A roll call brought the meeting to order at 5:35 PM.

A motion was made by Trustee Bartlett and seconded by Trustee Dykes to approve the minutes of October 5, 2015 meeting of the Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. Board of Trustees.

Motion passed unanimously.

Per a letter from Freeholder Director TJ Best, Freeholder Bartlett was appointed as the Freeholder Designee to the Board of Trustees for 2016.

Chairwoman Meaghan Touhey asked that the reorganization of the Board be tabled until Trustees can be consulted on filling leadership positions.

A motion was made by Trustee Dykes and seconded by Trustee Bartlett to table Part 3, Items B through E until the next meeting of the Board.

Motion passed unanimously

Trustees discussed fundraising for 2016 and the creation of a Fundraising Committee. A motion was made by Trustee Jordan and

seconded by Trustee Bartlett to appoint Trustees Buonforte, Spiotti, and Pascrell to the Fundraising Committee for 2016.

Motion passed unanimously.

The 2016 Passaic County Fair was discussed. Thereafter, a motion was made by Trustee Roca and seconded by Trustee Buonforte to appoint Trustee Dykes as the Chairman of the 2016 Passaic County Fair.

Motion passed unanimously.

The Memorial Bench and Tree Program was discussed at length, including Trustee Jordan informing the Board of recent orders by individuals purchasing memorial benches and trees.

Trustee Buonforte made a motion that was seconded by Trustee Bartlett to set the rates for Memorial Benches at \$2,500 and Memorial Trees at \$1,250.

Motion passed unanimously.

Trustee Jordan brought up the need to amend by the by-laws to reflect a dissolution clause requested by the IRS. Jordan made the motion to amend the by-laws that was seconded by Trustee Dykes.

Motion passed unanimously.

Trustee Jordan updated the Board on several matters, including Horizon Foundation moving forward with disbursing the \$39,000 for fitness equipment at Weasel Brook Park, grant applications, and correspondence from the NJ Historic Trust and the IRS. The IRS letter indicated that the retroactive reinstatement of non-profit exempt status had been approved.

Additionally, Jordan updated the Board on a plan to add certain documents and information relating to Board business on the County of Passaic website and to develop a RFP for marketing and design services to promote the Park System.

Jordan made a motion to adjourn at 6:30 PM that was seconded by Dykes.

Motion passed unanimously.

### AGENCY HISTORY/SUMMARY

Dear Mr. Jordan, Esq and The RFP Selection Committee of The Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc., National Advertising Consultants (NAC), is pleased to submit it's official response for the Graphic Design Work RFP distributed by The Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. This Letter is an official response to the RFP sent by Mr. Mathew Jordan Esq., and defines the scope of work, employee roles and responsibilities, timeline and costs associated with the creation of nine poster illustrations of historical landmarks and parks throughout Passaic County, using WPA-style creative.

SGW's core industry focus includes; B2B, Retail/Consumer, Banking/Financial, Insurance, Pharmaceuticals, Government, Healthcare/Hospitals, Higher Education, and Automotive. An employee flow chart is enclosed for your review which defines the roles of all company employees, who could at any point have an interaction on the Friends of Passaic County Parks Inc., account throughout the course of a our relationship. Yvette Michaels will be assigned as the primary account manager who will oversee the day to day activities of the employee's involved on this project. Yvette is supervised by Kris Scelba, President of Account Services and Agency Principal, who submitted this RFP Response.

To better identify our accounting practices, in January 2016, SGW created a subsidiary for each of our service lines, one of them being National Advertising Consultants (NAC). The responsibility of this division is too provide traditional, and digital marketing services for SGW's consumer/retail division.

With over 35 years of experience, and having worked with numerous State and local agencies, NAC is confident it will be able to satisfy all deliverables as defined in the RFP and will create cutting edge creative that will generate publicity and attention to the defined parks and historical locations.



### ACCOUNT MANAGEMENT AND ROLES/RESPONSIBILITIES

Kris Scelba will be assigned to oversee all marketing and advertising activities on behalf of Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. Kris will work with the primary point of contact at the Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc., to develop the overall marketing strategy including all creative elements and present the budgets for all advertising campaigns to Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. management. Kris will also develop any and all campaign measurement methods to insure the final creative is delivering the correct positive message to the defined targeted audience.

