City to discuss the Project goals and all relevant details. Not later than one week following the Preliminary Meeting, the Consultant will develop and propose in writing a work plan, projected committee meetings, project time table and project milestones for approval.

IV. Detailed Scope of Consultant Services

- a. <u>Community Engagement</u>. The Consultant shall plan, promote, and conduct two (2) community meetings in the City, at a mutually agreeable time for the City and County.
- b. <u>Site Inspection</u>. A field inspection shall be conducted at the beginning of the Project to ascertain the existing condition of the Project Area. Consultant shall take and label photographs of the entire Project Area during the design phase of the Project.
- c. <u>Field Survey.</u> A New Jersey Licensed Professional Land Surveyor shall conduct field survey work for the Project. The fieldwork shall include a ground survey in sufficient scope to accomplish this project. The Consultant is required to arrange and provide any necessary traffic control as approved by the County in conformance with applicable regulations and industry standards. All costs associated with traffic control, including police traffic control is to be included in the Consultant's cost proposal. The survey shall be based on horizontal datum NAD83 and vertical datum NAVD88. The consultant will coordinate all utility mark

outs. The field survey data collection will result in a drafted existing conditions base map accurately depicting existing planimetric and topographic features suitable for support project concepts and design.

- d. Property Owner Identification. The Consultant shall identify all property owners within the Project Area for use by the County to begin the process of gaining control of the Project Area for completion of the Project. The Consultant shall utilize any existing survey boundaries available in accordance with digital tax maps available from the City of Passaic in digital format to locate the existing property limits and identify the properties needed as identified in the conceptual design.
- e. <u>Preliminary Environmental Assessment</u>. The Consultant shall conduct a preliminary environmental assessment of the Project Area to determine any remediation efforts that need to be undertaken for the Project, with a cost estimate of same.
- f. <u>Preliminary Bridge Inspection</u>. The Consultant shall conduct a preliminary engineering/structural assessment of the existing rail bridge to determine the condition and suitable reuse of the bridge in the project concept.
- g. Conceptual Design. The Consultant shall prepare a concept and schematic designs at the thirty percent (30%) level of completion. The concept/schematic design shall include graphic images of the concept to be adopted by the County.
- h. <u>Permit Identification</u>. The Consultant shall identify all necessary permits that must be obtained by the County to complete the Project.
- Cost Estimate. The Consultant shall prepare an Engineer's Estimate of Construction Cost for the Project, including but not limited the costs associated with rehabilitating the railway bridge for pedestrian access.

V. Proposals

The Consultant shall submit the above outline as his/her proposal for his/her services. Should the Consultant wish to amend, alter, limit, condition or make additions to the above outline as his/her proposal, he/she shall do so by placing asterisks on the portion of the outline of which the Consultant wishes to change and provide an addendum to that section stating the changes, the reasons for and the consequences of each change.

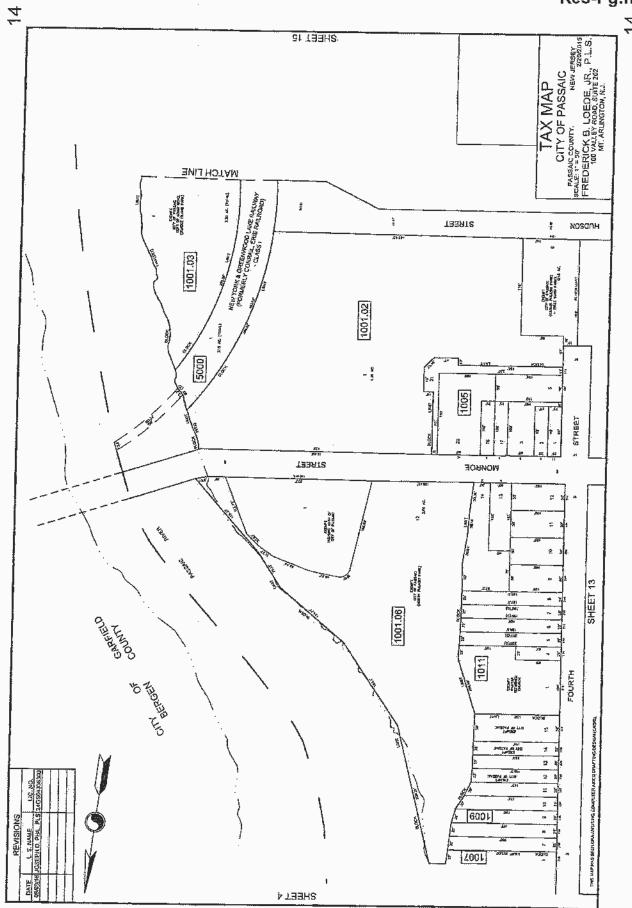

Subject: Proposed 2020-2021 Drawdown of Greenwood Lake

Dear Commission Members:

South Shore Marina is not in favor of the proposed 2020-2021 60-inch drawdown of Greenwood Lake and recommends that it be cancelled. The facts to support this are there if you take a look.

