

2024 Social Security Benefit Increase

Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits will increase by 3.2 percent this year.

Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (PAAD)

The Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (PAAD) program is a state-funded program that helps eligible older adults and individuals with disabilities save money on their prescription drug costs.

PAAD provides coverage for prescribed legend drugs, insulin, insulin supplies and needles and syringes for injectable medicines used for the treatment of multiple sclerosis.

The PAAD co-payment will be \$5 for each PAAD covered generic drug prescription and \$7 for each PAAD covered brand name drug prescription. PAAD beneficiaries may pay less for generic drugs if their Medicare prescription drug plan charges them less than the \$5 PAAD co-payment for generics.

PAAD does not pay for diabetic testing supplies (e.g., test strips and lancets). If PAAD beneficiaries have health insurance coverage, such as Medicare Part B that pays for diabetic testing supplies a pharmacy must bill that insurance plan. PAAD will not pay for them.

PAAD also pays Part D premium and Part D late enrollment penalty for certain Part D plans. All PAAD members must enroll in a Part D plan if Medicare eligible.

The 2024 income guidelines for PAAD are as follows:

Less than \$52,142 for a single applicant

Less than \$59,209 for married applicant

Senior Gold Prescription Discount Program

The Senior Gold Prescription Discount Program (Senior Gold) is a state-funded prescription program with a different copayment structure and income eligibility guidelines than those of PAAD.

Senior Gold benefits help to make Medicare prescription drug coverage more affordable by reducing any other out-ofpocket costs associated with that coverage, such as deductibles, co-insurance, and the coverage gap known as the "donut hole."

Members receive assistance for prescribed legend drugs, insulin and insulin supplies.

Senior Gold does not pay for diabetic testing supplies (e.g., test strips and lancets). If Senior Gold beneficiaries have health insurance coverage, such as Medicare Part B that pays for diabetic testing supplies, a pharmacy must bill that insurance plan. Senior Gold will not pay for them.

Members pay a copayment of \$15 plus 50% of the remaining cost of each Senior Gold covered drug.

Once members reach annual out-of-pocket expenses exceeding \$2,000 for single persons or \$3,000 for married couples, they pay only a flat \$15 copayment per prescription for the balance of that eligibility period.

The 2024 income guidelines for Senior Gold are:

Income between \$52,142 to \$62,142 for a single applicant

Income between \$59,209 to \$69,209 for married applicants

Peppermint Hot Cocoa <u>Mix</u>

Ingredients

- 1 c. Unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 c. Powdered milk
- 1 c. Milk chocolate chips
- 1 c. Mini marshmallows
- 3/4 c. Chopped hard peppermint candies
- 4 c. Cold water

Directions To assemble the jar:

1. In a 1-quart jar, layer cocoa powder, powdered milk, chocolate chips, peppermint candies, and mini marshmallows.

To make the hot cocoa:

- 1. Prep time: 5 minutes. Total time: 10 minutes. Makes 6 to 8 servings.
- 2. Whisk the Peppermint Hot Cocoa Mix with 4 cups cold water in a medium saucepan. Cook over medium-low heat, whisking, until warm and smooth and the candies and marshmallows are melted, 6 to 8 minutes (do not let the mixture boil). Ladle into mugs.

The State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) is a statewide program administered by the New Jersey Department of Human Services with financial assistance through a grant from the U.S. Administration for Community Living (ACL). Currently in the Nation there are 59 million Medicare beneficiaries, including people who are 65 and older and people who have a permanent disability. Many have difficulty navigating Medicare and the health care system on their own. Some do not get the care they need because they cannot pay and do not know about programs that provide help. Others, (the many caregivers who assist family members, friends and

neighbors) need answers and guidance. SHIP counselors provide free one-on-one Medicare counseling.


