## Passaic County Open Space, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes from Thursday October 29, 2020

Meeting call to order / Flag Salute: 6:40 pm led by Chair Sandy Lawson

**Reorganization:** Sandy Lawson nominated Maria-Elena Grant as chair which was accepted by Commissioner for the remainder of the year. A motion to approve Commissioner Grant as chair was moved by Commissioner Lawson and seconded by Commissioner Canetti. The vote passed unanimously.

Maria-Elena Grant nominated Anne Kahwaty as vice-chair which was accepted by Commissioner Kahwaty for the remainder of the year. A motion to approve Commissioner Grant as chair was moved by Commissioner Grant and seconded by Commissioner Canetti. The vote passed unanimously.

Commissioner Lawson nominated Cindy Frank as Secretary which was accepted by Commissioner Frank. A motion to approve was moved by Commissioner Vroom and seconded by Freeholder Akhter. The motion passed unanimously.

**Public Portion**: Commissioner Canetti made a motion to open the meeting to the public which was seconded by Commissioner Lawson. The motion passed unanimously. Seeing no one from the public participating via camera, call-in, or chat, Commissioner Vroom made the motion which was seconded by Commissioner Canetti. The motion passed unanimously.

**Minutes**: Commissioner Szepietowski motioned to accept minutes from the September 26, 2019 and seconded by Commissioner Vroom. **The motion passed unanimously.** 

**New Business**: Planning Director Lysicatos asked for a moment of silence to recognize the passing of Kathleen Caren.

Updated 2020 Grant Application Review Schedule

Planning Director Lysicatos led a discussion of the updated schedule to review and consider the applications to the 2020 Open Space, Farmland, and Historic Preservation Grant Applications

received in the Spring. As a result of COVID-19 the schedule was pushed back, with application review occurring in the fall and winter with awards occurring early in 2021. As a result the decision was made to combine 2020 with 2021 year funding as the review would overlap with what would have been the normal 2021 solicitation, maximize the amount of grant funds available to the existing applications, and move as many "shovel-ready" projects to construction in 2021 as a form of economic stimulus. A schedule for the review, public hearings, and award of grants was shared with the committee (See attached schedule). The commissioners inquired about the cap for applications and were informed that there would be flexibility in the cap for awards with a total of \$3.5 million available total grant award funds.

The commissioners were asked for their feedback on the schedule and access to the applications using the Dropbox application. The commissioners responded positively and were briefed on the schedule for the virtual site visits during a two-night session in November, with an addition a night of deliberation in December and one last meeting in January. The dates were approved, and staff will work to publish them in the newspaper and on the County website.

Staff outlined the updated application submittals following a questionnaire and request for updates sent to 2020 applicants in the late summer/early fall. (See attached application log)

The commissioners were advised that they would be allowed on sites. Staff asked that if there was a desire to visit a non-public site to contact the Planning Department to coordinate access.

The Planning Director also advised that the Planning Department was moving to 401 Grand Street, Office 417 for future reference.

**Meeting Schedule:** Commissioner Lawson, made a motion to adopt virtual meeting dates for November 18/19, December 10 of 2020 and January 14, 2021 all to be held at 6:30 PM. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Frank and passed unanimously.

**Old Business**: Freeholder Akhter inquired about the City of Passaic's ability to apply for new Open Space funds after the opening of Dundee island Park. Deputy Administrator provided that the City of Passaic would be permitted to apply for 2020 funds but going forward there would be a restriction on open space grant funding applications. Freeholder Akhter urged the commissioner to visit the park as an example of investment in the community.

**Adjournment:** With no more to discuss, at 7:52 a motion by Commissioner Grant, seconded by Freeholder Akhter.