Attached is the Northern New Jersey (Division 1) Monthly Precipitation Table: 1999-2019. If you examine the past precipitation rates with regards to drawdowns, FACT: refilling the lake is a crapshoot. Even drawing the lake down quickly enough to get work done appears to be a crapshoot too. Look out your window, there is no snow or ice in the mountains to run off into the lake. FACT: The weather has changed. FACT: Sooner or later the current Greenwood Lake Water Level Management Plan will cause a disaster for the residents/marinas/hotels/restaurants and economies of two towns.

If the lake does not refill there is **no alternative** for the businesses and lakefront homeowners. However the boating customers and home buyers do have an alternative – they can go to the Hudson River, Lake Hopatcong, or the New Jersey shore.

Regarding the water lilies in the east arm: Does the Greenwood Lake Commission really want to encourage residents to wade out in the cold **mud** to try to remove them? If the lake bottom does freeze, they will be impossible to remove and the freezing does not kill them either. Is there an alternate way to remove the water lilies? Yes, hydro-raking can remove water lilies when there is water in the lake.

Can lakefront homeowners fix their bulkheads/docks without drawing the lake down? Yes. It probably costs them more money, but they have an alternative.

One of the speakers at the public hearing said, "It is ok with me if the lake does not refill for one season." If you vote "Yes" then apparently it is ok with you too.

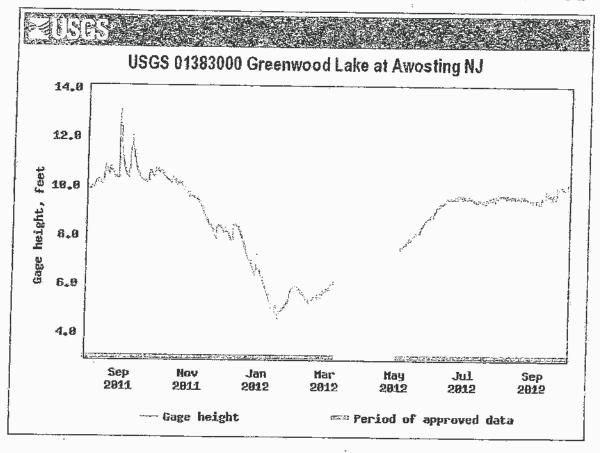

Dam Gage Height: August 1, 2011 - September 30, 2012

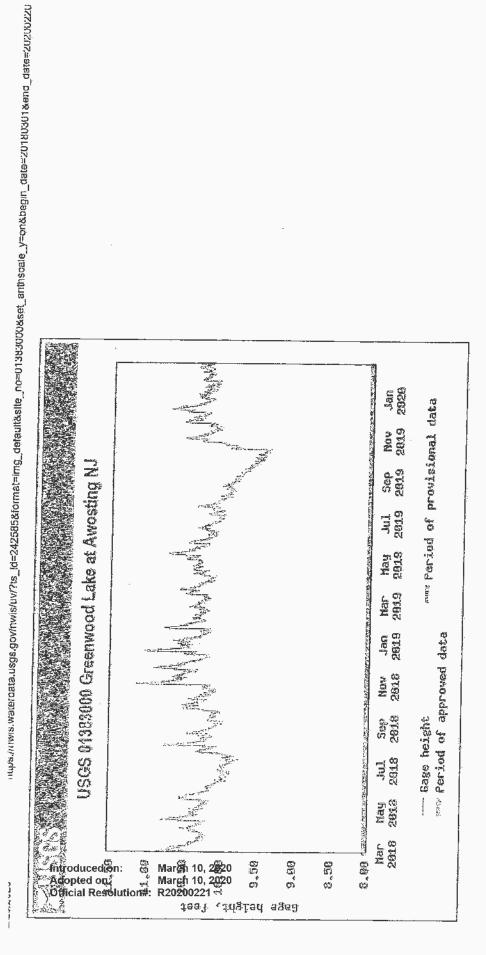

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 205 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HALEDON ENTITLED VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

WHEREAS, the Borough of Haledon has determined it to be in the best interests of the safety, health and welfare of the residents of the Borough of Haledon to provide for handicapped parking spaces on Borough streets; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Haledon is desirous of removing certain parking spaces on the streets of the Borough of Haledon no longer needed for use by handicapped individuals as recommended by the Haledon Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Haledon Police Department has surveyed the locations where handicapped parking spaces have been requested and have recommended that certain parking spaces be designated for use by handicapped individuals; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Haledon as follows:

- 1. Chapter 205, Section 19B (1) dealing with handicapped parking at residential locations, is hereby amended as follows:
 - A. New handicapped parking spaces shall be designated at the following locations:

321 West Clinton Street

From the North West corner of West Clinton Street and Cook Street extending 157 feet North on West Clinton Street and then continuing another 22 feet.

186 Belmont Avenue

From the South East corner of Behmont Avenue and Cook Street extending 86 feet South on Belmont Avenue and then continuing another 22 feet.

256 Granite Avenue

From the South East corner of Cliff Street and Granite Avenue extending 31 feet East on Cliff Street and then continuing another 22 feet.

From the North West corner of Lee Avenue and Burhans Avenue extending 411 feet North on Lee Avenue then continuing another 22 feet.

- 2. All unauthorized signs regulating traffic and/or parking shall be identified and removed within 30 days of the passage and publication of this ordinance and no unauthorized signed shall be erected without a supporting ordinance duly passed and published as provided by law.
- 3. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage and publication as provided by law.
