MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING OF AUGUST 23, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 401 Grand Street, Room 220, Paterson, New Jersey at 6:00 p.m. Pledge of Allegiance was said. Roll was taken. Commissioners Marco, Glovin, and Ramaglia. Also present were Heather Litzebauer, Financial Advisor, Richard Cahill, CFO, Peter Tucci, Esq., General Counsel, and Gary Schaer, Executive Director. Mr. Tucci read the notice, pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act.

Commissioner Glovin moved to accept the minutes of the July 26, 2023 meeting. Seconded by Commissioner Ramaglia. Commissioners Marco and Ramaglia voted in favor. Commissioner Glovin abstained.

Commissioner Marco opened the public portion of the meeting. Seeing no member of the public wishing to speak, he closed the public portion of the meeting.

New Business / Old Business

Chairman Marco stated that he and Ms. Litzebauer had a call with Rich Giglio where they discussed a potential project with the Prospect Park Board of Education, through the Banc Program. Ms. Litzebauer stated that it would involve equipment needs. She further stated that this is the type of project that can be financed through the Banc Program. She went on to state that Wayne Board of Education just closed on a financing for busses in the amount of \$1.9 million. The financing takes approximately thirty days from application to funding. She also stated that the Authority may expect to receive an application in the next few months. Chairman Marco stated that PCTI is also interested in financing a project. Ms. Litzebauer stated that the County College is interested in financing an ESIP program. Commissioner Glovin noted that the College was interested in financing the project some time this year. Chairman Marco stated that once Mr. Giglio would be reaching out, once he recovers from a medical procedure.

Commissioner Glovin and Chairman Marco discussed that the College ESIP project is expected to be in the \$11-\$12 million range and would result in significant savings. Ms. Litzebauer, Commissioner Glovin, and Chairman Marco discussed financing the project through the Authority versus the County, based on considerations of costs of issuance, a potential County guarantee, and the potential of Chapter 12 state funding. Mr. Cahill stated that, typically, the County issues debt for the College. At this point, Commissioner Alston joined the meeting, via Webex.

Executive Director Schaer and Chairman Marco discussed what next steps should be taken in connection with the College project. Commissioner Glovin stated that whatever financing route is most beneficial to the taxpayers is the path that should be followed, to which all agreed.

The Commissioners, Executive Director Schaer, Mr. Cahill, and Ms. Litzebauer discussed the introduction of the budget for the Authority and its timing.

Commissioner Ramaglia moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Commissioner Glovin. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION OF THE PASSAIC COUNTY IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY AWARDING A CONTRACT FOR ADMINISTRATOR OF A COUNTY-WIDE REGISTRATION PROGRAM FOR PROPERTIES SUBJECT TO MORTGAGES THAT ARE IN DEFAULT

- **WHEREAS,** a regular meeting of the Passaic County Improvement Authority (the "Authority") was held on September 27, 2023;
- **WHEREAS**, the Authority, a public body corporate and a body politic of the County of Passaic created by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Passaic pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:37A-44 et seq. with all the power and responsibilities set forth in the statute;
- **WHEREAS,** one of the statutory purposes of the Authority is to provide services to the County and its constituent municipalities;
- WHEREAS, the present mortgage foreclosure problem has serious negative implications for all communities trying to manage the consequences of property vacancies and abandoned real properties;
- WHEREAS, the Authority and Municipalities have a vested interest in protecting neighborhoods against decay caused by vacant, abandoned, and foreclosed properties and conclude that it is in the best interests of the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens and residents to impose registration and certification requirements on vacant, abandoned, and foreclosed properties located within the Municipality;
- **WHEREAS,** the Authority previously established a County wide registration program for abandoned properties subject to mortgages that are in default (the "Program") which was beneficial to the participating Municipalities, the County, the Authority, and the residents of the County;
- WHEREAS, unexpectedly and without warning, the entity that served as the administrator/consultant for the Program filed for dissolution in June 2023 and immediately ceased all operations;
- **WHEREAS**, the Authority desires to reestablish the Program, with the use of a third party administrator/consultant to be procured through competitive contracting;
- WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.3(a) requires that in order to initiate competitive contracting, the governing body shall pass a resolution authorizing the use of competitive contracting each time specialized goods or services enumerated in N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. are desired to be contracted for;
- **WHEREAS**, the procurement of services to be provided as an administrator/consultant of the Program is governed by N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1 et seq.;

WHEREAS, the Authority has authorized the use of competitive contracting to procure the services of an administrator of the Program; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has completed the competitive contracting process and desires to award the contract for services of an administrator of the Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE PASSAIC COUNTY IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Authority awards the contract for Administrator of a County-Wide Registration Program for Properties Subject to Mortgages that are in Default to Hera Property Registry, LLC and authorizes the Executive Director and General Counsel to negotiate and appropriate contract.
- 2. The Chairman is authorized and directed to execute an appropriate contract, once negotiated.
- 3. The Authority awards the contract through a competitive contracting process.
- 4. A notice of the award of this contract shall be printed once in the Official Newspaper of the Authority to satisfy the requirement of the publication of legal notices and a copy of the contract shall be made available for public inspection.
