WHEREAS, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County") is a government body incorporated pursuant to N.J.S.A, 40:18-1, et seq. and vested with all rights contained therein; and

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN COUNTY OF PASSAIC

AND

THE NEW JERSEY REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

This **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** ("MOU") made by and between the County of Passaic ("County") and the NEW JERSEY REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY ("NJRA"), an instrumentality of the State of New Jersey (the "State"). The NJRA and the County may sometimes hereinafter be collectively referred to as the "Parties" and individually as a "Party."

PREAMBLES

WHEREAS, due to the increase in the number of novel coronavirus ("COVID-19") cases in New Jersey, the surrounding region and across the globe, the Governor of the State of New Jersey issued Executive Order No. 103 declaring a public health emergency and a state of emergency in the State of New Jersey (the "State") on March 9, 2020, allowing for certain executive actions to respond to the increasing amount of COVID-19 cases in the State; and

WHEREAS, beginning on March 16, 2020 and to the present time, the Governor has issued multiple Executive Orders to deal with the COVID-19 Pandemic, including the restriction of business activities; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the actions taken by the Governor and by states throughout the United States, the U.S. economy and the State economy are suffering losses which are being compared to more than occurred in the Great Depression of the 1930s and the number of people filing for unemployment insurance both in the State and nationally have reached levels never before seen; and

WHEREAS, the long-term and short-term capital markets have experienced significant deterioration in value and volatility, which can affect the liquidity and results of operations of companies in the State and the State economy as a whole; and

WHEREAS, on _______, 2020, the NJRA's Board approved the creation of an initial pilot NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program in the amount of \$5 million ("Phase One BE Grant Program") to make grant funding available for short-term operating support to Passaic County businesses that have been impacted by the COVID-19 Pandemic; and

WHEREAS, in response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, Congress enacted the "Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act," P.L. 116-136, codified at 134 Stat. 281 (the "CARES Act"), which provides, among other things, some fiscal relief to the states through the Coronavirus Relief Fund ("CRF"); and

WHEREAS, as a result of the oversubscription to the NJRA Small Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program, utilizing the appropriated CRF funding, as well as other funds received for that purpose, to make grant funding available that will provide short-term operating support to New Jersey small

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businesses located in 64 distressed urban communities that have been negatively impacted during the declared state of emergency; the County of Passaic seeks to partner with the NJRA to offer a new grant assistance program (NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program) to businesses in all 16 municipalities in the County;

WHEREAS, the NJRA will utilize an automated application process for the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program and will publicize an application opening date through information on its website, its social media channels, and outreach to the media and stakeholders to make this information available to the public in advance of the application period opening; and

WHEREAS, the County also received funds from the CRF and has offered to contribute funds it received from the CRF to NJRA to fund grants to businesses in the County through the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the NJRA shall have the sole discretion to determine eligibility and/or criteria for the grants awarded through the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to this MOU, the Parties wish to set forth their understandings with respect to establishing and implementing the Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County and the NJRA agree as follows:

Section 1. <u>County Contribution to NJRA.</u>

Upon execution of this Agreement, the County shall cause \$5,000,000 to be paid from the County's CRF moneys ("County Funds") to NJRA to be used in a manner consistent with the terms of this MOU.

Section 2. Administration of the County Funds by NJRA

The NJRA shall award and administer grants to businesses economically impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic that are located in the County using County Funds ("Intended Purpose") through the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program. The County Funds shall be applied to applications approved by the NJRA after the disbursement or set aside for appeals of all the County CRF Funds unless the Parties mutually agree in writing to an earlier date. The Parties agree that NJRA will continue processing applications submitted by businesses located wholly or partially within the County until NJRA, at its discretion, NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program or all of the County Funds have been used for their Intended Purpose in accordance with the program specifications attached hereto as Exhibit A. Thereafter, once all appeals submitted by applicants wholly or partially within the County are concluded, NJRA shall return any unused portion of the funds within a reasonable period of time.

Section 3. Responsibilities of the NJRA

- 3.1 The NJRA shall build out an automated application process that is equipped to handle what is expected to be substantial demand and application activity, and utilize the NJRA project manager, Seamless Docs.
- 3.2 The NJRA shall begin accepting applications for the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency

Assistance Grant Program within thirty (30) days of execution of this MOU.

- 3.3 The NJRA will make its best efforts to publicize the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program application opening date through it marketing team including a Notice of Funding Availability to be posted on its website, its social media channels, and outreach to the media and stakeholders to make this information available to the public in advance of the application period opening.
- 3.4 The NJRA will provide the use of its Call Center, interpreters and technical assistance provided through the NJ Office of Innovation.
- 3.4 All County Funds must be disbursed by the NJRA no later than December 1, 2020. To ensure compliance with the CARES Act and U.S. Department of the Treasury requirements, all County Funds must be expended by grantees no later than December 30, 2020.
- 3.5 The NJRA shall make all eligibility determinations in accordance with the program specifications attached hereto as Exhibit A. Only applicants that meet the eligibility criteria established in the program specifications will be eligible to receive County Funds. Applicants that do not meet the eligibility criteria will be declined. All applicants that are declined will receive written notice with information on how to submit an appeal. The NJRA will handle all appeals.
- 3.6 The NJRA shall provide the requisite staff and support required to implement the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program at an administrative fee of 2% of the total grant funding provided by the County, at a minimum \$5,000,000, and grant funding not to exceed \$7,000,000.
- 3.7 The County represents that the County Funds are moneys received by the County from the CRF. The County has reviewed the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program specifications and acknowledges that it is solely responsible for the decision to utilize the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program to expend County Funds received from the CRF, including, but not limited to, responding to any audit or request for action by the U.S. Department of the Treasury, or any other governmental agency or entity, arising from the County's decision to expend the County Funds under the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program, provided that any questions and audits regarding the design of NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program will be answered by NJRA and not the County. The County may not rely on the NJRA for any representation that the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program complies with requirements applicable to the CRF or other federal law, regulation, rule, guidance, or other governmental requirement. The County acknowledges that it is solely responsible for repayment of the County Funds to the U.S Department of the Treasury, or any other governmental entity, if such department or entity finds that NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program specifications do not comply with any requirement applicable to the CRF or other federal law. regulation, rule, guidance, or other governmental requirement.
- 3.8 The NJRA will respond to any audit or request for action by the U.S. Department of the Treasury, or any other governmental agency or entity with regard to the design and implementation of NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program and any decision regarding an application, keeping the County fully informed. The NJRA acknowledges that it is solely responsible for repayment of any County Funds to the U.S Department of the Treasury, or any other governmental entity, if such department or entity finds that any grant was funded incorrectly.

3.9 NJRA shall inform the County when NJRA starts funding applications with County Funds. Thereafter, the NJRA shall submit a bi-weekly report to the County in the form attached as Exhibit B.

Section 4. General Provisions

- 4.1 Termination and Amendments. This MOU may be modified or extended only by prior written agreement by the Parties. This MOU may be terminated by either the NJRA or the County upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the other Party.
- 4.2 This MOU is being entered into for the sole purpose of evidencing the mutual understanding and intention of the Parties.
- 4.3 There are no third-party beneficiaries of this MOU.

- The Effective Date of this MOU shall be the later of the date executed by the Parties below. The term of this MOU shall be for the later of: (i) a period of two (2) years from the Effective Date; (ii) the date by when NJRA completes processing all applications submitted by businesses located in the County, including any applicant appeals; (iii) all County Funds have been used for their Intended Purpose, including any County Funds reserved during any applicant appeals; or (iv) the period of time during which the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program is subject to audit or other action by any federal department or agency, including, but not limited to the U.S. Department of the Treasury or the Office of the Inspector General, or any other State department or agency. This MOU may be extended by agreement of the Parties. Notwithstanding this provision, the NJRA has the sole discretion to determine when the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program application will be open to receive applications and when the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program ends.
- 4.6 The County and the NJRA shall retain all the powers, obligations and immunities provided by law.

- 4.7 The Parties acknowledge that the successful completion of each Party's duties hereunder will require cooperation between the Parties. The Parties agree to work cooperatively to achieve the goals of this MOU.
- 4.8 The recitals appearing before Section 1 are made part of this MOU and are specifically incorporated herein by reference.

NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program

1. Eligible Expenses

Under the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program, funding can <u>ONLY</u> be used to cover the following business costs/expenses and all grants will be ACH wired directly to landlords, mortgage companies and utilities:

2. Grant Amount

The NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program will provide grants up to, and not to exceed \$20,000 per company for rent expenses. The grant cannot exceed \$20,000 per company.

3. Eligible Businesses

Companies located in the 16 municipalities of Passaic County are eligible to apply to the NJRA/Passaic County Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program. However, businesses must meet the following criteria:

- Businesses must have a physical location in Passaic County

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN COUNTY OF PASSAIC

charged an unlawful "convenience fee" to persons and entities who recorded documents

electronically in Mercer County.

Defendants deny Plaintiff's allegations and have asserted numerous defenses to

Plaintiff's claims. Defendants do not admit liability to any of the claims of Plaintiff or any

RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE ACTION TAKEN BY THE PASSAIC COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR EXECUTING VARIOUS DOCUMENTS RELATED TO INSURANCE BENEFITS OFFERED BY THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC, PURSUANT TO THE PASSAIC COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE AND N.J.S.A. 40A:9-42

WHEREAS, the County of Passaic (the "County") is a government body incorporated pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:18-1, *et seq.* and vested with all rights contained therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:20-1 the Board of Chosen Freeholders for the County of Passaic (hereinafter the "Board") are vested with decision making powers on behalf of the County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 40A:9-42, the Board appointed a County Administrator to act as the executive or administrative officer for the Board and to have such executive and administrative powers, and perform such executive and administrative duties; and

WHEREAS, Article 5 of the Passaic County Administrative Code authorizes the County Administrator to carryout such policies for the proper administration of all County affairs within the Board's jurisdiction, including, as necessary, executing documents related to insurance benefit programs offered by the County; and

WHEREAS, on October 1, 2020, the County Administrator executed the following documents necessary to carry out the policies for the proper administration of County affairs; (1) PrudentRx Copay Program Participation Agreement; (2) CVS Health Requirements Document; and (3) Business Associate Addendum, attached to and made part of this resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Board now desires to ratify the action taken by the County Administrator, as necessary and within his authority to ensure the proper administration of County affairs, specifically to ensure that insurance benefit programs offered to County employees are properly administered; and

WHEREAS, the matter has been reviewed at the September 30, 2020 meeting of the Administration and Γinance Committee and is being recommended to the Board for ratification.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET BE IT RESOLVED, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:9-42 and Article 5 of the Passaic County Administrative Code, the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders ratifies the action taken by the County Administrator in executing the documents listed herein, and approves this action as being within the authority of the County Administrator to carryout such policies for the proper administration of County affairs.

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk to the Board, County Counsel, Chief Financial Officer, Purchasing Agent, and County Administrator are authorized to take any necessary action in furtherance of this resolution, and in carrying out the terms and conditions of the documents signed by the County Administrator.