- Kris Scelba will present all marketing campaigns, promotional items and media budgets to
   Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc., management for prior approval, and insures any and all revisions are made. Then presents all material to any additional individuals/committees involved for their review.
- If any future ad placements are required, Kris Scelba will work directly with Mathew Jordan Esq., to develop long term growth and marketing strategies as well as develop digital marketing campaigns on behalf of Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc.
- Yvette Michaels reports directly to Kris Scelba and will supervise all marketing material on behalf of Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. Yvette's responsibilities will include working with Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. management and staff to obtain information required to develop advertising materials, promotional efforts, and insure all files are delivered to their proper destinations. Yvette is responsible for coordinating all marketing material throughout all mediums to insure consistency, and oversees NAC's art staff to coordinate and maintain deadlines are met.

### CREATIVE DESIGN/GRAPHIC DEVELOPMENT

Based upon the client supplied photography, NAC will design and create nine poster illustrations using the WPA design, and while maintaining a similar look and feel as the previously created National Park System posters, establish a unique identity for the locations within the Friends of Passaic County Inc. system that will generate publicity and attention to the locations.

The posters will include the following parks and historical locations throughout Passaic County:

- Lambert Tower and Lambert Castle
- Rifle Camp Park
- Weasel Brook Park
- Dey Mansion

All files will be created using Adobe Illustrator and delivered to Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc., as vector EPS files which will enable future resizing and file manipulation. NAC will deliver final renderings that can be used in both traditional (Print, Outdoor, POS, etc...) and digital mediums. Upon project completion, NAC will provide nine posters and five display banners in the following standard banner ad sizes for each design:

### PUBLIC RELATIONS/SOCIAL MEDIA

NAC's Public Relations and Social Media Division (3EPR) is managed by Patrick Brightman, and supported by Lee Groeger, Megan Redizia, Anthony Galasso, and Emily Maupai. At the request of Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc., NAC will update all social outlets with content provided by Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc., develop press releases and pitch the release to the various media outlets to have the content distributed.

Public Relations and Social Media activity costs are extra and will be quoted on an as requested basis.

#### ACCOUNTING/BILLING PROCEDURES

Yvette Michaels, Debbie Carrillo, Kathy Greene, Pat Hardy, Kris Scelba will review the prior month's media and production activity and reconcile all items to the approved monthly budget calendar. All items will be listed on a summary invoice including all media vendor invoices (print, broadcast, out-of-home, online, etc.), which are billed on a net basis to be paid directly to the media by Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. accounting department.

Any additional projects, such as: website design, programing, ad resizing, etc... are invoiced on a per project basis and may be billed progressively at 50% of estimated cost upon receipt of approved quote or contract and the 50% balance upon completion and delivery of project. Postage charges for direct mail activities or other large immediate out-of-pocket expenditures will be billed in advance.



#### APPROVALS AND AUTHORIZATION

Upon request, NAC will submit monthly media and creative budget calendars to Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. Management for approval prior to the commencement of ordering media space or production services begins. Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. will provide oral/written approvals for all advertisement elements, prior to any media is purchased or production begins.

Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. can request changes, or cancellations, or stop any work in progress, provided they are within NAC's contractual obligations to third parties. Where changes or cancellations are requested on previously approved work, Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. will reimburse NAC for unrecoverable charges or expenses and submit payment for all work performed to date.

#### PROJECT COSTS

The following cost analysis provides NAC's hourly rate, cost per individual poster and a total project cost. Please note that the total project cost includes a 3% discount versus designing each design individually. Upon project completion, if Friends of Passaic County Parks, Inc. require any additional ad resizes, NAC will charge a flat fee to resize, and deliver the files to the media outlet per resize, which is the last line on the following chart.


#### **PROJECT TIMELINE**

My budget would be as follows:




My timeline would be 30 days to submit the ten posters laid out in the call for proposals (Lambert Castle and Lambert Tower as separate posters).



### **BYLAWS**

### FRIENDS OF PASSAIC COUNTY PARKS, A NEW JERSEY NONPROFIT CORPORATION

ARTICLE I: ORGANIZATION

Section #1: Name

The name of the nonprofit corporation shall be, "Friends of Passaic County Parks, A New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation," hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation".

