Since the last Update, one resident and two CNAs tested positive. Our resident lives on resident unit 3-400. Our C NAs work on resident units 1-300 and Pathway. Residents and staff who had close contact with the residents or staff who tested positive are tested in accordance with regulatory requirements. Residents who tested positive are residing on unit 2-400 "C" section until transmission-based precautions are discontinued. We currently have two residents on 2-400 "C" on transmission-based precautions.

On December 28, 2022, we will celebrate Kwanzaa with a special meal for residents and staff. Unfortunately, due to illness, the musical celebration must be postponed.