PrudentRx Copay Program Participation Agreement

This PrudentRx Copay Program Participation Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into effective as of January 1, 2021, by and between PrudentRx, LLC, a Florida limited liability company ("PrudentRx"), and Passaic County ("Client"). PrudentRx and Client are sometimes referred to herein individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

Background

PrudentRx provides co-pay program related services to plan sponsors that include guidance on plan benefit design for specialty products and assistance to members to secure available copay assistance for specialty drugs through the various programs funded by pharmaceutical companies. Client desires to engage PrudentRx to provide such co-pay program related services to its members, as hereinafter set forth.

The Parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Defined Terms</u>. In addition to the terms defined elsewhere herein, the following terms shall have the meaning set forth below when used in this Agreement:

"Effective Date" means the later of: (i) January 1, 2021, or (ii) the effective date of the PBM Agreement.

"Member" means a person who is eligible for prescription drug benefits under the Plan.

"PBM Agreement" means the Prescription Benefit Services Agreement between CaremarkPCS Heath, L.L.C. ("CVS/caremark") and Client.

"Pharma Copayment Assistance Program" means a program sponsored by a pharmaceutical company that provides financial assistance for payment of the patient's cost-share for those patients who meet the program eligibility criteria, as established by the pharmaceutical company, but excluding any program that conditions assistance on financial need.

"Plan" means the (insert plan name(s) here), which are the health benefit plan(s) sponsored by Client that includes the prescription drug benefit.

"PrudentRx Co-Pay Program" means the plan benefit design, assistance with Pharma Copayment Assistance Program enrollment, and related services to be provided by PrudentRx to Client in connection with Pharma Copayment Assistance Programs, as more fully described in Exhibit A attached hereto.

2. PrudentRx Co-Pay Program.

- 2.1. General. PrudentRx shall provide the services set forth in Exhibit A in connection with the implementation and operation of the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program for Client and the Plan. The Parties acknowledge that the Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA") and the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010, as amended (the "ACA"). The Parties agree to work together (and, to the extent necessary, with CVS/caremark) to satisfy any applicable requirements under ERISA and the ACA that apply to the services provided to health plans described herein, and this Agreement shall be implemented and interpreted consistently with such intent. The Parties further acknowledge that PrudentRx is not a fiduciary of the Plan under ERISA. None of the provisions of this Agreement are intended to create nor shall be deemed or construed to create any relationship between the Parties other than that of independent entities contracting with each other solely to effect the purposes of the Agreement; and neither of the Parties to this Agreement, nor any of their respective trustees, officers, agents or employees shall be construed to be the partner, agent, employee or representative of the other.
- 2.2. <u>Compensation</u>. Client will pay to PrudentRx the amounts set forth in the compensation section of Exhibit A. PrudentRx shall calculate the service fee and invoice Client on a monthly basis. The invoice shall be

accompanied by a report detailing the items listed in Exhibit A. Payment of the service fee shall be due within 30 days of receipt by the Client. In no event shall the service fee be paid from any Plan assets.

2.3. Coordination with CVS/caremark. CVS/caremark has agreed to coordinate with PrudentRx in order to facilitate the implementation and operation of the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program adopted by Client. Client hereby directs and authorizes CVS/caremark to: (i) exclude amounts paid under Pharma Copayment Assistance Programs from Member deductible and annual Member out of pocket maximum obligation; (ii) provide to PrudentRx daily paid claims, daily reject files, and monthly claims files for Program Products dispensed to Participating Members so that PrudentRx may implement and operate the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program (collectively, "Client Data"); and (iii) provide PrudentRx with Member portal access for designated PrudentRx employees performing Participating Member benefit verification and eligibility in real time, if possible.

Compliance.

- 3.1. <u>PrudentRx Compliance.</u> PrudentRx represents and warrants that it shall comply with: (a) all applicable laws, rules and regulations in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement and the implementation and operation of the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program; and (b) all rules, requirements and restrictions of each Pharma Copayment Assistance Program, including, without limitation, exclusion of government program beneficiaries. PrudentRx represents and warrants that PrudentRx and its employees and agents: (x) shall possess, maintain and keep in full force and effect, all licenses, permits, registrations and other governmental authorizations necessary for the performance by PrudentRx of all of its obligations set forth in this Agreement in accordance with applicable law; and (y) are not excluded or otherwise ineligible to participate in federal health care programs as defined in 42 U.S.C. Sec. 1320a-7b.
- 3.2. <u>Client Compliance</u>. Client represents and warrants that it shall comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement. The PrudentRx Co-Pay Program is not recommended for high-deductible health plans ("HDHP") with health savings accounts ("HSA"). Client is solely responsible for evaluating compliance with the Internal Revenue Code and IRS guidance, in consultation with its own counsel, in connection with any contemplated implementation of the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program for any HDHPs or HSAs and Client is solely responsible for any loss, cost, damage or expense resulting from any such implementation.
- 3.3. <u>HIPAA</u>. In connection with the performance of this Agreement, the Parties shall comply with HIPAA, including the Standards for the Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information and the Standards for Electronic Transactions, and the Security Rule (45 C.F.R. Parts 160–64), and the Privacy provisions (Subtitle D) of the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act and its implementing regulations. PrudentRx and Client shall enter into a business associate agreement with respect to the activities to be conducted under this Agreement.
- 3.4. <u>Control of Plans</u>. The Parties acknowledge and agree that neither PrudentRx nor CVS/caremark shall be: (i) the administrator (as that term is defined in Section 3(16) of ERISA) of any Plan for any purpose; (ii) a named fiduciary with respect to any Plan for purposes of ERISA or any applicable state law; (iii) delegated discretionary authority or responsibility, or exercise discretionary authority or control, with respect to any Plan or its administration; or (iv) deemed to be a fiduciary with respect to any Plan for purposes of ERISA or any applicable state law.
- 4. Term & Termination. The initial term of this Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and continue thereafter for a period of one (1) year and shall thereafter automatically renew for additional one (1) year terms unless either Party provides written notice of non-renewal at least one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the end of the initial term or of any renewal term, subject to earlier termination as provided herein. This Agreement shall terminate (i) in the event of termination of the program coordination agreement between CVS/caremark and PrudentRx; or (ii) in the event of termination of the PBM Agreement. Either Party may terminate this Agreement upon written notice to the other Party: (a) if the other Party breaches any term of this Agreement and such breach is not cured within thirty (30) days of written notice thereof; or (b) if the other Party files a petition in bankruptcy, is adjudicated bankrupt, makes a general assignment for the benefit of its creditors, or is voluntarily or involuntarily dissolved. The Parties shall promptly notify CVS/caremark of any termination of this Agreement. Sections 2.3, 3, 5, 6 and 7 shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

- 5. <u>Indemnification</u>. PrudentRx shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless Client and its officers, directors, employees, and agents (collectively, "Client Indemnitees") from any and all claims, demands, actions, causes of action, losses, judgments, liabilities, damages, costs and expenses (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees, court costs and costs of settlement) (collectively, "Losses") that the Client Indemnitees, or any of them, may suffer as a result of: (a) the gross negligence or willful misconduct of PrudentRx and/or its employees or agents; (b) any breach by PrudentRx of this Agreement; or (c) any infringement, misappropriation, or violation by PrudentRx and/or its employees or agents of any right of a third party. Client shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless PrudentRx, CVS/caremark and their respective officers, directors, employees, and agents (collectively, "Contractor Indemnitees") from any and all Losses that the Contractor Indemnitees, or any of them, may suffer as a result of: (a) the gross negligence or willful misconduct of Client and/or its employees or agents; (b) any breach by Client of this Agreement; (c) any legal defect in the design or operation of any Plan; or (d) any implementation of the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program with any HDHP or HSA.
- Confidentiality. Each Party (a "Receiving Party") shall maintain the confidentiality of any Confidential Information received from the other Party (a "Disclosing Party") and shall take reasonable steps to implement any and all procedures necessary to safeguard the confidentiality of such Confidential Information. The Receiving Party shall not use the Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party for its own benefit or for the benefit of any third party, directly or indirectly, except as may be necessary to carry out or enforce this Agreement. For purposes hereof, "Confidential Information" means any confidential and/or proprietary information of the Disclosing Party, including, but not limited to (i) all information designated by the Disclosing Party as confidential or similar classification, (ii) all information provided by the Disclosing Party concerning or belonging to third persons with respect to which the Disclosing Party is under an obligation to maintain confidentiality, (iii) the terms, provisions and existence of this Agreement, and (iv) any and all documents, discs and other media upon which such data or information is contained. The foregoing notwithstanding, "Confidential Information" does not include any information that: (a) is or becomes generally available to and known by the public (other than as a result of an unpermitted disclosure directly or indirectly by the Receiving Party); (b) is or becomes available to the Receiving Party on a nonconfidential basis from a source other than the Disclosing Party, provided that such source is not bound by a confidentiality agreement or other obligation of secrecy to the Disclosing Party of which the Receiving Party has knowledge; or (c) has already been or is hereafter independently acquired or developed by the Receiving Party without violating any confidentiality agreement with or other obligation of secrecy to the Disclosing Party, Upon the termination of this Agreement, the Receiving Party shall cease use of and, upon request, deliver to the Disclosing Party all Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party that the Receiving Party may have in its possession or control; provided that one copy may be kept for archival purposes (subject to the confidentiality requirements of this Agreement).
- Release of Data. Client acknowledges and agrees that to the extent any data disclosed to PrudentRx includes Member information, such Member information shall be disclosed by CVS/caremark on behalf of Client and subject to the Business Associate Agreement between Client and PrudentRx. Client acknowledges that PrudentRx is not a downstream business associate of CVS/caremark for any purpose in connection with any disclosure of Member information or any other Client Data. Client agrees that CVS/caremark and its subsidiaries and affiliates, and each of their respective officers, directors, employees and agents, will have no liability arising, in whole or in part, from: (i) the release of Member information or any other Client Data by CVS/caremark to PrudentRx; (ii) the use or subsequent release of Member information or any other Client Data by PrudentRx or Client; or (iii) the implementation or operation of the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program.
- Miscellaneous. This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior oral and written negotiations and agreements of the Parties with respect thereto. This Agreement may only be amended by a signed document executed by the Parties and accepted by CVS/caremark. Neither Party may assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party and CVS/caremark. CVS/caremark is an intended third party beneficiary of this Agreement. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts and by electronic transmission, each of which shall be considered an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same agreement. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida without regard to its conflicts of law doctrine. The Parties agree that in the event of any litigation arising from this Agreement, the venue shall be the state or federal courts in Tampa, Florida, and the Parties hereby consent to venue and jurisdiction in those courts. No Party shall be liable nor deemed to be in default for any delay or failure in performance under this Agreement resulting, directly or indirectly, from acts of God, civil or military authority, pandemic, war, accidents, fires, explosions, earthquakes, floods, failure of transportation, or any similar or

dissimilar cause beyond the reasonable control of a Party. The Parties are independent contractors. Any notices required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be given in writing and sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, hand delivery or overnight courier which provides confirmation of delivery, sent to the applicable Party at the following addresses:

Exhibit A PrudentRx Co-Pay Program

Additional Defined Terms: In addition to the terms defined elsewhere in the Agreement, the following terms shall have the meanings set forth below when used in this Exhibit A:

"Benefit Cap" means the maximum dollar benefit available during a calendar year under a Pharma Copayment Assistance Program for a Specialty Product. If a Specialty Product does not have a Pharma Copayment Assistance Program, the Benefit Cap will be zero for such Specialty Product for purposes of the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program.