Section #2: Seal or Letterhead

The seal or letterhead to represent the Corporation shall be established by the Board of Trustees and designed to represent the Corporation's mission and function.

Section #3: Office Location

The principal office for the Corporation is located at 401 Grand Street, Paterson, New Jersey. The Corporation may establish and maintain offices in other locations as authorized by the executive board.

#### ARTICLE II: PURPOSE AND POWERS

Section #1: Mission

The Friends of Passaic County Parks, A New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation, shall protest, enhance and advocate for the Passaic County Parks System by pursuing all relevant and applicable grant opportunities, soliciting corporate donations, conducting an annual fundraising campaign and pursuing all available avenues of fundraising exclusively for the benefit of the county parks, as well as by educating residents about the historic landmarks which lie within the parks system.

Section #2: Purposes

The purpose of the Corporation shall be fundraising to exclusively benefit the Passaic County Parks System within the provision and meaning set forth in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law. The Corporation's purpose shall be limited to raising funds and conducting related public education programs, which shall be dedicated to improving the Passaic County Parks System by furthering the goals and policies of the Parks Department. The Corporation shall not attempt to shape or influence the policies and priorities of the Passaic County Parks Department.

### Section #3: Corporation Status

The Corporation shall not take any action or exercise any power that would prevent it from obtaining and maintaining exemption from federal income taxes as a nonprofit corporation a described in Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Specifically, the Corporation shall not:

- 1. Engage in trade or business for profit;
- 2. Participate or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office;
- 3. Disseminate assets, income or property acquired by the Corporation to any organization or agency other than the Passaic County Parks Department or some other exempt or governmental entity. Upon dissolution of the Corporation, all of its assets shall be distributed in such a manner as to further the purpose of the Corporation, to improve the Passaic County Parks System, and, as such, upon dissolution of the Corporation, any and all assets will be distributed to an exempt or governmental entity to be used for the public benefit.

### ARTICLE III: REPRESENTATION

The Chairperson or his/her designee shall represent the Corporation in all matters involving the Corporation's affiliation to Passaic County or the Passaic County Parks System.

### ARTICLE IV: MEMBERS

The Corporation shall not have any members.

### ARTICLE V: BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Section #1: Membership

The Board of Directors of the Corporation shall be known as its Board of Trustees ("the Board"), and shall consist of not fewer than seven (7) or more than twelve (12) individuals who will be appointed as provided herein.

- a. *Ex Officio Members*. The following individuals shall serve ex officio as voting members of the Board: the Passaic County Director of Parks, the County Administrator or his/her designee, and the Freeholder Director or his/her designee.
- b. *Public Members*. The Board shall include not fewer than four (4) individuals who are residents of Passaic County, or whom have a compelling interest in the success of the Passaic County Park System, over the age of eighteen (18). These members shall be selected and appointed by the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders via Resolution, based upon their interest and expertise and with the aim of reflecting the

geographic and other diversities of Passaic County. The initial number of public Trustees shall be five (5).

The term of office for each Public Member of the Board shall be five (5) years and until their successors are duly selected. Public Members of the Board may serve no more than three consecutive terms on the Board, after which they shall cease to the Board members for a period of not less than two years before being appointed again to the Board. Vacancies occurring, other than at the end of a Trustee's term, may be filled in the same manner as provided by these Bylaws; any Trustee so designated shall serve for the remainder of the term of the Trustee so replaced.

At any meeting, the Board of Trustees may, by an affirmative vote of majority of such Trustees, create one or more additional seats on the Board up to the maximum number stated in these Bylaws and, at such meeting, appoint additional Trustees to fill such newly created seats.

Section #2: Powers and Duties

Subject to the provisions of these Bylaws and the Certificate of Incorporation of the Corporation, the Board of Trustees shall be responsible for the direction of the business and affairs of the Corporation, shall have control over the funds, property, and all activities of the Corporation, provided that such activities are not inconsistent with the purposes of the Corporation as set forth in the Corporation's Certificate of Incorporation, these Bylaws, and the laws and regulations of the United States and the State of New Jersey. The Board shall coordinate with and serve to assist the Passaic County Parks System. The Board shall establish its own policies, which policies may not be inconsistent with the policies of the Passaic County Parks Department. The Board shall hold no less than one (1) regular meeting in each calendar year.