"Covered Class" means a therapeutic class that is included in the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program implemented for Client, as specified on <u>Attachment 1</u> to this <u>Exhibit A</u>. Updates to the Covered Classes will be communicated to Client from time to time.

"Essential Health Benefits" shall have the meaning given to such term at 42 U.S.C. § 18022(b), which currently includes items and services in the following ten benefit categories: (1) ambulatory patient services; (2) emergency services; (3) hospitalization; (4) maternity and newborn care; (5) mental health and substance use disorder services including behavioral health treatment; (6) prescription drugs; (7) rehabilitative and habilitative services and devices; (8) laboratory services, (9) preventive and welfness services and chronic disease management; and (10) pediatric services, including oral and vision care.

"HIPAA" means the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, as amended, the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act, as incorporated in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, and the implementing regulations promulgated thereunder, as amended from time to time and any applicable state laws relating to the privacy or security of personal or patient information.

"Member Cost Share" means the copayment, coinsurance or deductible that a Member is responsible for paying for a Specialty Product.

"Network Pharmacy" means a CVS/caremark specialty pharmacy that has contracted with Client, or CVS/caremark, to dispense Specialty Products to Members.

"Participating Member" means a Member who elects to participate in the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program.

"Plan Formulary" means the formulary or drug list adopted by the Plan.

"Prior Authorization" means an authorization that is required to be issued by a Plan or its pharmacy benefit manager as a condition to a Plan's obligation to reimburse the cost of a Specialty Product dispensed to a Member.

"Program Drug List" means the "PrudentRx Program Drug List," which is a listing of Specialty Products that will be included in the PrudentRx Copay Program for Client.

"Program Product" means a Specialty Product that is listed on the Program Drug List.

"Specialty Product" generally means a pharmaceutical, biotech or biological drug that requires special handling, is high cost, and/or is used in the management of chronic or genetic disease, including but not limited to, injectable, infused, or oral medications, or products that otherwise require special handling.

"Specialty Tier" means the adjudication tier for branded, single source prescription Specialty Products and other very high cost products.

Program Description: The PrudentRx Co-Pay Program shall consist of the following elements:

- Scope: Pharma Copayment Assistance Programs.
- <u>Plan Design</u>: Client shall adopt a plan design for Specialty Products in a Covered Class that consists
 of the following elements:
 - Specialty Tier: Client will implement a Specialty Tier. Products on the Specialty Tier shall be subject to a thirty percent (30%) Member Cost Share. All Specialty Products in a Covered Class shall be adjudicated at the Specialty Tier.
 - Non-Essential Health Benefits: Certain products in a Covered Class shall be deemed non-Essential Health Benefits.
 - Exception Process: When an amount equal to the Benefit Cap has been received from a Pharma Copayment Assistance Program for a Participating Member for a calendar year for a Program Product, the Plan shall implement an exception process whereby the Plan shall assume responsibility for the Member Cost Share for the Program Product for the remainder of the calendar year.
 - Deductible and OOP Max: Amounts paid for the benefit of a Member by a Pharma Copayment Assistance Program shall not be not counted towards the Member deductible or the Member annual out of pocket maximum obligation.
 - Summary Plan Description. The Client shall adopt language in its Summary Plan Description that aligns with the above requirements. A template for such language is provided on <u>Attachment 2</u> to this <u>Exhibit A</u>. Although PrudentRx will assist with the language in the Summary Plan Description, the Client and the Plan administrator remain responsible for fulfilling their fiduciary duties under ERISA with respect to the content of the Summary Plan Description.
- <u>Program Drug List</u>: PrudentRx shall develop a Program Drug List for Client, which Program Drug
 List shall be subject to review and approval by CVS/caremark to verify plan design alignment with
 the Plan Formulary (i.e. no cost share disadvantage of preferred formulary products).
- Member Notification & Enrollment: PrudentRx shall work in conjunction with Client to develop
 a communication and enrollment plan regarding the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program, to include the
 following:
 - Automatic enrollment in the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program for Members who are prescribed a medication on the Program Drug List, with the ability of a Member to opt out of the program for such medications.
 - Develop a general notice for all Members currently utilizing a Specialty Product in a Covered Class.
 - Develop a high touch comprehensive communication process for Members currently utilizing a Program Product.

PrudentRx shall conduct Member outreach for Member enrollment in the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program within one (1) business day of receipt of a claim for a Specialty Product in a Covered Class and shall complete Member enrollment in the applicable Pharma Copayment Assistance Program within three (3) business days of receipt of such claim, subject to Member satisfaction of the eligibility requirements of such Pharma Copayment Assistance Program. Within ten (10) days of the end of each month, PrudentRx shall provide to CVS/caremark and to Client a monthly report identifying Members that could not be reached and Members that could not be enrolled in the applicable Pharma Copayment Assistance Program.

- <u>Pharma Copayment Assistance Program Enrollment</u>: PrudentRx shall assist Participating Members with enrollment in Pharma Copayment Assistance Programs for Specialty Products and securing financial assistance under such Pharma Copayment Assistance Programs.
- Coordination with CVS/caremark. PrudentRx shall create a process to collaboratively work with CVS/caremark and, if requested by CVS/caremark, the Network Pharmacies, to ensure timely prescription processing with minimal member abrasion, to include notification to CVS/caremark of: (i) decision by a Member to not participate in the PrudentRx Copay Program; (ii) inability to contact a Member; (ii) election by a Member to participate in the PrudentRx Copay Program; and (iv) enrollment of a Participating Member in a Pharma Copayment Assistance Program.
- Claims Audits. On a monthly basis, Prudent Rx shall: (i) retroactively audit claims for the prior menth to ensure the PrudentRx Copay Program was implemented appropriately for each Participating Member for whom a claim was adjudicated in such month, including implementation of the exception process whereby the Plan assumes responsibility for the Member Cost Share; and (ii) provide a written report with the results of such audit to CVS/caremark within thirty (30) days of the end of the month subject to the audit. If any issues are identified, PrudentRx shall consult with CVS/caremark to coordinate on an appropriate resolution.
- Reporting. PrudentRx shall provide the following reports to Client:
 - On a monthly basis, PrudentRx will provide with its invoice a summary to Client of the claims it processed with respect to the Plan, which shall include the following metrics:
 - The PrudentRx Generated Savings realized by the Client, specified by the name of the Specialty Product and whother the PrudentRx Generated Savings result from a new or existing Member participating in the program
 - The service fee to PrudentRx resulting from the PrudentRx Generated Savings
 - A report detailing the adoption of the program, such as the number of Members enrolled and the number of newly enrolled Members
 - Details of the PrudentRx call center performance
 - On a semi-annual basis, PrudentRx will provide the results of a Member satisfaction survey.

These reports shall include other information requested by the Client. All information disclosed on the foregoing reports shall comply with the privacy requirements under HIPAA and any other applicable law.

Compensation: PrudentRx will receive from Client a service fee equal to twenty-five percent (25%) of PrudentRx Generated Savings. "PrudentRx Generated Savings" are calculated as the amount by which the "Current Plan Net Cost" exceeds the "New Plan Net Cost." The Current Plan Net Plan Cost is the Plan's gross cost of a Specialty Product, less the Current Copayment Percentage for specialty medications (without the application of any deductibles), each calculated as part of the opportunity analysis provided to Client by PrudentRx. The New Plan Net Cost is the Plan's gross cost of the Specialty Product, less generated savings, plus the Current Copayment Percentage for Specialty Products prior to the implementation of the PrudentRx Copay Program. There are no separate fees for administration, Member outreach and support, monthly reporting, or any of the other services provided by PrudentRx under this Agreement.

The "Current Copayment Percentage" is the lesser of: (i) ten percent (10%) or (ii) the percentage obtained by dividing the total copayments paid by Members for Specialty Products (without the application of any deductible) by the total gross cost of the Specialty Products for the Plan, each measured over the twelve (12) month period immediately preceding the Effective Date of this Agreement.

PrudentRx may engage third parties to render services in connection with the PrudentRx Program; PrudentRx may remit a portion of the PrudentRx service fee to such third parties.

PrudentRx Co-Pay Program for Specialty Medications

In order to provide a comprehensive and cost-effective prescription drug program for you and your family, [Insert Plan name] has contracted with PrudentRx to offer the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program for certain specialty medications. Participation in the program requires certain data to be shared with the administrators of these copay assistance programs, but please be assured that this is done in compliance with HIPAA. The PrudentRx Co-Pay Program assists members by helping them enroll in manufacturer co-pay assistance programs. Medications in the specialty tier will be subject to a 30% co-insurance. However, enrolled members who get copay card for their specialty medication (if applicable), will have a \$0 out-of-pocket responsibility for their prescriptions covered under the PrudentRx Copay Program.

Copay assistance is a process in which drug manufacturers provide financial support to patients by covering all or most of the patient cost share for select medications - in particular, specialty medications. The PrudentRx Co-Pay Program will assist members in obtaining co-pay assistance from drug manufacturers to reduce a member's cost share for eligible medications thereby reducing out-of-pocket expenses. Participation in the program requires certain data to be shared with the administrators of these copay assistance programs, but please be assured that this is done in compliance with HIPAA.

If you currently take one or more medications included in the PrudentRx Program Drug List, you will receive a welcome letter and phone call from PrudentRx that provides specific information about the program as it pertains to your medication. All eligible members will be automatically enrolled in the PrudentRx program, but you can choose to opt out of the program. You must call 1-800-578-4403 to opt-out. Some manufacturers require you to sign up to take advantage of the copay assistance that they provide for their medications - in that case, you must speak to someone at PrudentRx at 1-800-578-4403 to provide any additional information needed to enroll in the copay program. PrudentRx will also contact you if you are required to enroll in the copay assistance for any medication that you take. If you do not return their call, choose to opt-out of the program, or if you do not affirmatively enroll in any copay assistance as required by a manufacturer you will be responsible for the full amount of the 30% co-insurance on specialty medications that are eligible for the PrudentRx program.

if you or a covered family member are not currently taking, but will start a new medication covered under the PrudentRx Co-Pay Program, you can reach out to PrudentRx or they will proactively contact you so that you can take full advantage of the PrudentRx program. The PrudentRx Program Drug List may be updated periodically by the Plan.

An exception process is available for determining whether a medication that is not an essential health benefit is medically necessary for a particular individual.

BUSINESS ASSOCIATE ADDENDUM

This Business Associate Addendum ("BAA") supplements and is made a part of any written agreement or other understanding or arrangement entered into between PrudentRx LLC ("Business Associate") and Passaic County ["Health Plan"] for which Business Associate provides services pursuant to the Client Participation Agreement ("Services Agreement") entered into between the parties.

Health Plan and Business Associate mutually agree to the terms of this Addendum to comply with the HIPAA Rules as defined below.

This Addendum is effective as of the effective date of the Services Agreement.

1. Definitions

- (a) "Applicable Law" shall mean any national, state, regional and/or local laws, rules, regulations, security requirements and regulatory guidance applicable to either party's performance under the Services Agreement, including but not limited to those applicable to the Processing of Protected Health Information.
- (b) "Breach" shall have the same meaning as the term "Breach" in the HIPAA Rules, including but not limited to 45 CFR 164.402.
- (c) "HIPAA Rules" shall mean the Privacy, Security, Breach Notification and Enforcement Rules at 45 CFR Part 160 and Part 164.
- (d) "Individual" shall have the same meaning as such term as defined in 45 CFR 160.103 and shall include a person who qualifies as a personal representative in accordance with 45 CFR 164.502(g) or other applicable federal or state law.
- (e) "Process" means any operation which is performed upon Protected Health Information, whether or not by automatic means, including but not limited to the access, granting access to, acquisition, collection, recording, organization, storage, alteration, retrieval, consultation, use, disclosure, combination, transfer, blocking, return or destruction of Protected Health Information. "Processed," or "Processing" shall be construed accordingly.
- (f) "Protected Health Information" or "PHI" shall have the same meaning as such term is defined in 45 CFR 160.103, but limited to information created, accessed or received for or on behalf of Health Plan, or in the course of providing services for Health Plan.
- (g) "Secure" shall mean to render unusable, unreadable or indecipherable to unauthorized individuals through the use of a technology or methodology specified by the Secretary in the guidance issued under section 13402(h)(2) of the HITECH Act, as updated from time to time ("Guidance") which, in the case of electronic information, requires that it be encrypted in accordance with standards specified in such Guidance.
- (h) "Security Incident" shall mean the attempted or successful access, use, disclosure, modification, transmission, or destruction of PHI that is not authorized by the Services Agreement, this Addendum or the HIPAA Rules, or the interference with information systems containing PHI.

All capitalized terms used in this Addendum and not defined elsewhere herein or in the Services Agreement shall have the same meaning as those terms are used or defined in the HIPAA Rules.

2. Obligations of Business Associate

- (a) Business Associate shall not use or disclose PHI except as permitted or required by this Addendum to perform the services set forth in the Service Agreement or as Required by Law, and only in compliance with all Applicable Law.
- (b) Business Associate agrees to comply with the HIPAA Rules that apply to Business Associates concerning the confidentiality, privacy, and security of PHI.
- (c) Business Associate shall enter into a written agreement meeting the requirements of 45 CFR 164.504(e) and 164.314(a)(2) with any agent or Subcontractor that may have access to PHI, prior to the agent or Subcontractor obtaining such access. Any such agreement shall contain

restrictions, conditions and requirements that are at least as restrictive as those that apply to Business Associate in this Addendum.

- (d) Business Associate agrees to request, use and disclose PHI in compliance with the Minimum Necessary standard of the HIPAA rule.
- (e) Business Associate shall report any successful Security Incident, within the meaning of 45 CFR 164.304, of which Business Associate becomes aware within ten (10) days of such Security Incident if it is not otherwise reported to Health Plan pursuant to (f) below.
- Business Associate agrees to report any Breach or suspected Breach of Unsecured PHI in accordance with the requirements set forth in 45 CFR 164,400 et seg. immediately, but in no event later than within five (5) business days after it is discovered. A Breach shall be treated as discovered when any employee, director, officer, or agent of Business Associate knows or should have known of such Incident by exercising reasonable diligence. Such report shall be made by email to Business Associate shall provide the following information: (i) a brief description of what happened, including the date of the Breach and the date of the discovery of the Breach, if known; (ii) the individuals affected; (iii) a description of the data elements involved; (iv) a brief description of what Business Associate is doing to investigate, to mitigate harm to individuals, and to protect against any further incidents; and (v) any other information reasonably requested by Health Plan. If such information is not available to Business Associate at the time the Breach is required to be reported to Health Plan, Business Associate shall continue to diligently investigate and provide such information to Health Plan promptly as it becomes available. Business Associate shall maintain complete records regarding the Breach for the period required by 45 CFR 164.530(j) or such longer period required by state law, and shall make such records available to Health Plan promptly upon request.
- (g) Upon the Health Plan's written request, and in a reasonable time and manner, Business Associate agrees to provide to the Health Plan such PHI maintained by the Business Associate in a Designated Record Set as required for the Health Plan to respond to a request for access under 45 CFR 164.524.
- (h) Upon the Health Plan's written request, and in a reasonable time and manner, Business Associate agrees to make available PHI maintained by it in a Designated Record Set, and to make amendments to such PHI, in order for Health Plan to respond to a request for amendment under 45 CFR 164.526.
- (i) Upon written request by the Health Plan, and in a reasonable time and manner, Business Associate agrees to provide to the Health Plan information collected in accordance with Paragraph I of this Section for the Health Plan to provide an accounting under 45 CFR 164.528.
- (j) Business Associate agrees to make its internal practices, books, and records relating to the use and disclosure of PHI available to the Secretary of Health and Human Services or her/his designees or other government authorities in a time and manner designated by Health Plan or such governmental authorities, for purposes of determining compliance with Applicable Law. Business Associate shall provide a copy of such books and records to Health Plan at the same time as these are provided to the Secretary or other government authorities.
- (k) Business Associate shall maintain documentation of its obligations under this Addendum for a period of six (6) years following the later of (i) termination of this Addendum, or (ii) destruction or return of PHI, or such longer period as required by Applicable Law.

3. Security of Protected Health Information

(a) Business Associate agrees to use appropriate safeguards to protect against any use or disclosure of PHI not provided for herein and to comply, where applicable, with Subpart C of 45 CFR Part 164 with respect to Electronic PHI Without limiting the foregoing, Business Associate agrees it has implemented, documented and will maintain appropriate administrative, physical, and technical safeguards to protect against and prevent the unauthorized use and disclosure of PHI, and to protect the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of Electronic PHI.

- Business Associate will regularly test and monitor the effectiveness of its safeguards. controls, systems and procedures, and will periodically identify reasonably foreseeable internal and external risks to the security, confidentiality, integrity, and availability of the PHI, and ensure that these risks are addressed.
- Prior to allowing any Workforce members to Process any PHI, Business Associate shall provide the Workforce member with appropriate privacy and security training. Business Associate will also monitor its Workforce members for compliance with its obligations under this Addendum and the HIPAA Rules.

4. Permitted Uses and Disclosures of Protected Health Information.

- Subject to the limitations set forth in this Addendum, Business Associate may use and disclose PHI as necessary to provide its services as described in the Services Agreement.
- Business Associate may not de-identify PHI except as necessary to provide its services as described in the Services Agreement. Business Associate is prohibited from using or disclosing such de-identified information for its own purpose without the explicit written permission of Health Plan.

5. Term and Termination.

- (a) The term of this Addendum shall continue for so long as the Services Agreement remains in effect, except that (i) Section 5(b) shall survive after the termination of the Services Agreement for as long as Business Associate retains any PHI; and (ii) any provision that by its nature survives termination shall so survive.
- Effect of Termination, Upon termination of the Services Agreement for any reason. Business Associate shall, at the election of Health Plan, either return to Health Plan or destroy all PHI in its possession or that of its Subcontractors or agents. Electronic media containing PHI will be disposed of in a manner that renders the data unrecoverable. Upon request, Business Associate will provide Health Plan with a certification by an officer of the Business Associate to certify its compliance with this provision. Business Associate and its agents and Subcontractors shall retain no copies of the PHI.

6. Miscellaneous

- A reference in this Addendum to a section in the HIPAA Rules means the section as in effect or as amended, and as of its effective date.
- (b) Any ambiguity in this Addendum shall be resolved to permit compliance with the HIPAA Rules.

IMMUNIZATION SERVICE AGREEMENT

This IMMUNIZATION SERVICE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") by and between the party indicated below ("Client"), and Walgreen Co., on behalf of itself and its subsidiaries and affiliates ("Walgreens") is made and entered into on the date last signed by an authorized representative of both the Client and Walgreens (the "Effective Date"). Walgreens and Client may be individually referred to as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

For good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Client and Walgreens, by their signatures below, hereby agree Walgreens will provide the immunizations indicated in Attachment A, attached hereto and incorporated herein, consisting of dispensing and administering of such immunizations ("immunizations") to participants ("Participants") at mutually agreed upon location(s) outside of Walgreens' store locations, referred to as off-site locations, and/or at Walgreens' participating store locations through issuance of a voucher ("Covered Services").

For each Covered Service whether through a voucher, at an off-site location or both, Client or Participant, as applicable, will reimburse Walgreens at the rates set forth in Table1, below. Client acknowledges that the reimbursement rates set forth herein are Walgreens' confidential and proprietary information and Client agrees not to disclose the rates to any third-party other than as minimally necessary under the terms of this Agreement. WALGREENS COMMUNITY OFF-SITE CLINIC AGREEMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

I, WALGREENS' RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1.1 Covered Services. Subject to the limitations or restrictions imposed by federal and state contracts, laws, and regulations, and the availability of the appropriate Immunization, Waigreens will provide the Covered Services to Participants. With respect to such Covered Services, the Parties will comply with the procedures set forth herein. When required by state law, Walgreens will require Participants to 3.2 Late Payment. All sums owed by Client to Walgreens will bear interest of 1,5% provide a valid prescription from their physician or allow the health care professional to contact their physician to obtain a valid prescription; however, for influenza immunizations, Walgreens will be responsible for obtaining standing orders from physicians, Participants will be required to complete a Walgreens' vaccine administration record and consent form before receiving an immunization.
- 1.2 Professional Judgment. Walgreens may withhold Covered Services to a Participant for good cause, including but not necessarily limited to, Client's or Participant's (where applicable) falture to pay for Covered Services rendered; requests by Participant for services Inconsistent with the legal and regulatory requirements; or where, in the professional judgment of the health care professional, the services should not be rendered.
- 1.3 Provision of Healthcare Professional, if the Parities agree in writing that Walgreens will provide Covered Services at off-site locations, Walgreens will provide Client with the appropriate number of qualified health care professionals and technicians to provide Covered Services at such off-site locations. Any requests for additional personnel will be subject to mutual agreement by the Parties and may require additional agreed-upon fees to be paid by Client to Walgreens in accordance with this Agreement.