Section #3: Committees and Subcommittees

The Board shall create and appoint members to such Committees and Subcommittees as are useful to carry out the business of the Corporation.

Section #4: Resignation; Removal

Any Trustee may resign at any time by giving written notice of resignation to the Chairperson or Secretary. Any such resignation shall be effective upon the Corporation's receipt of such notice or at a subsequent time stated in such notice of resignation. A Trustee may be removed at any time by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the Board, except that the Trustee at issue shall be prohibited from voting on his or her removal.

Section #5: Quorum; Voting

For voting purposes, 50% of the entire membership of the Board of Trustees shall constitute quorum. Meetings and voting may be conducted telephonically.

In the event of a tie vote of the Board, the vote of the Chairperson will govern. In the event of a tie vote of any Committee or Subcommittee, the vote of the chairperson of such Committee or Subcommittee shall prevail.

### ARTICLE VI: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section #1: Organization

The Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees shall be comprised of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer, and the chairperson or representative of each Committee or Subcommittee of the Board.

Section #2: Authority

The Executive Committee shall have the power to act on behalf of the Board of Trustees on all matters between Board meetings, except the power to select the Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson, amend these Bylaws, or appoint or remove a Trustee.

### ARTICLE VII: OFFICERS

Section #1: Powers and Duties of Officers

- a. *Chairperson*: The Chairperson shall serve as chairperson of the corporation, an ex officio member of all Committees and Subcommittees, and shall preside over all meetings of the Board.
- b. *Vice-Chairperson:* The Vice-Chairperson shall prepare necessary reports serve as liaison to subcommittees, and shall preside over meetings in the absence of the Chairperson.
- c. Secretary: The Secretary shall keep and record accurate minutes of all regular meetings, coordinate all forms of communication to and from the Corporation, and maintain all records of corporate business.
- d. *Treasurer*: The Treasurer shall receive and have care and custody of all corporation funds under the direction of the executive board, shall co-sign all checks with the Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson, shall keep the books of all accounts, which shall be open to inspection by officers at all times, and shall serve as an ex officio member of any fundraising and/or finance committee (s).

Section #3: Appointment of Officers

The Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson shall be selected from among the Public Members of the Board of Trustees and voted into office by simple majority of Board members present. The Secretary and Treasurer shall be nominated by the Chairperson and voted into office by a simple majority of Board members present. The Secretary and Treasurer may be, but are not required to

be, members of the Board of Trustees. Officers who are not Trustees shall not have the authority to vote on any matter before the Board of Executive Committee.

### ARTICLE VIII: INDEMNIFICATION OF TRUSTEES AND OFFICERS

Any Trustee or officer (hereinafter referred to as a "corporate agent") of the Corporation shall be indemnified by the Corporation against the reasonable costs, disbursements and counsel fees and liabilities paid or incurred in satisfaction of any judgment, fine, penalty or settlement in connection with any pending, threatened or completed civil, criminal, administrative or arbitrative action, suit or proceeding, and nay appeal therein, including an action by or in the right of the corporation, involving the corporate agent by reason of his or her being or having been such as corporate agent, to the extent permitted by applicable law. Expenses incurred by a corporate agent in connection with a proceeding may be paid by the Corporation in advance of the final disposition of the proceeding if authorized by the Board, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the corporate agent to repay such amount unless it shall ultimately be determined that he or she is entitled to be indemnified as provided in these Bylaws.

### ARTICLE IX: NON-DISCRIMINATION

The Corporation shall not discriminate in any manner against any person by reason of race, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, disability, veteran or military status, national origin, or religious or political affiliation.

#### ARTICLE X: AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended only by a majority vote of the Board of Trustees, previous notice of the nature of any proposed amendment having been given at least ten (10) days before action thereon shall be taken.

#### ARTICLE XI: DISSOLUTION

Upon dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the County of Passaic government. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in the county in which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