JL CLIENTS RESPONSIBILITIES

- 2.1 Vouchers. If the Portles agree in writing that Walgreens will provide Covered Services upon receipt of a voucher, Client will provide Participants with a youther (in a format agreeable to both Parties), which Participants may redeem at a participating Walgreens store location. Once the youther is approved by both Parties it may not be modified. Client may not rescind, retract, reduce or deny payment owed to Walgreens for claims where Covered Services have been provided to its Participants, even if Client no longer considers the individual redeeming the voucher
- 2.2 Off-Site Locations. If the Parties agree in writing, that Walgreens will provide Covered Services at off-site locations, Client will provide Participants with notice of the dates, times and locations for such off-site locations and provide a private, clean room location, tables and chairs for Waigreens' personnel and Participants. Additionally, Client guarantees that an average minimum of 25 immunizations will be administered to Participants at each of Client's off-site locations per influenza season (August - April) ("Site Minimum"), if Walgreens determines that the Site Minimum is not achieved for the influenza season (determined by taking the total number of Immunizations administered at all off-site locations divided by the number of off-site locations in such influenza season ("Site Averago")), at Walgreens' discretion, it will invoice Client for the difference between the Site Minimum and Site Average multiplied by the number of off-site events. The sum of which will be multiplied by the lowest relimburgement rate set forth in table in Attachment A and Client shalf pay such amount within 30 days of being invoiced by Waigreens.

III. PAYMENT AND BILLING

3.1 Payment. For Covered Services where: (i) Participant provides evidence of coverage under third-party insurance or a government funded program (e.g., Medicare) prior to the provision of Covered Services;(II) and Walgreens is contracted such third-party insurance or government funded program, Walgreens will submit the claim for that Participant and any copayment, coinsurance, deductible owed by the Participant will be collected at the time of service or billed at a later date. If such evidence is not provided at the time of service. Walgreens will either, as agreed to by the Parities, collect from the Participant or involco the Client monthly at the lesser of the prices stated herein or the Usual and Customary Charge, If a claim for reimbursement is later denied, the Parties agree that Walgreens can seek reimbursement from the Participant, As used in this Agreement, "Usual and Customary Charge" shall refer to the amount charged to a cash customer for an immunization by the administering pharmacy at the time of administration, exclusive of: (i) sales tax; (ii) discounts claimed, and (iii) discounts provided for

data elements, and no further information will be provided: Group ID, store number, prescription number, patient name, recipient number, physician name, cost, service fee, copayment amount, safes tax, total charge, date of service, and drug name/NDC. At the time of payment, Client will provide Walgreens with a written explanation of the specific claims for which payment is made,

per month from the date payment is due until paid; however, in no event will such interest rate be greater than the rate permitted by law. Client shall be solely responsible for any and all costs incurred by Walgreens in seeking collection of any definquent amounts owed by Client, Walgreens may invoice Client for Interest and costs due under this Section on a monthly basis and payment will be due within 30 days from receipt.

IV. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 4.1 Term and Termination. This Agreement will become effective on the Effective Date and shall continue in full force and effect for an initial term of one year. Upon expiration of the initial term, this Agreement will automatically renew for successive one-year terms. Either Porty may terminate this Agreement at any time without cause by giving at least thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the other Parly.
- 4.2 Effect of Termination, Termination will have no effect upon the rights or obligations of the Parties arising out of any transactions occurring prior to the effective date of such termination.
- 4.3 Walver. No waiver by either Party with respect to any breach or default of any right or remedy and no course of dealing may be deemed to constitute a continuous walver of any other breach or default or of any other right or remedy unless such waiver is expressed in writing by the Party to be bound.

V. INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

- 5.1 Insurance, Each Party will self-insure or maintain at its sole expense, and in amounts consistent with industry standards, such insurance as may be necessary to Insure each respective Party, its employees, and agents against any claim or claims for damages arising out of or in connection with its duties and obligations under this Agreement. Waigreens will automatically name Cilent as Additional insured under its applicable insurance policy(les). Evidence of such insurance can be downloaded from Walgreans' website. Client will provide a memorandum or certificate of Insurance coverage to Walgreens upon request.
- 5.2 Indemnification. To the extent permitted by law, each Party will indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the other Party, including its employees and agents, from and against any and all third-party claims or liabilities arising from the negligence or wrongful act of the indemnifying Party, its employees, or agents in carrying out its duties and obligations under the terms of this Agreement. This Section will survive the termination of this Agreement.

VI. GENERAL TERMS

- 6.1 Confidentiality of PHI. Both Parties warrant that they will maintain and protect the confidentiality of all individually identifiable health information specifically relating to Participants ("Protected Health Information" or "PHI") in accordance with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 and all applicable federal and state laws and regulations. However, nothing herein will limit either Party's use of any aggregated Participant Information that does not contain PHI. This Section will survive the termination of this Agreement,
- 6.2 Advertising. Neither Party may advertise or use any trademarks, service marks, or symbols of the other Party without first receiving the written consent of the Party owning the mark and/or symbol with the following exceptions: Client may use the name and the addresses of Walgreans' locations in materials to inform Participants that Walgreens provides Covered Services. Any other reference to Walgreens in any Client materials must be pre-approved, in writing, by Walgreens,
- 6.3 Force Majeure. The performance by either Party hereunder will be excused to the extent of circumstances beyond such Party's reasonable control, such as flood, comado, earthquake, or other natural disaster, epidemic, war, material destruction of facilities, fire, acts of terrorism, acts of God, etc. In such event, the Parties will use their best efforts to resume performance as soon as reasonably possible under the
- 6.4 Compliance: The Parties will comply with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations for each jurisdiction in which Covered Services are provided under this Agreement. Each Party will cooperate with reasonable requests by the other Party

for information that is needed for its compilance with applicable laws, rules, and/or supersedes any previous contract, for which the signatories are authorized to sign regulations

6:5 Assignment. Nakher Porty may assign this Agreement to a third-party without the prior written consent of the other Party, except that either Party will have the right to assign this Agreement to any direct or indirect parent, subsidiary or affiliated company or to a successor company without such consent. Any permitted assignee will assume all obligations of its assignor under this Agreement. for COVID-19 at 1315 Route 17 South, Ramsey, New Jersey 07446; and

WHEREAS, there exists a need for testing for COVID-19 to determine if

individuals quarantining at Best Western are clear of the virus and, if so, said individuals

can be released from quarantine and must vacate the hotel rooms; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality has received grant monies from the Center for

Disease Control Foundation (hereafter "CDC") to hire personnel to go to Best Western

and provide, administer, and process the appropriate COVID-19 testing of said

individuals presently quarantining/residing at Best Western to determine the present

COVID-19 status of said individuals:

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions set forth herein

and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which are hereby

acknowledged, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

I. Term and Termination.

a. Term. The Agreement shall remain in effect for a term of IMMEDIATELY to

December 31, 2020.

b. Termination for Cause. If either Party breaches any provision of this

Agreement and if such breach is not cured within thirty (30) days after receiving written

notice from the other party specifying such breach in reasonable detail, the non-breaching

party shall have the right to terminate this agreement by giving written notice thereof to

the Party in breach, which termination shall go into effect immediately on receipt.

c. Termination without Cause. The County may terminate this Agreement

without cause upon notice to Municipality in writing.

II. Provision of Service.

a. The Municipality agrees to provide personnel, equipment, and testing at Best

Western and the County agrees to accept said personnel to test for COVID-19 at Best

Western for the primary purpose of assisting the County in determining if quarantining

individuals at Best Western can be released from quarantine and vacate the hotel rooms.

b. The Municipality acknowledges that it has received a CDC grant for the

express purpose of hiring personnel and providing, administering, and processing

COVID-19 testing. The Municipality will use grant funds received from the CDC to hire

personnel to provide, administer, and process COVID-19 testing at no cost to the County

at the Best Western and agrees to advise the County of the test results.

III. Reporting. The Municipality agrees to report to the County by its personnel the

results of the COVID-19 testing so that the County can appropriately release quarantining

individuals who must vacate the hotel rooms. Reporting shall be made to the County as

is contained in Article VII, Notices herein.

IV. Indemnification. The County shall defend, indemnify, protect and hold harmless

the Municipality, its officers, agents, servants, and employees from and against any and

all suits, claims, demands or damages of any kind or nature, arising out of, or claimed to

arise out of, any act, error, or omission of Municipality, its consultants, contractors,

agents, servants and employees strictly in furtherance of this agreement.

V. Governing Law. This Agreement is being executed and is intended to be performed in the State of New Jersey and shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

VI. Assignment. This Agreement shall not be assigned, delegated, or transferred by any Party without the written consent of the other parties; provided, however, that either Party may assign this Agreement to any successor by way of merger, consolidation, or sale of substantially all of its assets or of voting control of its securities. This Agreement is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the successors and permitted assigns of each respective Party to the extent necessary to carry out the intent of this Agreement. VII. Notices. Any notices and other communications provided for in this Agreement to made by either of the parties to the other Party shall be in writing and shall be deemed given if delivered personally or sent by United States mail, registered or certified, postage paid, by overnight delivery service or express courier service, by electronic mail, return receipt, or by facsimile, with confirmation of receipt, at the following addresses:

VIII. Severability/Waiver. All agreements and covenants contained herein are severable, and in the event any of them shall be held to be invalid by any competent

court, this Agreement shall be interpreted as if such invalid agreements or covenants were not contained herein. Should one or more covenants or conditions be waived by either party, such waiver shall not be deemed to waive or render unnecessary the consent or approval of the waiving party to or of any subsequent similar act by the other party.

IX. Force Majeure. Neither Party shall have any liability to the other Party for any failure or delay caused by events beyond the County or the Municipality's control, including, without limitation, be it failure to furnish necessary information, fire, flood, earthquake, sabotage and accident, if the Party affected shall give prompt notice of any such cause to the other Party. The Party giving such notice shall thereupon be excused from such of its obligations hereunder as it is thereby disabled from performing for so long as it is so disabled; provided however, that such affected Party commences and continues to take reasonable and diligent actions to cure such cause.

X. Counterparts. This Agreement may be signed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Any signature page delivered by facsimile or electronic image transmission shall be binding to the same extent as an original signature page. Any Party that delivers a signature page by facsimile or electronic image transmission shall deliver an original signature page by facsimile or electronic image transmission shall deliver an original counterpart to the other Party upon request.

XI. Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains all of the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties and supersedes all other negotiations, representations, and understandings of the Parties, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter.

XII. Amendment/Modifications. This Agreement may be amended only by an instrument in writing signed by the Parties and effective as of the date stipulated therein. 1. Provide a description of the stigma-free efforts, planned or already in place, in the targeted municipality.

The City of Passaic recognizes that stigma is the most prevalent barrier to individuals seeking help and recovering from the disease of mental disorders. To date, the City has not implemented any stigma-free efforts. However, the City is committed to this work and is seeking to use the requested funds to open a community wide dialogue about mental illness.

2. Provide a summary of stigma-free activities and/or awareness campaign(s) to be conducted (in-person activity nor required due to COVID-19).

The campaign will begin by placing, information about the prevalence of mental health conditions, and more importantly resources available to our residents for them to seek help and to realize that they are not alone, on the City of Passaic web site. We will put an emphasis on the fact that with help and treatment people with mental disorders can recover. All information on both the web site and other venues will be in English and Spanish, as our City is 68% Latino and many residents have limited English proficiency. The Latino community suffers more than others in not understanding that resources are available. There are also cultural barriers that we seek to have our residents overcome.

Our next step will be to propose a resolution to our City Council that will recognize that stigma is the most prevalent barrier to people seeking help and recovering from the disease of mental disorders. This proclamation will help to open a community wide dialogue about mental illness. We will subsequently form a task force of the Passaic Municipal Alliance members, our Mayor, business owners, school officials, the police department, and other stakeholders. We already have a youth task force for substance abuse prevention that is willing to work on this closely related issue.

Our task force will plan and host a town hall meeting about stigma and recovery and we will conduct a mental health first aid training (with the help of mental health professionals) for residents and community groups. We will also conduct on-line mental health awareness and first aid trainings for City employees.

Lastly, we will print posters and flyers (in both English and Spanish) promoting the Stigma Free message and encouraging recovery. The posters will be placed in schools and businesses and flyers will be distributed at any health fairs the Alliance produces and/or participates in.

3. Describe other funding sources to support this initiative, if any:

There are no additional funds allocated to this effort. However, we will leverage approximately \$500.00 in kind services such as web site additions, Director's input with City Council, Mayor, etc., and personnel at health fairs.

4. Describe what the funding will be used for (attach a detailed budget):

Funding for the City of Passaic's campaign will be used to provide support for personnel staff, and to distribute materials for the promotion of events and information needed for campaign related services. All funding will be used to help the City eradicate the stigma associated with mental health disorders. The following is our proposed budget:










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1.0 Background

It Pay\$ to Plug In (Program) provides grants to offset the cost to purchase, install, and maintain electric vehicle charging stations in New Jersey. This program is designed to expand New Jersey's growing network of electric vehicle infrastructure, allowing residents, businesses, organizations, and government agencies to purchase and drive electric vehicles (EVs). EVs reduce greenhouse gases and other pollutants and improve air quality.

1.1 Program Overview

The Program is a reimbursement program that reduces the cost of purchasing, installing, and maintaining Level 1, Level 2, and DC Fast Charging stations at qualifying locations that provide public, workplace, multi-unit dwelling, eMobility, and corridor charging. Public and private entities may participate in the Program.

2.0 Definitions

A is Amps.

Applicant is the entity that owns or is responsible for the operation of the Charging Stations. The applicant is the recipient of the reimbursement grant.

CHAdeMO is a type of DCFC connector standard on some Asian EVs, including the Nissan Leaf.

Corridors are heavily-traveled roadways: toll roads, interstates, US routes, and NJ routes.

DC Fast Charging Station (DCFC) is a protocol for rapidly charging EV batteries by supplying power directly to the batteries in the form of direct current voltage, rather than going through a vehicle charging circuit. Typical power outputs are several hundred VDC at several hundred amps. There are two different standard connectors used for DCFC: SAE J1772 CCS (combo connector) and CHAdeMO.







Electric Vehicle (EV) is a four-wheel light duty vehicle capable of highway speeds that is powered fully or in part by an electric motor and is rechargeable from an external connection to an off-board electrical source.

Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment (Charging Station) is the physical location a vehicle will plug in to charge. It includes all hardware and software required to connect and electric vehicle to a suitable electrical supply. A typical charging station consists of a console wired into the electrical supply and a cable and connector to plug into the electric vehicle.

eMobility is shared mobility, such as electric taxis, car sharing, and ride hailing services.

Installation Date is the date on which the charging station is affixed to its permanent location, connected to the electrical source, and ready for use (including connection to a network if applicable).

Installation Location is a parking lot, flat lot, or designated area associated with the public place, workplace, multi-unit dwelling, or corridor. Projects that feature parking lots of immense area may be separated by building or entrance (ex. Shopping malls, sports stadiums, etc).

installer is the entity that installs the charging station. The Installer may or may not be the same as the Equipment Owner

It Pay\$ to Plug In (Program) is a program that provides incentives for the purchase and installation of electric vehicle charging stations in New Jersey. It is run by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's Bureau of Mobile Sources.

kW is kilowatts.

Level 1 Charging Station (Level 1) is an EV charging protocol providing 120 VAC up to 12 A. Power is supplied via an SAE J1772 connector.

Level 2 Charging Station (Level 2) is an EV charging protocol providing 240 VAC at currents ranging from 12 A to 80 A. Power is supplied via an SAE J1772 connector. The most common Level 2 charging stations are 30 A to 40 A.

Multi-Unit Dwelling (MUD) is multi-family residences, including apartments, condominiums, and townhouses. There must be a minimum of 4 units.

NJDEP is the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.

Port is one charging station connection to one vehicle, capable of supplying the full rated power of the charging station. In the case of Level 2 charging stations, a port is one SAE J1772 connector. In the case of DCFC stations, one port may include both a CHAdeMO and CCS connector if only one connector can be used at a time. In all cases, if a charging station has multiple connectors but reduces the power to each connector when multiple vehicles are plugged in, then this counts as only one port.

Program Administrator is the Bureau of Mobile Sources which is responsible for receiving and reviewing applications for the Program, responding to questions from Program participants, and conducting other administrative tasks related to the Program.





SAE J1772 or J1772 is a North American standard connector for plugging into EVs, established by the SAE International. The standard includes physical, electrical, communication, and performance requirements. The J1772 connector is used for both Level 1 and Level 2 charging.

SAE J1772 CCS or "combo connector" is the protocol standard that adds pins to the J1772 connector to allow DC fast charging. This connector is most commonly supported by North American and European EVs equipped for fast charging.

Site Owner is the owner of the site at which the charging station is installed. The Site Owner may or may not be the same as the applicant.

VAC is volts alternating current.

VDC is voits direct current.



3.0 Program Eligibility

3.1 Applicant Eligibility

To be eligible for the Program, an applicant must meet the following conditions:

- Be licensed to do business in New Jersey, including businesses, government entities, non-profit
 organizations, educational institutions, and multi-unit dwellings (apartments, condominiums,
 and townhouses). Private residential dwellings other than multi-unit dwellings are <u>not</u> eligible
 for grants.
- The applicant must comply with the requirements in the <u>Certification Checklist</u> and the <u>Deadlines Acknowledgement Form.</u>
- The applicant may be asked to provide access to the charging stations for site visits by program staff to verify installation.
- Level 1 and Level 2 charging station applicants may not be approved for more than \$500,000.00 in projects in a calendar year.
- Previous applications submitted are subject to the previous Terms & Conditions of the Program.
 The revised requirements in this document will only be applied to new applications submitted after April 22, 2020.

3.2 Location Eligibility

Eligible locations include:

Level 1 and Level 2 Charging Stations

Workplaces: Charging stations for employees who drive electric vehicles. Examples include chargers for employees who drive electric vehicles to work, chargers for fleet vehicles, and visitors if desired. We recommend (but do not require) that employers with more than 50 employees use an employee survey (sample provided in "Plug-In Electric Vehicle Handbook for Workplace Charging Hosts") to determine the number of Level 1 and Level 2 charging stations that may be needed to satisfy demand.





- Public Places: Charging stations that are exclusively available to the general public. Examples include, but are not limited to, charging station in downtown areas, public parking lots and garages, hotels, transit centers, destinations and attractions, colleges and universities, retail parking areas, and public parks.
- o <u>Multi-Unit Dwellings</u>: Charging stations for multi-family residences, including apartments, condominiums, and townhouses. There must be a minimum of 4 units.
- o <u>eMobility</u>: Charging stations that are associated with shared mobility programs, such as electric taxicabs, car-sharing programs, or ride hailing services.

DC Fast Charging Stations


- o Corridors: Charging stations located within one (1) mile driving distance from an exit or intersection along designated major travel corridors. See definition on page 3. The site must not have any existing DC Fast Charging Stations in operation.
- o <u>eMobility</u>: Charging stations that are included in shared mobility, car-sharing programs, or ride hailing services.



Charging Station Eligibility

The following requirements apply to Level 1, Level 2, and DC Fast charging stations:

- Each charging station must be located at a parking space that is designated for electric vehicles only and marked with appropriate signage and floor paint outlining the parking spots. A dualport charging station must have two EV-only parking spaces.
- Parking spaces shall be adequately lit from dusk to dawn and located safe from flow of traffic.
- Bollards shall be placed to protect the charging station equipment. Any stand-alone charging station boilards should be 3 to 4-feet high with concrete footings placed to protect the electric vehicle supply equipment (EVSE) from accidental impact and to prevent damage from equipment used for snow removal.
- Must be installed in New Jersey.
- Must be kept operational and in service for a minimum of five (5) years.
- Charging stations must be ADA compliant and follow all applicable laws, ordinances, regulations and standards.
 - (https://afdc.energy.gov/files/u/publication/WPCC_complyingwithADArequirements_1114.pdf)
- Must be tamper-resistant and deter vandalism.
- Must incorporate a cord management system or method to minimize the potential for cable entanglement, user injury, or connector damage.
- Charging station display screens shall be user friendly and easy to operate. Display shall be readable in direct sunlight and at night. Display must be protected from malfunctions due to condensation and normal local weather conditions.
- Must be capable of operating over an ambient temperature range of minus 22 to 122 degrees Fahrenheit with a relative humidity of up to 95%.
- Charging stations shall be certified to one of the following options:
 - Underwriters Laboratories (UL) 2594 (Standard for Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment);
 - o An equivalent Nationally Recognized Testing Laboratory (NRTL) program to demonstrate compliance with appropriate product safety test standards. A complete list of accredited NRTLs can be found online at: https://www.osha.gov/dts/otpca/nrtl/nrtllist.html. Supporting evidence must be provided.









- Networked charging stations must display real-time operational status on a smartphone application, with a thorough network-specific application or third-party aggregator.
- Public charging stations must be accessible by all drivers regardless of network memberships or subscriptions, and drivers must not be required to pay a subscription fee or otherwise obtain a membership in any network, club, association, or organization as a condition of using such electric vehicle charging station.
- For charging station sessions that require payment, real-time pricing and fee information shall be displayed on device or payment screen.

Level 1 Charging Stations

Applicants must install a minimum of 5 charging ports.
 Each station must be capable of providing electric power at each plug at a minimum of 1.4kW continuous.

Level 2 Charging Stations


- Applicants must install a minimum of 2 charging ports per location and may apply for a maximum of 20 ports per location.
- Each port must offer a SAE J1772 compatible connector.
- Each port must be capable of providing a minimum of 7.2kW continuous.

The charging station must connect to a network by wired ethernet, Wi-Fi, or cellular connection. (See Network and Data Reporting Requirements below for more information.)

DC Fast Charging Stations

- Must be located on a corridor or within one (1) mile driving distance from an exit or intersection or part of an eMobility project.
- The charging station must be exclusively available to the general public unless it is part of an eMobility project.
- Applicants must install a minimum of 2 charging ports per location.
- Applicants may only receive reimbursement for 2 charging ports per location. Additional ports
 may be installed, but they will not be covered by the grant program.
- Each charging station must offer both CHAdeMO and SAE CCS charging protocol connectors and shall be considered to be one port.
- For corridor charging stations, each port must be capable of providing a minimum of 150kW
 continuous to each vehicle that is charging, if multiple vehicles may be charged simultaneously
 at the same station or location, the power available to each vehicle shall not be less than
 150kW.
- The charging station must connect to a network by wired ethernet, Wi-Fi, or cellular connection.
 (See Network Requirements below for more information.)
- The charging station shall use the latest approved version of the Open Charge Point Protocol.
- Charging stations that require payment must at minimum be equipped with a credit card reader
 that allows users to pay using credit and debit cards without incurring excessive fees,
 inconvenience, or delays compared to other payment methods. Multiple point-of-sale payment
 methods are encouraged; additional payment options may include, but are not limited to, pay
 per use subscription methods, RFID or smart cards, toll-free telephone numbers, and smart
 phone applications.









- Charging stations must maintain a 95% annual uptime requirement. Should repair be necessary, service must be contacted within 24 hours and the station up and fully operational within 48 hours to ensure a 95% annual uptime guarantee.
- Charging stations must be accessible to the general public 24 hours a day and 7 days a week.
 Charging stations must provide customer support service that is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week via a toll-free telephone number posted on or near the charging station, and that is clearly visible to the user.

3.4 Network and Data Reporting Requirements

Network must provide the option for remote management and access control.

Stations shall collect usage data for data reporting, including, but not limited to:

- Charging data such as date and time of usage (start and stop times);
- Number of charging events;
- Total energy (kWh) per charging event;
- Total dollar amount charged to the user (if applicable);
- Station status and health in real time;
- Malfunction or operating errors;
- Unique ID for identifying the EVSE;
- Other non-dynamic EVSE information such as GPS ID; and
- Percentage or length of time of station downtimes.

Usage data shall be provided to the DEP Bureau of Mobile Sources on a quarterly basis. The grant agreement will provide specific data to be submitted and the required data format to be used.

4.0 Reimbursement Amounts and Eligible Costs


To ensure reimbursement under this program, do not purchase or begin installing a charging station until NJDEP has approved this application and has finalized a grant agreement between NJDEP and the applicant.

Eligible costs include those costs necessary for, and directly connected to, the acquisition, installation, operation and maintenance of new charging stations. Eligible costs include a maintenance agreement and network subscription for up to five (5) years. Signage and painting specific to the EV parking spots are eligible installation costs. The following are not eligible costs: purchase or rental of real estate, other capital costs (e.g., construction of buildings, parking facilities, etc.) or general maintenance (i.e., maintenance other than of the charging equipment).

Upon completion of work in accordance with the eligibility criteria and grant agreement requirements, NJDEP will reimburse each applicant for a percentage of eligible costs, up to a maximum of:

- Level 1: \$750 per Level 1 charging port;
- Level 2: \$4,000 per Level 2 charging port;
- DC Fast Charger: \$200,000 per location (2 port minimum).

Reimbursement is contingent upon availability of funding.

Leasing Option:

Lease payments in accordance with the above maximum reimbursement amounts and applicable percentages are an eligible cost. Payments will be disbursed yearly for the length of a five-year lease or until maximum grant amount is reached.

5.0 Approval and Selection Process

Level 1 and Level 2 Charging Stations

Applicants will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis, and funds will be allocated to approved projects until depleted.

The NIDEP reserves the right to limit the number of approved charging ports per applicant.

DC Fast Charging Stations

Applicants will be considered after the closing of the competitive solicitation period. Corridor DCFC locations will be evaluated on the following selection criteria:

- 150kw charger
- DCFC suitability scores
- Current and projected EV registration concentrations
- Gaps in coverage along major corridors (to comply with the 25 mile EV Law requirement)
- Proximity to amenities. *

eMobility Stations

Applicants with projects in disproportionately impacted communities will receive priority for funding.

The NJDEP reserves the right to limit the number of approved charging stations per applicant.



^{*}Proximity shall be measured in driving distance.





6.0 Procedure

Level 1 and Level 2 Charging Station Procedure


- Complete the <u>Application</u>, Level 1 and Level 2 <u>Project Information Form</u>, <u>Certification Checklist</u>, <u>Deadlines Acknowledgement Form</u>, and <u>W-9 form</u> and submit to NJDEP Bureau of Mobile Sources at <u>DriveGreen@dep.nj.gov</u>. Also, you must register your organization for <u>NJSTART</u> if you have not already done so.
- 2. NJDEP will review the information submitted and notify the applicant as to whether or not the proposed charging station(s) were approved. For those projects that qualify, NJDEP will provide and execute a grant agreement (DEP-069MG or DEP-069G) with the applicant. The applicant will be required to sign and must meet all requirements of the grant agreement and attachments. To ensure reimbursement under this program, do not purchase or begin installing a charging station until this agreement is finalized.
- 3. Installation of the charging stations must be completed within nine months of NJDEP grant execution.
- 4. After installation, the applicant must submit the following to the NJDEP Bureau of Mobile Sources at DriveGreen@dep.nj.gov:
 - a. Reimbursement Request Form
 - b. Invoices
 - c. Proof of Payment
 - d. Installed Site Photo: photo of the charging station installed so the equipment is visible at its site
 - e. Display Screen Photo: photo of the display screen to verify the charging station is operational and connected to the network if applicable.
 - f. Serial Number Photo: photo of the serial number on each charging station
- 5. The applicant must also report the new station to the Alternative Fuels Data Center for listing on their website and maps (<u>https://afdc.energy.gov/stations/#/station/newi</u>. Chargers that are restricted to employee use only or fleet use only may be designated as "private" in the "Type of Access" field.
- 6. NJDEP will review these invoices to determine if costs are appropriate to the agreed upon project, and if so, issue a check for the approved grant amount not to exceed payment receipts. Although NJDEP will reserve funding for each application approved, reimbursement will occur only after the work has been completed in a manner that satisfies the NJDEP grant criteria and the charging station has been placed in service.



- 2. The applicant must also submit evidence of site control at the time of application. Evidence of site control could be a letter of intent from the site host (for commercial entities) or a board resolution authorizing the project (for municipal entities).
- 3. Once the application period closes, NJDEP will review the information submitted and rank all submitted applications based on the ranking criteria.
- 4. NJDEP will notify the applicant as to whether or not the proposed charging station(s) were approved. For those projects that are approved, NJDEP will provide and execute a grant agreement (DEP-069G) with the applicant. The applicant will be required to sign and must meet all requirements of the grant agreement and attachments included. To ensure reimbursement under this program, do not purchase or begin installing a charging station until this agreement is finalized.

7.0 **Ongoing Requirements**

Applicants must continue to own and operate the charging equipment for a period of no less than five (5) years from the date of installation.









For networked stations, the applicant must provide usage data to the DEP Bureau of Mobile Sources on a quarterly basis for the duration of the five (5) years. For non-networked stations, the applicant must provide NJDEP with quarterly data reporting on electricity use and number of regular users, to the best extent possible. The grant agreement will provide specific data to be submitted and the required data format to be used.

NJDEP may require applicants to participate in surveys and may request participation from applicants in other research efforts that support Program goals.

Grantees that fail to meet the requirements for years-in-service, up-time, and routine delivery of data may be declared ineligible for future charging stations grants from the DEP.

WITNESSETH:

LEGAL AUTHORITY:

WHEREAS, N.J.S. 40A:11-11 (5), specifically authorizes two or more contracting units to enter into a Cooperative Pricing System and Agreement for the purchase of work, materials and supplies; and

WORK TO BE PERFORMED:

WHEREAS, the Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission will conduct a Cooperative Pricing System with Participating Contracting Units, utilizing administrative purchasing services and facilities of the PVSC; and this Cooperative Pricing Agreement is to effect substantial economies in the purchase of goods and supplies; and

WHEREAS, the PVSC wishes to operate the North Jersey Wastewater Cooperative Pricing System (herinafter referred to as the NJWCPS) with the Bergen County Utilities Authority (BCUA), the Joint Meeting of Essex and Union Counties (JMEUC), the Pequannock, Lincoln Park, and Fairfield Sewerage Authority- Two Bridges (TBSA), the Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority, the Rahway Valley Sewerage Authority, the Town of Morristown, the Township of Wayne, the City of Asbury Park, the Linden Roselle Sewerage Authority, the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority, the Township of Mine Hill, the Musconetong Sewerage Authority, the Borough of Fair Lawn, the Township of Morris, the Village of Ridgewood, the Rockaway Valley Sewerage Authority, the Atlantic County Utilities Authority, the Township of Wall, the Township of Readington, the Borough of South Plainfield, the Borough of Lodi, the Borough of Madison, the Secaucus Municipal Utilities Authority, the Two Rivers Water Reclamation Authority, the Borough of Point Pleasant, the Township of Branchburg, the Township of Parsippany-Troy Hills, the Township of Springfield, the Township of Neptune, the Township of Verona, the Borough of Lindenwold and the North Bergen Utilities Authority as well as other appropriate Public Agencies within or contingent to Northern New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, all parties hereto have approved the within Agreement by Ordinance or Resolution as appropriate, in accordance with the aforesaid statute; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of all parties to enter into such Agreement for said purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the conditions hereinafter set forth, it is mutually

agreed as follows:

1. The goods or supplies to be priced cooperatively may include Spare Parts, instrumentation Equipment, Maintenance Chemicals, Motor Repair/Replacement, Mechanical Seals, Safety Equipment, Electrical Equipment, Laboratory Supplies, Bulk Chemicals and such other items as two or more participating contracting units in the system agree can be purchased on a cooperative basis, providing the PVSC consents to these other items.

The items and classes of items which may be designated by the participating contracting units hereto may be purchased cooperatively for the period commencing with the execution of this Agreement and continuing until terminated as hereinafter provided. ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATION OF SYSTEM:

- 2. The PVSC, on behalf of all participating contracting units, at the beginning of participating in the NJWCPS, and during each January thereafter, shall publish a legal advertisement in such format as required by the State Division of Local Government Services in a newspaper normally used for such purposes by it to include such information as:
 - (1) The name of the participating contracting units, and
 - (2) The name of the Cooperative Pricing System soliciting competitive bids or Informal quotations, and
 - (3) The address and telephone number of the NJWCPS, and
 - (4) The State Identification Code for the Cooperative Pricing System, and
 - (5) The expiration date of the Cooperative Pricing Agreement.
- 3, The specifications shall be prepared and approved by the NJWPCS and filed as required by law, and no changes shall thereafter be made except as permitted by law. Nothing herein shall be deemed to prevent changes in specifications for subsequent purchases.
- 4. The NJWPCS may provide the Participating Units with the copies of the specifications at least thirty (30) days prior to seeking bids and will notify the Participating Confracting Units, in writing, of the item(s) on which it will seek bids. Fifteen (15) days prior to advertising, each of the participating contracting units shall designate, in writing, to the NJWCPS, the items to be purchased and indicate therein the approximate quantities desired, the location for delivery and other requirements, to permit the preparation and filing of specifications as provided by law.

The NJWPCS will call a meeting of all Participating Contracting Units each December in order to provide the participants with an opportunity to discuss the goods or services to be priced cooperatively and the terms of the specifications for the next calendar year.

- A single advertisement for bids or the solicitation of informal quotations for the goods or services to be purchased shall be presented on behalf of all of the Participating Contracting Units desiring to purchase any item by the NJWPCS in the Cooperative Pricing System.
- 6. In seeking bids the NJWCPS will include in the specifications two categories upon which bids are sought: (a) the NJWCPS's requirements, stated in definite quantities; and (b) the Participating Contracting Units, stated as an estimated total quantity of the needs of all the other Participating Contracting Units, which total shall not be exceeded in the aggregate by more than 20 percent of the total cost awarded for that Category. The specification for this category shall list the other Participating Contracting Units, their delivery address, their estimated maximum quantities and other relevant information to permit the bidder to understand what is potentially involved. The bids will contain: (1) a provision stating that contracts shall be in compliance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-5.5 (B), open-end

Introduced on: Adopted on: Official Resolution#: R20200852 contract rules; and (2) language requiring the bid price(s) to be stated so that it is uniform with respect to both categories (the NJWCPS and other Participating Contracting Units).

The provision with respect to the other contracting units category will allow the bidder to indicate if it is willing to provide the item(s) bid upon to other participating contracting units in the system; or if it is not willing to extend prices to other participating units in the systems.

- 7. The NJWCPS shall advertise for bids or the solicitation of informal quotations and shall receive bids or quotations on behalf of all Participating Contracting Units. Following the receipt of bids, the NJWCPS shall review said bids and on behalf of all Participating Contracting Units, either reject all or certain of the bids or make an award to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders for each separate item. This award shall result in the NJWCPS entering into a master contract with the successful bidder(s)
- 8. The NJWCPS shall enter into a formal written contract(s), when required by law, directly with the successful bidder(s) only after it has certified the funds available only for its own needs ordered. Each Participating Contracting Unit shall also certify the funds available only for its own needs ordered; enter into a formal written contract, when required by law, directly with the successful bidder(s); issue purchase orders in its own name directly to the successful bidder(s)against said contract; accept its own deliveries; be invoiced by and receive statements from the successful bidder(s); make payment directly to the successful bidder(s); and be responsible for any tax liability. No Participating Contracting Unit in the Cooperative Pricing System shall be responsible for payment for any items ordered or for performance generally, by any other Participating Contracting Units and shall accordingly be liable only for its own performance and for items ordered and received by it and none assumes any additional responsibility or liability. The provisions of this paragraph shall be quoted or referred to and sufficiently described in all advertisements for bids by the NJWCPS so that each bidder shall be on notice as to the respective responsibilities and liabilities of the Participating Contracting Units. The NJWCPS shall supply the Participating Contracting Units with copies of the specifications, name of successful bidder, prices awarded and the contract identification number. Each Participating Contracting Unit may then order directly from that vendor by purchase order if under the appropriate statutory bid limit or by contract of the governing body or agency if over the appropriate statutory bid limit. The identification number shall be affixed to each purchase order or contract and shown on all forms pertaining thereto.
- 9. If the lowest responsible bidder declines to extend prices to the Participating Contracting Units all bids shall be rejected and no further bids will be sought by the NJWCPS on behalf of the Participating Contracting Units.
- 10 . A bidder shall not be required or permitted to extend his bid prices to Participating Contracting Units unless he has voluntarily agreed to do so as part of his bid.
- 11. Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent any Participating Contracting Unit from awarding contracts of purchase, with or without advertising, individually and on its own behalf, provided, however, that invitations for such individual bids shall not be advertised, nor shall bids be received individually, during the period in which the NJWCPS is advertising for and receiving bids for the same goods or services, except in the case of emergency or hardship.
- 12. No purchase order or contract shall be issued by any Participating Contracting Unit for a price which exceeds any other price available to it from any other such system in which it is authorized to participate or from bids which it has itself received.

13. The NJWCPS reserves the right to exclude any goods or services from within said system if, in its opinion, the pooling of purchasing requirements or needs of the Participating Contracting Units is either not beneficial or not workable.

ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS:

14. The PVSC shall bear all costs associated with administering the Cooperative Pricing system and bidding process including cost of advertising and administration and the Participating Contracting Units shall not be obligated for any part of such expenses.

DURATION AND TERMINATION:

- 15. This Agreement shall become effective the date executed, subject to the approval of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services and shall continue in effect for a period not to exceed five (5) years from said date or the term of the current approval unless any party to this Agreement shall give written notice of its intention to terminate its participation at least 30 days prior to the succeeding four (4) years. The NJWCPS may choose to terminate registration of the system no later than 30 days prior to the expiration date of the system. Renewal of the system will be in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 5:34-17.6, as may be amended.
- 16. This Agreement and the Cooperative Pricing System will not terminate nor be invalidated by the PVSC or the withdrawal or addition of any Participating Contracting Unit. However, this Agreement and the Cooperative Pricing System shall be terminable and invalidated at the instance of the NJWCPS upon written notice to the Participating Contracting Unit and without recourse against the NJWCPS for any reason or if continuance of the within system becomes unlawful for any reason.

DOCUMENTATION:

- 17. All records and documents maintained or utilized pursuant to the terms of this Agreement shall be identified by the code number assigned by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, and such other numbers as are assigned by the NJWCPS for purposes identifying each contract and item awarded.
- 18. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto.
- 19. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which, when so executed, shall be deemed to be an original, but such counterparts shall together constitute but one and the same instrument.

WHEREAS, the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders (hereafter "Board") passed Resolution R2020-0361 on April 28, 2020 awarding a contract to Zuccaro, Inc. for the Morris Canal Greenway Browertown Road Project in the Township of Little Falls and Borough of Woodland Park in the amount of \$836,545.00; and

On behalf of Governor Philip D. Murphy, I am pleased to inform you that applications will now be accepted for the New Jersey Department of Transportation's (NJDOT) Fiscal Year 2021 Local Bridges Fund Program. Passaic County will receive a Local Bridges Fund allotment of \$2,820,465.00 from the New Jersey Transportation's Trust Fund (TTF). Funding levels are commensurate with FY 2021 appropriations for the FY 2021 State Budget.

The Governor and I are committed to maintaining and improving New Jersey's local transportation infrastructure by providing financial assistance to improve county jurisdiction bridges throughout the State. As a result of the 2016 TTF reauthorization, funding for this program increased from \$25 million annually to \$44 million. An additional \$3.3 million was added to the FY 2021 Local Bridges Program (as the TTF funds were not available to local programs until 2018) for a total of \$47.3 million.

Funds are distributed based on a minimum of \$1.0 million per County (\$21.0 million) with 50% of the remaining funds (\$13.15 million) allocated based on each County's percentage of total major bridge deck area and 50% (\$13.15 million) based on each County's percentage of structurally deficient major bridge deck area.

The primary objectives of the Local Bridge Program are:

- Remove bridges from the structurally deficient list;
- Remove bridges from the scour critical list;
- Remove bridges from the functionally obsolete list; and
- Prevent bridges from becoming structurally deficient or scour critical.

Enclosed for your consideration is a list of county owned structurally deficient, functionally obsolete and/or scour critical bridges. If you choose to apply, please consider the following provisions:

- NIDOT requires that projects be delivered to construction award within 36 months of grant notification which is a change from the previous year.
- · Funding is for Construction only.
 - o Counties may invoice up to 75% of the awarded amount, or 75% of the allotment, whichever is less. The remainder of the eligible costs will be reimbursed upon receipt of the final Payment Voucher and supporting documentation.







RESOLUTION ADOPTING FAIR HOUSING POLICY AND APPOINTING FAIR HOUSING OFFICER IN ACCORDANCE WITH 42 <u>U.S.C.</u> § 3601-19 AND <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 10:5-1 <u>ET SEQ.</u>

WHEREAS, in accordance with 42 <u>U.S.C.</u> § 3601-19, Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (hereafter "Fair Housing Act") prohibits discrimination in the sale, rental, and financing of dwellings, and in other housing-related transactions, because of race, color, religion, sex, familial status, national origin, and disability. It also requires that all federal programs relating to housing and urban development be administered in a manner that affirmatively furthers fair housing; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:5-1 et seq., the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination (hereafter "LAD") makes it unlawful to subject people to discrimination or harassment based on race, creed, color, national origin, nationality, ancestry, sex, pregnancy, breastfeeding, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, familial status, marital status, domestic partnership/civil union status, liability for military service, and in some cases atypical hereditary cellular or blood trait, genetic information, and age. The LAD prohibits unlawful discrimination in employment, housing, places of public accommodation, credit and business contracts; and

WHEREAS, the County of Passaic (hereafter "County") supports the Fair Housing Act and the LAD, and it is the policy of the County to implement programs to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry, sex (including pregnancy), national origin, nationality, familial status, marital or domestic partnership status, affectional or sexual orientation, atypical hereditary cellular or blood trait, genetic information, liability for military service, mental or physical disability, perceived disability, AIDS/HIV status and Lawful Income or Source of Lawful Rent Payment (Section 8); and

WHEREAS, the County further objects to discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing, financing of housing or land to be used for construction of housing, or in the provision of brokerage services because of race, color, religion, ancestry, sex, national origin, handicap or disability as prohibited by the Fair Housing Act and the LAD; and

WHEREAS, the County hereby designates Janice DeJohn, Director, Passaic County Public Housing Agency, as the Fair Housing Officer for the County; and

NOW THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED pursuant to 42 <u>U.S.C.</u> § 3601-19 and <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 10:5-1 et seq., that within available resources, the County of Passaic will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against under one of the aforementioned categories, to seek equity under federal and state laws by filing a complaint with the New Jersey Division on Civil Rights and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, as appropriate; and

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Passaic shall place this resolution on the County website and place a public notice in a newspaper with local circulation notifying the public of this resolution along with owners of real estate, developers, and builders to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Fair Housing Act, the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination, and any local laws or ordinances; and

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED that the County will at a minimum implement the following: the printing and publicizing of this resolution, a fair housing public notice and other applicable fair housing information through local media, community contacts and placement on the County website and in other social media; and

- Blockbusting-for profit, persuading owners to sell or rent housing by telling them that minority groups are moving into the neighborhood.
- Denying or making different terms or conditions for home loans by financial institutions.
- Denying to anyone the use or participation in any real estate services, multiple listing services or other facilities related to the selling and renting of housing.

WHEREAS, the Passaic County (hereafter "County") owns the vacant lot located at 296 Church Lane, commonly known as block 2704 lot 23, in the Township of Wayne, New Jersey consisting of approximately 0.9334 square feet; and
